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THE SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY

Indian Hill High School is a four-year high school enrolling 703 students. The senior Class of 2008 consists of 183 students. The school is located in suburban Cincinnati in a predominantly upper-middle to high-income residential community of approximately 14,000 people. The school community reflects a long tradition of support for academic and cultural achievement.

Indian Hill High School is the recipient of the U.S. Department of Education Award of Excellence and is accredited by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and the Department of Education, State of Ohio. Indian Hill High School is a member of The College Board, NACAC, and OACAC and adheres to their principles and practices. Recognized in Newsweek in 2007 as one of the nation's top high schools and ranked #81 nationally for its challenging curriculum for all students, Indian Hill had 118 AP Scholars last year.

There are 66 faculty and professional staff members of whom 72% have masters degrees or higher.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS AND THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The typical course load is six to seven courses. The school year consists of two semesters and uses a modified-block schedule: two days each week, students have four classes of 85 minutes each; three days each week, there are seven periods of 50 minutes each.

GRADING

The GPA is computed using semester grades and includes all courses. AP courses receive added "weight" of .03 added each semester to the GPA, provided the student earns a "C" or better in the AP class.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES

A total of 21 A.P. courses are offered. They represent the highest-level courses offered in each discipline. Last year 82% of AP test takers scored "3" or higher. Art, Biology, Calculus AB and BC, Chemistry, English Language, English Literature, Environmental Science, European History, French Language, French Literature, Latin, Micro and Macro Economics, Music Theory, Physics B, Spanish Language, Spanish Literature, Statistics, U.S.Government, and U.S. History.

HONORS COURSES that are not weighted include: Advanced Freshman English, Advanced Sophomore English, Advanced Algebra II, Advanced Precalculus, Math Analysis, and Advanced Chemistry.
