

entucky is fortunate to have a unified judicial system with unified administration. Since the Court of Justice was formed in 1975 under the Judicial Article, our court system has been well-funded by the General Assembly. Still, all is not perfect and we are working every day to improve the Court of Justice and to make change where change is needed.

Public confidence in our courts is essential to the administration of justice, which in turn is necessary for the proper functioning of our system of government. Since I took office as Chief Justice in October of 1998 a primary objective of mine has been to improve public trust and confidence in the justice system.

Providing better information to our fellow citizens about our system of

justice must be a shared effort. I encourage every judge and lawyer in the Commonwealth to become active in his or her community's public education endeavors. Towards this goal, I have proposed a change in the rules governing the granting of continuing legal education credits, allowing those who become involved as educators in this public education effort to receive CLE credits.

Improving public trust and confidence is far more than public relations and education. It is essential that we actually improve our performance. Building on the success of the family court program in Louisville, we are expanding the one-family-one-judge concept into rural and small communities. In 1998 nine new family

courts were created as pilot projects. The family court project is still in its early stages, but it is working well throughout Kentucky, and we intend to continue expanding this popular program into other Kentucky communities. The 2001 General Assembly approved an amendment to the Kentucky Constitution to specifically authorize family courts, and this amendment will be submitted to the voters on November 5, 2002.

The number of drug courts in Kentucky has more than doubled during my tenure as Chief Justice. Drug courts proceed from the idea that while many, even most, drug offenders need to be incarcerated, some do not. Some drug offenders need a regime of strict supervision, counseling, and testing to assure that they remain drug free. In the event of failure, drug offenders need the assurance of incarceration for the underlying offense.

Drug courts now exist in more than a dozen locations across the Commonwealth, administered by judges who volunteer their spare time, for no additional compensation. This level of dedication has led to the overall success of the Drug Court Program. I have personally participated in numerous drug court graduation events and have talked with people who were restored to working, family-supporting, taxpaying citizens.

One of my highest priorities is to improve courthouse facilities in each of Kentucky's 120 counties. The work we do is too important and public respect is too essential to require it to be held in shoddy buildings. In 1998 the General Assembly authorized 17 new courthouses, and in 2000 an additional 15 new courthouse projects were approved. All of those projects are now underway. Additional courthouse construction and renovation will be proposed for consideration by the 2002 General Assembly.

The Kentucky Court of Justice is one of the most technologically advanced court systems in the nation. Over the last two years, we have worked to replace our computerized case management system. Our new, state-of-the-art system, *KyCourts*, was developed in-house by personnel familiar with the needs of Kentucky courts. Easy-to-use features such as touch screens, bar coding, and Internet accessibility are built in to make this one

of the finest, most efficient systems anywhere.

We are continuing our efforts to develop a comprehensive, offender tracking system. Through new technology, judges and prosecutors will have access to accurate and complete data on a particular defendant during all phases of court proceedings.

We now provide internet access to electronic legal databases for all of Kentucky's 261 judges, their law clerks, and legal assistants. Online access is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. This was accomplished at a remarkably modest cost, with great savings in comparison to the cost of non-electronic libraries.

It gives me special pride to note the passage of House Bill 439, enacted during the 2000 General Assembly. This bill created a senior status program for special judges in Kentucky. Similar to the federal system, retired Kentucky judges are now eligible to serve as special judges for five years in exchange for enhanced retirement benefits. This will give us a pool of experienced judges who will be available to serve as special judges whenever and wherever needed. I am confident that this will help us reduce backlog and delay in Kentucky courts, and at a cost significantly less than it would take to create additional judgeships.


I have mentioned just a few of the exciting initiatives being undertaken by the Kentucky Court of Justice. Joseph E. Lambert was sworn in as Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Kentucky on October 5, 1998, having been elected by his peers to serve as Kentucky's fourth Chief Justice. He has represented the 3rd Supreme Court District since his election in November 1986.

Chief Justice Lambert was born in Berea, Kentucky in 1948. He received his B.S. from Georgetown College in 1970 and his J.D. from the University of Louisville School of Law in 1974.

