## WESTERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY BRONCOS (3-5, 2-2) AT EASTERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY EAGLES (2-6, 1-2)



October 27, 2007 • Rynearson Stadium • 3:30 p.m.

**THE GAME** • Western Michigan plays its last Mid-American Conference road game against Eastern Michigan on Oct. 27. It will mark the first time the Broncos have faced the Eagles at Rynearson Stadium since 2003. The two teams played at Ford Field the last time EMU was the home team.

**TELEVISION** • The Bronco football program continues to gain regional and national notoriety through television exposure. Western Michigan is scheduled to play on live television at least six times this season. WMU will air on the ESPN family networks twice at home in 2007. The Broncos will have two games on Comcast Local and another on Comcast SportsNet. The Eastern Michigan game will be the second-straight game for WMU on Comcast Local.

**RADIO** • This and all Western Michigan football games will be broadcast live on the Bronco Radio Network and its new flagship station, WZUU - 92.5 FM. Robin Hook (play-by-play) and Monty Porter (analysis) will have the call as they have together for the past nine seasons.

**WEB SITE** • WMU home football games (not televised by the ESPN family of networks) can be seen live via the official athletics web site ([www.wmubroncos.com](http://www.wmubroncos.com)) by subscribing to Bronco Insider, which can be found on the home page of the site. You are able to listen to each Bronco football game on the Internet by signing up with Yahoo Sports through the link at the bottom of the home page. Live Stats are available for FREE for all Bronco home games by clicking the link atop the home football page.

**SERIES IN BRIEF** • The Broncos hold a 26-14-2 edge in the all-time series against their intra-state rivals and are 7-6-1 on the road against the Eagles. WMU is 19-8-1 at home against Eastern Michigan and has captured 13 of the last 15 meetings in the series. Seven of those wins came on the road.

**THE COACHES** • Bill Cubit (Delaware, 1975) begins his third season as the head coach of Western Michigan. He is 16-12 overall (.571), 10-2 at Waldo Stadium (.833), at Western Michigan and led the Broncos to their first bowl game since 1988 last season. Jeff Genyk (Bowling Green, 1982) is in his fourth season as the head coach of the EMU football program. The Eagles have gone 11-31 during his tenure and 9-18 in the MAC.

**UP NEXT** • Western Michigan will take on rival Central Michigan on a Tuesday night in front of a national television audience. The game, airing live on ESPN2, will mark the first-ever national broadcast from Waldo Stadium. CMU will enter the game 3-0 in conference play with all three of those wins coming against West Division opponents. WMU leads the all-time series, 43-43-2 and is 31-12-2 against the Chippewas at home. Last season, CMU assured itself a MAC West crown en route to the 2006 MAC Championship.

## GAME 9 — WESTERN MICHIGAN AT EASTERN MICHIGAN — GAME NOTES

**BRAGGING RIGHTS** • Now in its third year, the Michigan MAC Championship adds a little more to the games among WMU, EMU and CMU. The team with the best record against their two in-state rivals captures the trophy sponsored by the Michigan Sports Hall of Fame. Western Michigan captured the hardware in the inaugural season of 2005 and Central Michigan laid claim to the trophy in 2006.

**WHAT A RUSH** • Brandon West continues to evolve as a running back at Western Michigan. Against Ball State he broke out for 171 yards on 21 carries (8.1 yards per carry). It was a career high in yardage and was the first time a WMU back has gone over 150 yards on the ground since Nov. 5, 2005 when Trovon Riley racked up 151 yards on 26 carries at Eastern Michigan. West's rushing total, aided by a second-quarter run of 66 yards, is the most by a Bronco since Phil Reed ran for 226 yards on 22 carries.

**KEEPING TAKING AND TAKING** • Western Michigan's streak of 33 consecutive games with at least one take away was snapped on Oct. 20 when the Broncos failed to force one Ball State turnover. Now that WMU is starting on another take away streak, Florida Atlantic University is believed to have the nation's longest current streak at 15 games.

**THIRTYSOMETHING** • Tim Hiller through a touchdown pass in a game for the 13th time in his career and he is already in the top five at WMU for career TD passes. He is tied at 34 with Jeff Welsh (1997-2001). He needs one more to move into a tie for fourth with Norm Harris (1948-50). The full top-five list can be found later in these notes.

**WHAT IS ON THE HORIZON** • Since moving to receiver full time at the beginning of the 2006 season Jamarko Simmons has put up solid numbers and is on the cusp of entering the list of elite at Western Michigan.

