James “Fly” Williams was a two-time first-team All-American during his days at Austin Peay (1972-74). He holds numerous OVC records including field goals made (360) and attempted (800) in a season and career scoring average (28.5 points/game).



Morehead State’s Ricky Minard is the only OVC player to surpass 2,300 points, 700 rebounds and 200 assists in a career. He finished as the Eagles’ all-time leading scorer and is fourth on the OVC career list (2,381). He was drafted by the Sacramento Kings in the second round of the 2004 NBA Draft (No. 48 overall).



In his first season in the league, UT Martin guard Lester Hudson set the OVC single-season record for 3-pointers made in a season (124). Hudson averaged 25.7 points per contest, which ranked fifth nationally. He also became the first player in NCAA Men’s Division I history to record a quadruple-double in a contest.

For the 15th time in 16 years, the Ohio Valley Conference invades downtown Nashville to crown its men's basketball champion.

The OVC Basketball Tournament is the league's showcase event, and the 2009 edition of "Music City Madness" will include a variety of exciting action both on and off the court.

The site of the tournament this year is the Sommet Center (formerly known as the Gaylord Entertainment Center) in downtown Nashville, marking the 10th time the event has taken place in the building. The tournament was first held at the Sommet Center (pronounced soh-MAY) in 1997 (marking the first basketball event in the building) and has been there every year since with the exception of 2002, 2004 and 2008.

The state-of-the-art facility has received rave reviews from OVC players, coaches and fans. Among the building's amenities is a new Megatron scoreboard which was installed in 2007. The building, which is home to the NHL's Nashville Predators, seats up to 20,000 people for select basketball events.

Eight teams will make up the field for the 2009 OVC Tournament, with first-round games set for Tuesday, March 3 at the on-campus sites of the top four seeds. The winners of those games will come to Nashville for the semifinals on Friday, March 6. The OVC championship game is set for Saturday, March 7, with the winner earning the Conference's automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. Once again the semifinals will be televised on ESPN while ESPN2 will televise the championship game.

The OVC is contracted to have its tournament in the Sommet Center through the 2014 season.

Last season top-seeded Austin Peay topped Tennessee State 74-54 to claim the program's fourth OVC Tournament crown.

OVC Tournament Tiebreaker System

Regular season standings will be the determining factor in setting first-round pairings for the tournament. All ties will be broken starting at the top of the conference standings and working down. The tiebreaking system will utilize the following factors, in order, until all ties are broken.

TWO-WAY TIES

1. Records in head-to-head competition are compared, with the higher seed going to the team that has won the most games against the other.
2. In the event step 1 does not resolve the tie (i.e. if the two teams split their games during the season), then the records of the tying teams against the No. 1 seed shall be compared. The team with the better record against the No. 1 seed shall gain the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event the tie cannot be broken, seeds will be determined by a coin flip.

MULTIPLE TIES

1. Composite records between the tying teams will be evaluated to determine whether one team has won more games against the other tying institutions (in which case that team would receive the higher seed) and/or one team has won the least number of games among the tied teams (in which case the team will receive the lowest seed, and/or two teams have the same composite record (in which case the two-team tiebreaker scenario shall be utilized).
2. In the event step 1 does not solve the multiple ties, or reduce the multiple ties to one tie, then a comparison of records of the tying institutions against the No. 1 seed will occur. The team among the tying institutions with the better record against the No. 1 seed will receive the higher seed.
3. If the potential No. 1 seed is among tied teams, the process in step 2 will begin at the highest point in the standings which does not involve a tied team.
4. The process continues, through the No. 11 team in the standings, if necessary.
5. In the event this process does not resolve the ties, seeding will be determined by a coin flip.

Note: If a multiple tie is reduced to a tie between two teams, the two-team tiebreaker formula will then be utilized. Ties involving teams higher in the standings are always broken before ties involving teams lower in the standings.