Chief Justice Lambert served as a staff member for United States Senator John Sherman Cooper in Washington, D.C. from 1970-1971. From 1974-1975, he served as law clerk for United States District Judge Rhodes Bratcher, in Louisville, Kentucky. He was in private practice in Mount Vernon, Kentucky from 1975-1987.

Chief Justice Lambert was awarded the Distinguished Alumni Award by the University of Kentucky School of Law in 1988. He was Featured Alumnus of the Association of Independent Kentucky Colleges and Universities in 1995. He was named Lambda Chi Alpha, Outstanding Alumnus in 1997. In 1999 he was awarded Honorary Doctor of Laws from Georgetown College and Eastern Kentucky University. He was named Outstanding Judge of Kentucky by the Kentucky Bar Association in 2000, also receiving the designation of Life Fellow. He received the Leadership Award from the National Association of Drug Court Professionals in 2000.



Donald C. Wintersheimer has the distinction of being the longest serving member of the court. First elected to represent the 6th Supreme Court District in 1982, he was reelected in 1990, and again in 1998.

Justice Wintersheimer was born in Covington, Kentucky in 1932. He received his A.B. from

Thomas More College in 1953, his M.A. from Xavier University in 1957, and his J.D. from the University of Cincinnati in 1960. He was in private practice until he was elected to the Kentucky Court of Appeals in 1976, where he served until his election to the Supreme Court.

A prolific opinion writer, Justice Wintersheimer writes, on average, over 40 opinions each year. He has published numerous articles in various state and national law journals. Recognized nationally for his judicial experience and legal expertise, Justice Wintersheimer appeared on a 1998 PBS television special entitled "Inside the Law."

Justice Wintersheimer is a member of several bar associations, the American Judicature Society, the institute of Judicial Administration, Phi Delta Phi, and Tau Kappa Alpha. Prior to his judicial career, Justice Wintersheimer served for 14 years as Covington city attorney. His military service includes two years in the U.S. Army Infantry.

Justice Wintersheimer is a former president of both the Thomas More Alumni Association and the Kentucky Municipal Attorneys' Association. He received the Community Service Award from Thomas More College in 1970 and was named Outstanding Teacher in 1973. He is a member of the Adjunct Faculty of the Chase College of Law at Northern Kentucky University. In 1998 he was recognized as a Distinguished Alumnus of the University of Cincinnati College of Law. He served as Distinguished Jurist in Residence at Chase College of Law and was named Outstanding Jurist by Phi Alpha Delta Legal Foundation in 1990.



Janet L. Stumbo is the first woman elected to the Supreme Court of Kentucky. She has represented the 7th Supreme Court District since her election in November 1993.

Born in Prestonsburg, Kentucky in 1954, Justice Stumbo received her B.A. in 1976 from Morehead State University and her J.D. in 1980

from the University of Kentucky. She worked as a staff attorney for the Kentucky Court of Appeals from 1980-1982. While in private practice from 1982-1988, she served as assistant county attorney for Floyd County from 1982-1985. In 1989 she returned briefly to private practice before being elected to the Court of Appeals where she served until her election to the Supreme Court.

Justice Stumbo was elected to the Morehead State University Hall of Fame in 1990. She received the Justice Award from the Kentucky Women Advocates in 1991 in recognition of her work in the area of spousal abuse. In 1995 her work in the area of gender fairness won her the group's Outstanding Just Award, also receiving the 1995 Bull's Eye Award from the Women in State Government Network. In 1996 Justice Stumbo received the Woman Lawyer of Achievement Award from the Kentucky Bar Association.



John William Graves began serving in Kentucky's trial courts in 1984, first serving as a district judge and later as a circuit judge. He was elected to the Supreme Court in November 1995. Justice Graves represents the 1st Supreme Court District. In 1999 mandatory cases filed with the Supreme Court totaled 434, with 394 cases disposed.

Discretionary cases filed in 1999 totaled 803, with 746 cases disposed.

In 2000 mandatory cases totaled 401, with 378 cases disposed. Discretionary cases totaled 847, with 793 cases disposed.