**TURN OF THE CENTURY** • Jamarko Simmons hit the century mark in receiving yards for the fourth time this season with 110 yards on nine catches against Ball State. It was the sixth 100-yard receiving game of his career. Simmons was one of only two Broncos to record 100 yards receiving in a game in 2006, doing it twice. Branden Ledbetter (TE) was the other.

He needs 194 yards over the Broncos' remaining games to become just the seventh receiver to have 1,000 yards in program history.

**MAKING QUICK WORK** • Western Michigan has forced 24 three-and-outs on defense this season with over half of those coming in the last two games. WMU forced Northern Illinois into seven three-and-outs (a season best) and forced Ball State into six. The Broncos forced the high-powered Cardinals offense into consecutive three-and-outs on their first three possessions. Nineteen of WMU's 24 forced three-and-outs have come against conference opponents. West Virginia is the only opponent that did not record a three-and-out possession against WMU.

**OFF TO THE RACES** • Brandon West's 49-yard kick off return in the fourth quarter against Ball State was his fifth return of 30 yards or more this season. It also tied Louis Delmas for the second-longest kick off return of the season. West has the

best return of the year on a 98-yard kick off return for a score against Indiana.

**WHAT IS YOUR PURPOSE** • Brandon West registered 273 all-purpose yards against Ball State with 171 yards on the ground, 18 yards in receiving and 84 yards on kick off returns. Hit was the third game this season that West has racked up more than 200 all-purpose yards. He had 232 all-purpose yards at Missouri and a school and MAC record 346 all-purpose yards against Indiana.

West is now fourth on the WMU single-season all-purpose yards list with 1,572. He needs 318 yards to become the new single-season record holder at Western Michigan. The current record holder, Shawn Faulkner, had 1,889 all-purpose yards in 1983.

His 2007 total coupled with his 1,344 all-purpose yards from his rookie campaign leave him just 84 yards shy of 3,000 for his career. The full top-five list can be found later in these notes.

**DOUBLE-DIGITS FOR DELMAS** • Junior free safety registered the first double-digit tackle performance of the season against Ball State, finishing with 10 stops (eight solo). The North Miami Beach, Fla., native has five career games with 10 or more tackles with his first four coming during his freshman season of 2005. Delmas' collegiate debut produced 10 tackles against Virginia and he then had a string of three-consecutive games with double digits tackles against Ball State (11), Bowling Green (12) and Kent State (10) later in the season.

**MAKING PLAYS** • Senior offensive tackle James Blair surpassed his single-season best for offensive plays against Ball State. Prior to last Saturday, Blair's highest offensive snap total was 655 plays (2006). He has now been in on 718 plays this season for WMU. Blair has started every game this season for Western Michigan and is two starts away from matching his career best of 10 also set last season.

**MIKE JONES - WHO? - MIKE JONES** • One week after earning the first MAC West Special Teams Player of the Week award of his career, Mike Jones put himself in position to claim similar honors against Ball State. Jones was a perfect 3-for-3 in field goals with a career-long 45-yard kick in the first quarter. He finished the game with a career-best 11 points on the three FGs and two extra points. Jones is 8-for-9 (88.9 percent) on the season and 9-for-10 (90.0 percent) for his career.

**A REUNION OF SORTS** • Western Michigan's most recent NFL draftees, Greg Jennings (Green Bay) and Tony Scheffler (Denver) will meet on the field as opponents for the first time as professionals when the Packers take on the Broncos on Monday Night Football on Oct. 29.

On the season, Jennings has 14 receptions for 228 yards and three TDs. He is averaging 16.3 yards per catch and a season-long 57-yard reception. He caught Brett Favre's record-tying and record-breaking TD passes.

Scheffler, working his way back from off-season ankle surgery, has seven catches for 87 yards a one TD reception. His longest reception of the season was 26 yards and he is averaging 12.4 yards per catch. Scheffler's first TD grab came on Oct. 21 against Pittsburgh.

**ADD ONE MORE TO THE LIST** • Nine different Broncos have hauled in at least one scoring grab this season through eight games. Jordan White was the most recent to add his name to the list with a 50-yard scoring reception in the fourth quarter against Ball State. White, a redshirt freshman, had a career-best four catches for 80 yards, also a career high.

**BACK IN THE DAY** • Eastern Michigan is the longest running opponent on Western Michigan's schedule in 2007. The two teams first met in 1906 with the Eagles claiming a 14-5 victory. EMU edges out Central Michigan by one season as the Broncos and Chippewas first took the field against one another one year later in 1907, resulting in a 27-0 WMU victory.
