THE GAME • Western Michigan will open its Mid-American Conference schedule with Toledo for the third-straight season. Both teams enter the contest 1-3 overall but only the Rockets have played a conference game, losing to Central Michigan, 52-31, on Sept. 8. Both teams captured their first wins of the season last week with WMU defeating Central Connecticut State, 51-14, and Toledo handing Iowa State a 36-35 loss.

TELEVISION • The Bronco football program continues to gain regional and national notoriety through television exposure. Western Michigan is scheduled to play on live television at least six times this season. WMU will air on the ESPN family networks twice at home in 2007. The Broncos will have three games on Comcast Local and another on Comcast SportsNet. The game at Toledo will air on the Buckeye Cable Sports Network but on a delay in the BCSN's viewing area.

RADIO • This and all Western Michigan football games will be broadcast live on the Bronco Radio Network and its new flagship station, WZUU - 92.5 FM. Robin Hook (play-by-play) and Monty Porter (analysis) will have the call as they have together for the past nine seasons.

WEB SITE • WMU home football games (not televised by the ESPN family of networks) can be seen live via the official athletics web site (www.wmubroncos.com) by subscribing to Bronco Insider, which can be found on the home page of the site. You are able to listen to each Bronco football game on the Internet by signing up with Yahoo Sports through the link at the bottom of the home page. Live Stats are available for FREE for all Bronco home games by clicking the link atop the home football page. Live Stats

will also be available (at no cost) for the game against Toledo. Bronco Insider subscribers should also be able to watch the game live online thanks to Toledo sharing the stream via Rocket Vision.

SERIES IN BRIEF • Western Michigan trails the all-time series, 25-36-0, to Toledo. The Broncos snapped a five-game losing skid to the Rockets with a 31-10 win in the 2006 home season opener. WMU last tasted victory at the Glass Bowl in 1988, 31-9.

THE COACHES • Bill Cubit (Delaware, 1975) begins his third season as the head coach of Western Michigan. He is 15-12 overall, 9-2 at Waldo Stadium, at Western Michigan and led the Broncos to their first bowl game since 1988 last season. Tom Amstutz (Toledo, 1977) is in his seventh season as the head coach of Toledo football. Amstutz has a record of 51-28 with the Rockets during his tenure and has two MAC titles to his credit.

UP NEXT • The Broncos continue their MAC schedule with a showdown against 2005 MAC Champion, Akron. WMU held the Zips to minus-13 yards rushing in the 2006 season finale, a 17-0 win for Western Michigan. Akron opened its conference slate with a 27-20 victory over MAC East rival Kent State on Sept. 22. Western Michigan boasts an 11-3 record over Akron and is a perfect 6-0 against the Zips at Waldo Stadium. Akron is 0-3 in its last three meetings with the Broncos.

GAME 5 – WESTERN MICHIGAN AT TOLEDO – GAME NOTES

AND NOW IT BEGINS • College football does not have a preseason but all four of Western Michigan's previous games were a way to get ready for what begins on Sept. 29. This week WMU opens its Mid-American Conference schedule with Toledo. WMU will play six-consecutive MAC games before taking the field against Iowa on Nov. 17.

LET'S GET IT STARTED • This will be the latest MAC start, fifth week of the year, for Western Michigan since the 2002 campaign. The previous two seasons under Bill Cubit, the conference schedule has started on the second week, with Western Michigan splitting those games with Toledo. The Broncos are 33-26 (55.9) in MAC openers with 2007 marking the 60th conference opener for WMU. WMU is 18-9 (66.7) when opening the conference games at Waldo Stadium.

GOOD THINGS COME IN THREE'S • Three different WMU running backs scored touchdowns against Central Connecticut State, marking the first time his has happened since Nov. 14, 1998 against Bowling Green. Then – Darnell Fields, Robert Sanford and Greg Peterson from five yards, one yard and one yard, respectively in a 56-27 Bronco win. Now – Brandon West, Mark Bonds and Glenis Thompson scored from 10 yards, five yards and one yard out, respectively in WMU's 54-14 win over Central Connecticut State.

PICK-SIX CLUB WELCOMES A NEW MEMBER • Junior college transfer Boston McCormell has joined an elite group, that actually continues to grow and grow. He is now a member of the Western Michigan Pick-Six Club. This is the group of active members of the WMU football team that have returned an interception for a TD. McCormell joined the group with a 32-yard interception for a touchdown against Central Connecticut State.