Born in Paducah, Kentucky in 1935, Justice Graves received his B.S. in 1957 from the University of Notre Dame. He studied at the University of Louisville School of Medicine from 1957-1958. He received his J.D. in 1963 from the University of Kentucky. Prior to his appointment as district judge, Justice Graves was in private practice for 20 years, concentrating primarily on disability law and negligence law, with special emphasis in worker's compensation cases. He was appointed as circuit judge in 1989 and was elected to the Supreme Court in November 1995.

During more than 35 years of active and reserve military service, Justice Graves completed the Command & General Staff College, the Airwar College, and the National Defense University. He was awarded the Army Commendation Medal in 1987, the Army Meritorious Service Medal in 1989, and the Defense Meritorious Service Medal in 1993.

Justice Graves is a member of the National Lawyers Association, the Kentucky Association of Trial Attorneys, and the Illinois Bar Association.



Martin E. Johnstone is the first judge in Kentucky to have served at all four levels of the Court of Justice. Prior to the Judicial Article of 1975, Justice Johnstone was elected as a magisterial district judge. In 1978 he assumed the duties of district judge, and in 1983 he was elected as circuit judge. He served as Jefferson County Chief District Judge and Chief Circuit Judge. In

1993 he was appointed and later elected to the Kentucky Court of Appeals, where he served as Chief Judge Pro Tem. He has represented the 3rd Supreme Court District since his election in November 1996.

Justice Johnstone is a native of Louisville, Kentucky, born in 1949. After receiving his bachelors from Western Kentucky University and his J.D. from the University of Louisville, he was in private practice until 1976.

Justice Johnstone was named Judge of the Year by the Louisville Bar Association in 1981. He received the Henry V. Pennington Outstanding Trial Judge Award from the Kentucky Association of Trial Attorneys in 1991.



William S. Cooper began his judicial career as a circuit judge in 1979. He served as vice-chief regional judge from 1981-1992, and as chief regional judge from 1992-1996. In 1996 he was elected to represent the 2nd Supreme Court District.

Justice Cooper was born in Elizabethtown, Kentucky in 1941. He received both his B.A. and J.D. from the University of Kentucky, graduating first in his law school class of 1970.


An Air Force veteran, Justice Cooper is a member of the American Legion, Rotary, and the Knights of Columbus. He is past president of the University of Kentucky Law Alumni Association. Justice Cooper has served on numerous working committees, some of which include the Kentucky Council for Higher Education Subcommittee for Legal Education, the Committee on Justice and Corrections, the Evidence Rules Review Commission, and the Commission on *Guardians ad litem*.

Justice Cooper is a diligent lecturer, dedicated to the continuing education of those in the legal community. He has published several law journal articles and wrote *Kentucky Instructions to Juries, Vol. 1 (Criminal)*. Justice Cooper was named a Charter Life Fellow of the Kentucky Bar Foundation in 1986 and received the association's Kentucky Bar Center Award in 1992. Other awards include the Knights of Columbus 1991 Community Service Award and the Elizabethtown-Hardin County Chamber of Commerce 1997 Hall of Fame Award.

James Keller is the newest member of the Supreme Court. Appointed to the court in May 1999, Justice Keller subsequently won election to a full term as the representative of the 5th Supreme Court District.

Justice Keller was born in Harlan County, Kentucky in 1942. He completed his undergraduate studies while attending Eastern Kentucky University on a football scholarship. He received his J.D. from the University of Kentucky in 1965. During the ten years he spent in private practice, he served for eight years as Master Commissioner of the Fayette Circuit Court. He was appointed as circuit judge in 1976, where he served until 1999. Twice elected as president of the Kentucky Circuit Judges Association, he also served two terms as Fayette County chief circuit judge.

Justice Keller helped to establish several highly effective court programs during his tenure as circuit judge. He is most proud of his efforts in establishing the *Parents Education Clinic*, a program for divorcing parents which is now used in several Kentucky jurisdictions. He was instrumental in establishing *Kids' Time*, a program for children of divorcing parents. He helped establish the Kentucky Mediation Center and the Fayette Drug Court. Justice Keller currently serves as a member of the Judicial Advisory Committee to the Governor's Office of Child Abuse and Domestic Violence Services.

