THE GAME • Western Michigan celebrates Education Day at Waldo Stadium on Oct. 6 when Mid-American Conference East rival Akron comes to town. The Broncos will also be honoring their WMU Athletic Hall of Fame Class of 2007 at halftime and at an event scheduled for Oct. 5 at the Radisson Plaza Hotel. WMU and the Zips are taking the field against one another for the second-straight season

SERIES IN BRIEF • The Broncos and Zips have taken the field against one another only 14 times in program history with WMU holding an 11-3 edge in the all-time series. Western Michigan has won the last three meetings against Akron with the last coming in the 2006 season finale, 17-0. WMU is 8-1 against Akron at Waldo Stadium.

TELEVISION • The Bronco football program continues to gain regional and national notoriety through television exposure. Western Michigan is scheduled to play on live television at least six times this season. WMU will air on the ESPN family networks twice at home in 2007. The Broncos will have two games on Comcast Local and another on Comcast SportsNet. The Akron game will not be televised.

THE COACHES • Bill Cubit (Delaware, 1975) begins his third season as the head coach of Western Michigan. He is 16-12 overall (.571), 10-2 at Waldo Stadium (.833), at Western Michigan and led the Broncos to their first bowl game since 1988 last season. J.D. Brookhart (Colorado State, 1988) is 20-21 during his four-plus seasons at Akron. He led the Zips to their first MAC Football Championship in 2005, defeating Northern Illinois on a touchdown pass in the waning seconds at Ford Field.

RADIO • This and all Western Michigan football games will be broadcast live on the Bronco Radio Network and its new flagship station, WZUU - 92.5 FM. Robin Hook (play-by-play) and Monty Porter (analysis) will have the call as they have together for the past nine seasons.

UP NEXT • The Broncos head back on the road to face a battle-tested Northern Illinois team. The game will take place at Huskie Stadium in DeKalb, Ill. Despite holding a 10-6-0 road edge in the series against the Huskies, WMU has not claimed victory against NIU on the road since 1999 (24-21). The last time these two teams met at Huskie Stadium was the 2005 season finale. The Northern Illinois win propelled them to the MAC Championship game, while the loss kept Western Michigan's hopes for a postseason bowl berth on the shelf until the 2006 campaign.

GAME 6 – WESTERN MICHIGAN VS. AKRON – GAME NOTES

THIS IS 1988 • A gallon of gas was 91 cents, a carton of eggs was 65 cents, the most popular films were 'Rain Man' and 'Big' and some of the most popular musical groups/singers were Enya and Robert Palmer. Move to 2007 and gasoline is more than three times the cost, the best movie out there is 'SuperBad' and Kanye West is the most popular (according to him) musician in the business.

What do these two years have in common? Western Michigan defeated Toledo at the Glass Bowl in both years, winning, 31-9, 19 years ago and 42-28 last week. It was WMU's 11th win on Toledo's home turf in 31 tries (12-19-0).

The win also marked the first time since 2003 that Western Michigan was victorious on the road in its MAC opener (39-32 at Ohio).

KILLER B's • Neither Mark Bonds, nor Brandon West had rushed for 100 yards in a game this season. That is no longer the case as each eclipsed the century mark against Toledo with Bonds carrying the ball 26 times for a career-high 143 yards and West rushing the ball 25 times for 102 yards. It was the sixth 100-yard rushing game of Bonds' career and the third for West.

DYNAMIC DUOS • Twelve other teams have reported having a pair of ball carriers reach the 100-yard plateau in the same game this season with Navy doing it twice and Arkansas having three rushers reach the mark. No other MAC team reported accomplishing the feat and West Virginia and Iowa were the only 2007 WMU opponents that achieved it.

BACK IN THE DAY • Despite the fact that 13 teams have had a pair of 100-yard backs in a game this season, it has not been the norm at Western Michigan. In fact, Bonds and West are the first running duo to each run for 100 yards in a game since Jim Vackaro and Bruno Heppell did it on Nov. 18, 1995. Heppell carried the ball 12 times for 128 yards, while Vackaro ran the rock 12 times for 113 yards.

RARIFIED AIR • Mark Bonds joined a group of elite running backs when he carried the ball for six yards at the 4:28 mark of the third quarter against Toledo. That run gave him 2,001 career rushing yards, making him the 11th Bronco to do so. He now stands at 2,068, which is eighth on the all-time list 316 yards behind Phil Reed (2000-03) who finished his time in the Brown & Gold with 2,384 yards.