A FIRST TIME FOR EVERYTHING • There were plenty of firsts against the Blue Devils on Sept. 22, both from a career and season stand point:

- Glenis Thompson scored first career rushing TD
- Jamell Murray scored first career receiving TD
- Drew Burdi threw first career TD
- Boston McCormell registered first interception and interception for a TD
- Schyler Truesdell, Paul Wasikowski and Mark Berghuis made first career starts
- Brandon West scored first rushing TD of the season
- Herb Martin scored first receiving TD of the season
- Keith Schultz scored first receiving TD of the season

MAN ON THE RUN • Western Michigan had its best day running the ball against the Blue Devils. The Broncos accumulated 184 yards on the ground and punched it into the end zone three times via the run. WMU showed its dedication to running the ball most effectively on its first drive of the third quarter. The 12-play, 80-yard scoring drive, which culminated in a Mark Bonds run of five yards for the score, was comprised of 11 rushes and one pass. Bonds carried the ball nine times for 54 of his 66 yards on the night. Glenis Thompson added a seven-yard run and Brandon West ran the ball for 13 yards. The only pass play was a Tim Hiller completion for five yards to Schneider Julien.

SEEING RED • The Broncos drove the ball into the red zone seven times against Central Connecticut State and scored everytime (7-for-7). It was the second game of the year WMU was perfect in the red zone after opening the season 4-for-4 against No. 3 West Virginia. The Broncos scored six touchdowns and one field goal against CCSU and four games into the year are 15-for-18 (83 percent) in the red zone with 12 TDs and three field goals. Of the 12 touchdowns, seven are passing.

DOING THE LITTLE THINGS • Western Michigan had been plagued by penalties during its first three games, averaging 12 penalties per game for an average of 91 yards per game. Against CCSU, the Broncos committed just five penalties and none came on the offensive side of the ball. In the previous three games WMU had amassed 13 false starts, three delay of game penalties and three holding calls. Against CCSU, zero on all accounts.

SACKED LUNCH - NUM, NUM, NUM • Heading into the CCSU game, the opposition had out-sacked Western Michigan, 13-4. The Broncos gained some ground against the Blue Devils, recording three sacks to Central Connecticut State's zero. Boston McCormell had a solo sack, while Justin Braska, Cory Flom, Scott Gajos and Nick Varcadipane combined for the team's other two, each picking up 0.5 sack.

APPROACHING MILESTONES • Senior running back Mark Bonds is 75 rushing yards from joining a very elite group at Western Michigan. He would join 10 other Broncos with 2,000 career rushing yards. In three career games against Toledo, Bonds has amassed 212 yards and two TDs in three games. His best performance was in 2006, 134 yards and a score on 22 carries.

IN CASE YOU DIDN'T NOTICE • Senior Center Robbie Krutilla was held out of the game against Central Connecticut State due to an injury sustained against Missouri. The "DNP" that will appear in the statistics also meant that Krutilla's 38-consecutive start streak was snapped. It was the first game the Summitt, Ill., native had not started in his career.

FACING SOME OF THE BEST • All four of Western Michigan's previous opponents have ranked in the top-10 of at least one offensive category the week the Broncos played them.

West Virginia entered the week with the second-best rushing offense coming back from 2006 (303.00 ypg).

Indiana was tied for the eighth-best scoring offense in the country (55.00 ppg).

Missouri had the eighth-best passing offense (344.50 ypg) the week of its meeting against WMU.

Central Connecticut State ranked second in Division I-FCS in rushing offense (309.67 ypg) prior to taking the field against the Broncos.

TOLEDO DO'S & DON'T'S • Everything is magnified when it occurs in a conference game. Both teams are looking to minimize mistakes in order to gain an early edge above the other in the standings.

DO'S • Last season WMU forced four turnovers and ran the ball well, using the run to set up the pass (three of WMU's four offensive scores came through the air). The Broncos need to do the same in order to have similar success.

DON'T'S • The last time these two teams took the field against one another in the Glass Bowl, Sept. 10, 2005, Toledo's home crowd was not silenced by a WMU score until the 1:39 mark of the second quarter, by then Toledo had amassed a 35-6 lead. The Broncos must keep the home crowd out of it as much as possible early in the game.

HAILING FROM THE 419 • Five members of the Western Michigan football team are Ohio natives but only was born and raised in Northwest Ohio – Jim Laney. In fact, Laney is from Toledo and went to high school at St. Francis de Sales.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR • Robbie Krutilla and Branden Ledbetter find their names among the nation's elite in their respective positions. Krutilla has been named to a pair of preseason watch lists and Ledbetter has earned a spot on one. Krutilla is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List (the award for the nation's best center) as well as the Outland Trophy (the award for the nation's best interior lineman). It is the second year he has made it onto the Rimington preseason list.

Ledbetter finds himself on the John Mackey Award Watch List (the award for the nation's best tight end) for the first time. He was named the Mackey Tight End of the Week once last season after amassing 101 yards receiving against Miami.

Jim Laney was added to the Ray Guy Watch List, the award for the nation's top punter, after the third week of the 2007 season. Anthony Gebhart was nominated for the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award, which will

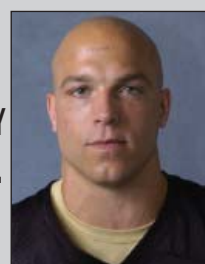