COURT OF APPEALS

The Kentucky Court of Appeals is made up of fourteen judges, two elected from each of the state's seven appellate districts, to serve a term of eight years. Nearly all cases come to the Court of Appeals from the lower, trial courts. If the losing party in a case, other than criminal case acquittals and divorces, which may not be appealed, is dissatisfied with the outcome, the case can be appealed. Judges sit in panels of three to review the trial record, with the majority determining the decision.

The Kentucky Court of Appeals ranks as one of the busiest appellate courts in the nation. In 1999 the Court of Appeals recorded 3,148 case filings and ruled on 3,255 cases, giving the court a clearance rate of 103.4%. In 2000 case filings totaled 2,958, while rulings were issued in 3,196 cases, yielding a clearance rate of 108%.



icely Jaracz Lambert became the fifth Director of the Kentucky Administrative Office of the Courts on March 8, 1999. The AOC serves as the administrative arm of the Court of Justice. Appointed by the Chief Justice, the Director assists with the preparation of the judicial budget and oversees the AOC's numerous departments. The AOC provides support services to Kentucky's 261 judges and 120 circuit court clerks.

Prior to her appointment, Ms. Lambert was in private practice in Louisville, Kentucky. She previously served as the General Counsel at the AOC for more than eight years. She has also served as Assistant Attorney General under former Attorneys General Steve Beshear, David Armstrong, and Fred Cowan. Ms. Lambert holds an English degree from Transylvania University and a J.D. from the University of Kentucky.

"The process of making this appointment has been difficult. Kentucky is blessed with a great many qualified attorneys and administrators," said Chief Justice Joseph Lambert. "In the end, it was Cicely's familiarity with the AOC, the respect and admiration she has from Kentucky judges and circuit court clerks, and her unquestioned integrity that made the decision for me."

"I was honored to be considered by Chief Justice Lambert for this position," said Lambert at a press conference held on February 23, 1999 to announce her appointment. "Our court system is recognized as a model throughout the nation and I look forward to working with the Chief Justice toward the challenges ahead."

stablished in 1976, the Administrative Office of the Courts serves as staff for the Chief Justice of Kentucky. The state constitution outlines certain duties which are the responsibility of the AOC, under the supervision of its administrative director. Statutory duties include: act as fiscal agent of the Court of Justice; maintain data processing systems; disperse and maintain supplies and equipment for the court system; administer personnel policies and payroll for the Court of Justice; oversee the state pretrial and juvenile services programs; supervise the State Law Library; provide educational programs for judges, court clerks, and support staff; prepare, publish and print manuals, forms, stationery, and other materials; and handle press and public information for the courts.

The Administrative Office of the Courts consists of seventeen divisions, currently employing 274 people through the central office in Frankfort and another 397 at offices across the state. Divisions include:

AOC PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

MINORITY AFFAIRS OFFICE

On January 5, 2000, Chief Justice Lambert and Executive Director Cicely Lambert created the Office of Minority Affairs. This office is responsible for developing diversity outreach programs. The Minority Affairs Office is now available to help anyone who has questions about the court system, especially questions involving minority and diversity issues.

The primary goal of this office is to create systematic change that will eliminate barriers, real or perceived, that exist between the court system and the public it serves. Public forums will help familiarize members of minority communities with the court process. Other new, creative, and engaging outreach initiatives will be designed to promote public trust and understanding of the courts by encouraging citizen participation in programs such as jury service.

Minority and diversity training will be developed for judicial and nonjudicial court personnel. Local judges and court clerks will be

encouraged to increase the professional opportunities made available to members of minority communities by improving notification of employment opportunities at the local level. The Minority Affairs Office will form strategic partnerships with state colleges and universities to aggressively recruit minorities to pursue legal careers in Kentucky.

When minorities are under-represented in all aspects of the justice system, the users of our courts perceive inequity in the system. The Minority Affairs Office and the judiciary continue to systematically examine all policies and procedures to ensure that they do not operate to the detriment of any person on the basis of race, creed, religion, color, gender, sexual orientation, age, disability, marital status, or national origin.

SENIOR STATUS ACT

"It is my duty as Chief Justice to be a good steward of the people's money. It is also my duty to assure that the Kentucky Court of Justice fulfills its constitutional mission by providing prompt, high quality legal decision-making. The citizens of Kentucky have a right to be heard without delay due to case backlog."