AND THE AWARD GOES TO • Bonds' effort against the Rockets earned him the second MAC West Offensive Player of the Week nod of his career. He is the fifth Bronco football student-athlete to earn a weekly MAC award this season after WMU swept the awards on opening week and followed with a MAC West Special Teams POTW honoree the following week.

RETURN ON INVESTMENTS • Brandon West continues to be one of the top kick return specialists in the MAC, averaging 28.3 yards per return. Now Schneider Julien is inching his way up the MAC stats in punt return average. The junior return man now ranks third among his conference brethren with 14.1 yards per punt return. Junior safety Louis Delmas is not eligible to be counted in the statistics for kick returns but he did return his first-career kick off 49 yards against Toledo.

CLIMBING THE HILL • Tim Hiller is also approaching a milestone. The sophomore is six touchdown passes away from cracking the top-five on the career list. Hiller currently has 29 scoring strikes and Jeff Welsh is currently fifth with 34 career TD passes.

MULTIPLICITY • Tim Hiller threw multiple touchdown passes against Toledo, marking the ninth game he has done so in his career. It was the sixth time in his career he threw for three or more TDs. In fact, Hiller has been held to one or no TD passes only three times in his career (2005-NIU, 0; 2007-WVU, 0; 2007-MIZZOU, 1).

TIGHT AT THE TOP • Branden Ledbetter hauled in his 11th-career receiving touchdown with a 33-yard scoring grab against Toledo. He is now tied for third all-time among tight ends at Western Michigan.

PUTTING UP NUMBERS • Western Michigan's offense exploded for 490 yards on 87 offensive plays against Toledo. It was the highest yards total for the Broncos since amassing 544 yards against Ball State (in five overtimes) on Oct. 8, 2005.

It was the most total yards in a regulation game since racking up 638 against William & Mary (Division I-FCS) on Sept. 5, 2003.

It was the most yards in a regulation game against a Division I-FBS opponent since compiling 491 yards against Central Michigan on Nov. 15, 2003.

It was the most yards in a regulation game against a Division I-FBS opponent on the road since totaling 524 yards against Ball State in Muncie, Ind., on Nov. 4, 2000.

GO FOR TWO • The Broncos had attempted three two-point conversions after touchdowns this season, with having success. On both occasions, the ball ended up in the arms of a tight end (Branden Ledbetter at West Virginia; Keith Schultz at Toledo).

BACK-TO-BACK • Western Michigan is looking for back-to-back wins to open a conference schedule for the first time in 2003. That season the Broncos opened MAC play at Ohio and won, 39-32. WMU then traveled to Ypsilanti and defeated Eastern Michigan, 31-3.

CATCHING ON • WMU receivers are lining up and getting into the action this season as four receivers have 15 or more receptions, all of which are over 150 yards receiving on the season. Those numbers were boosted at Toledo six Broncos caught at least one pass led by Herb Martin, who hauled in a career-best seven receptions for a career-matching 71 yards. Three Broncos (Brandon West, Branden Ledbetter and Jamarko Simmons) all hauled in TD grabs against the Rockets.

JOINED WITH HISTORY • Former Bronco Greg Jennings continues to be associated with greatness as the Kalamazoo native hauled in Brett Favre's 422nd-career touchdown pass, breaking Dan Marino's record. Jennings was also on the receiving end of Favre's 421st TD pass to tie the record and hauled in the future Hall of Fame quarterback's 400th-career scoring strike on a catch run against Detroit during his rookie campaign.

ball from Jennings as well as a jersey from the former Bronco receiver.

HOLD THE LINE • For the second-straight game, Western Michigan's offensive line did not allow the opposition to sack the quarterback. The O-Line also blocked Toledo down the field, opening holes for two Broncos to rush for over 100 yards.

OCTOBERFEST • Western Michigan boasts a record of 25-15 during the month of October over the past 10 seasons. During that same time the Broncos are 14-8 during the month at Waldo Stadium.

Bill Cubit led teams are 6-2 during October and an almost perfect 4-1 during the month at home.

LONDEN CALLING • Londen Fryar, a 2006 All-MAC Defense selection had one of the biggest plays thus far in the season with his first interception of 2007 on Toledo's goal line. The pick, which he returned 53 yards to the Rockets' 47-yard line, was his first of the year and kept WMU within one score. The Broncos tied the game on the ensuing possession.

Fryar now has six career interceptions after leading the conference with five a season ago, his first as a defensive back. He is currently tied for second in the MAC in passes defended per game (1.20) and co-leads the conference in pass break ups with five.

