THE GAME • It is Western Michigan's 84th Homecoming game and the opponent is a high-powered offensive team in Ball State. The Broncos come into this game in control of its own destiny in the Mid-American Conference West Division but are looking for their first home win over the Cardinals since 2003.

TELEVISION • The Bronco football program continues to gain regional and national notoriety through television exposure. Western Michigan is scheduled to play on live television at least six times this season. WMU will air on the ESPN family networks twice at home in 2007. The Broncos will have two games on Comcast Local and another on Comcast SportsNet. The Ball State game will be the first of those games on Comcast Local.

RADIO • This and all Western Michigan football games will be broadcast live on the Bronco Radio Network and its new flagship station, WZUU - 92.5 FM. Robin Hook (play-by-play) and Monty Porter (analysis) will have the call as they have together for the past nine seasons.

WEB SITE • WMU home football games (not televised by the ESPN family of networks) can be seen live via the official athletics web site (www.wmubroncos.com) by subscribing to Bronco Insider, which can be found on the home page of the site. You are able to listen to each Bronco football game on the Internet by signing up with Yahoo Sports through the link at the bottom of the home page. Live Stats are available for FREE for all Bronco home games by clicking the link atop the home football page.

SERIES IN BRIEF • Western Michigan leads the all-time series 19-14-0 with a 12-5-0 advantage at Waldo Stadium. Over the past two seasons, the home team has not been able to hold serve as WMU went to Muncie, Ind., last season and came away with a win and BSU defeated the Broncos at Waldo in dramatic fashion in 2005. WMU is also looking for consecutive wins over Ball State for the first time since 1999 and 2000.

THE COACHES • Bill Cubit (Delaware, 1975) begins his third season as the head coach of Western Michigan. He is 16-12 overall (.571), 10-2 at Waldo Stadium (.833), at Western Michigan and led the Broncos to their first bowl game since 1988 last season. Brady Hoke (Ball State, 1982) is in his fifth season as the head coach of the Cardinals football program. He is 4-3 this season and 19-34 during his time with the Cardinals.

UP NEXT • Western Michigan will play on the road at MAC West rival Eastern Michigan on Oct. 27 at 3:30 p.m. That game will be televised on Comcast Local. The Broncos have won two straight over the Eagles and 13 of the last 15. This will be first time since 2003 that WMU will play EMU at Rynearson Stadium as the two teams took played one another at Ford Field in 2005.

WHAT TO WATCH FOR • Robbie Krutilla and Branden Ledbetter find their names among the nation's elite in their respective positions. Krutilla has been named to a pair of preseason watch lists and Ledbetter has earned a spot on one. Krutilla is on the Rimington Trophy Watch List (the award for the nation's best center) as well as the Outland Trophy (the award for the nation's best interior lineman). It is the second year he has made it onto the Rimington preseason list.

Ledbetter finds himself on the John Mackey Award Watch List (the award for the nation's best tight end) for the first time. He was named the Mackey Tight End of the Week once last season after amassing 101 yards receiving against Miami.

Jim Lanev was added to the Ray Guy Watch List. the award for the nation's top punter, after the third week of the 2007 season. Anthony Gebhart was nominated for the National Football Foundation Scholar-Athlete Award, which will

LUCKY NUMBER SEVEN • Western Michigan is coming off back-to-back seasons with seven or more wins - the magic number to ensure bowl eligibility. Impressive as that is, another season with seven or more wins would only rank third all-time. The most consecutive seasons WMU has won seven or more games is six (1990-95). WMU went a combined 42-18-1 over that span. Ranking second is a span of four seasons (1997-2000) when the Broncos wen 31-15, won nine games (2000) for only the second time in program history and appeared in a two-straight MAC title games.

Another eight-win campaign would put this team in a class by itself for being the only one to capture backto-back seasons with eight wins or better.

POLL POSITION • Western Michigan was chosen by the Mid-American Conference News Media Association (MNMA) to not only win the West Division but take the conference crown home to Kalamazoo. WMU has steadily risen up the MAC West standings after finishing last in 2004 with a third-place finish in 2005 and a second-place finish last season.