NOTHING TAKEN NOTHING EARNED • The Broncos' impressive streak of consecutive games with at least one take away extended to 31 games on Londen Fryar's interception in the first half. WMU added another take away to open the second half when C.J. Wilson stripped Jalen Parmele of the ball and Fernand Kashama recovered it.

Both of WMU's take aways against the Rockets directly resulted in points with Hiller hitting Ledbetter for the score six plays later in the first half and Hiller finding West from nine yards out 11 plays later in the second half.

DOWN AND DIRTY • WMU's third-down conversion percentage is 40 percent (33-for-82), while opponents are converting third downs at a 50-percent clip (38-for-76). WMU improved on its season numbers against Toledo, converting on 7-of-16 chances and Toledo was held to 3-of-12 (25 percent).

RED-SEVEN, RED-SEVEN • The Bronco offense continues to show strength in the red zone this season. WMU was a perfect 5-for-5 against Toledo (all five for touchdowns) and is 20-for-23 on the season (87 percent). Seventeen of those 20 scores in the red zone are going for TDs.

HEAD OF THE CLASS • Five former Bronco student-athletes are being inducted into the WMU Athletic Hall of Fame this weekend: Joanne Bingham (volleyball); Marcia Karwas (track & field, field hockey); Dale Livingston (football); Michael Lyden (diving); Denny Telder (tennis).

STRONG TO QUITE STRONG • Akron comes into this game ranked in the top five in the MAC in eight statistical categories, ranking in the top two in three and lead the conference in a pair of areas. The Zips lead the MAC in pass efficiency defense (113.14) and punt return average (21.63 ypr).

WHAT TO WATCH FOR • Robbie Krutilla and Branden Ledbetter find their names among the nation's elite in their respective positions. Krutilla has been named to a pair of preseason watch lists and Ledbetter has earned a spot on one. Krutilla is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List (the award for the nation's best center) as well as the Outland Trophy (the award for the nation's best interior lineman). It is the second year he has made it onto the Rimington preseason list.

Ledbetter finds himself on the John Mackey Award Watch List (the award for the nation's best tight end) for the first time. He was named the Mackey Tight End of the Week once last season after amassing 101 yards receiving against Miami.

Jim Laney was added to the Ray Guy Watch List, the award for the nation's top punter, after the third week of the 2007 season. Anthony Gebhart was nominated for the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award, which will

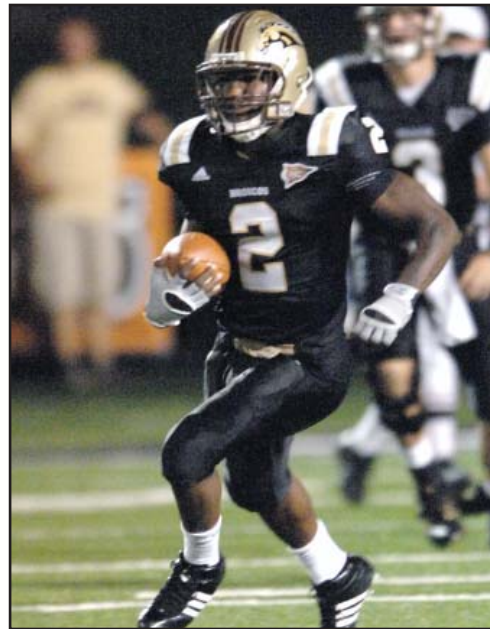

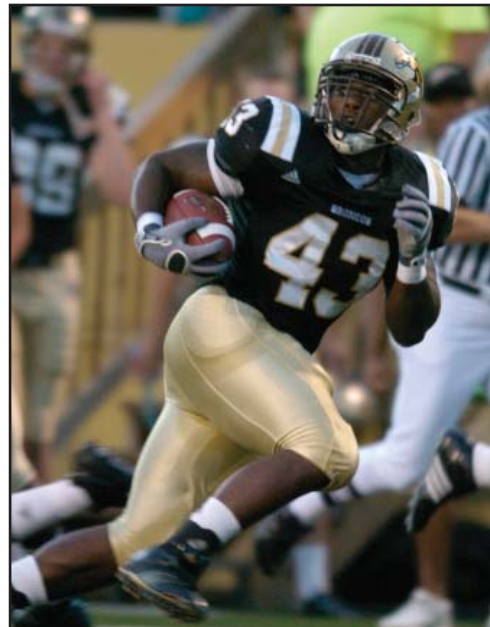