In March 2000, the Kentucky General Assembly passed House Bill 439, known as the Senior Status Special Judge Act. Under the act, a pool of retired judges will be created, and from this

> pool the Chief Justice will make temporary assignments wherever and whenever a need exists. The retired judge will serve as a special judge for up to 90 days per year for a term of five years without compensation beyond an improvement in his or her retirement benefits. The cost of this plan has been actuarially determined to be \$420,000 per year. The net cost is expected to be substantially less, as all or most of the \$100,000 annual cost of compensation for special judges under current law will be saved. It is anticipated that the net cost of the program will be approximately equal to the cost of one new circuit judge.




EXPANSION OF DRUG COURTS

"Drug Court participants must work hard to put their lives back on track, and our judges and staff work hard to keep these individuals focused on getting off and staying off drugs."

In fiscal year 1998, drug courts were operating in six Kentucky counties. At the close of fiscal year 2000, drug courts were functioning in 15 counties, with another 24 counties planning to open new drug courts during the coming biennium. Juvenile drug courts have been, or soon will be, introduced in 11 counties, and one county is planning a family drug court.

DRUG COURT AWARDS & SPECIAL ACHIEVEMENTS

This unprecedented growth in the Drug Court Program is a testament to the program's success. Each drug court is a grassroots effort, with judges leading teams of local criminal justice officials, treatment and service providers, and community representatives to work together to develop a program that works in each respective jurisdiction.

The Drug Court Program consists of three phases, lasts an average of one year, and is performance based, with measurable expectations and accountability. Nonviolent offenders charged with misdemeanor and felony alcohol and other drug related offenses are accepted into the program through diversion and probation tracks. Individualized program plans outline specific responsibilities and goals with timetables necessary to assist offenders in becoming productive

members of society, with strengthened coping skills for drug free living. Upon successful completion of the program, charges are dismissed or conditionally discharged. If unsuccessful, participants are prosecuted or sentenced. With close monitoring and supervision, drug courts offer a safe and effective alternative to incarceration, and operate at a fraction of the cost of imprisonment.

EXPANSION OF FAMILY COURTS

The Family Court Program, first introduced in 1991 as a pilot project in Kentucky's most populated county, Jefferson, has been expanded into nine new locations, now serving rural and small communities as well as metropolitan areas.

The 1998 General Assembly approved House Bill 544, which created a new section to Kentucky statutes and established eight new Family Court Pilot Projects serving 12 counties. These projects are located in McCracken, Warren, Franklin, Floyd and Pike counties; Boone and Gallatin counties share a family court; Madison and Clark counties share a court; and Pulaski, Lincoln, and Rockcastle counties share a court. A ninth project, created in free committee, was added in Christian County. HB 544 also provided additional judgeships, created and defined the structure of the Family Court Council, identified baseline jurisdiction of the family courts, and provided for the employment of a statewide Family Court Coordinator to assist the courts in their development.

Following the passage of HB544, the AOC Division of Family Courts immediately set about making preparations for these new courts, with three new family courts set to become operational in 1998, and the remaining six in 1999. The first challenge was to locate space to house the new family courts, taking into consideration the special needs of family court such as security and people movement, including the need to provide separate waiting areas for domestic violence victims and perpetrators, the segregation of child witnesses in a child-friendly atmosphere, and the dissemination of information to the various waiting rooms. Staff movement between counties also had to be considered, as did technology needs, which ranged from providing for courtroom data entry to installing telephones at the bench.



Educational needs such as judicial orientation and staff training added further immediate challenges. A Family Court Benchbook was developed. In order to standardize and simplify the capture of family court information, AOC staff developed uniform forms. Numerous training sessions were held, including a cable television presentation designed to help inform the public about the new Family Court Program. Quarterly newsletters and a family court brochure were published in order to share information about the developing projects across the state. Judges and staff were encouraged to network through e-mail, and a family court webpage was introduced as a further communication tool.

A more complete description of the history, current status, and future goals of the Family Court Project is contained in *Commonwealth of Kentucky, Family Courts Progress Report*, issued in January 2000. To obtain a copy, call the Division of Family Courts at (502) 573-2350.

FACILITIES MANAGEMENT

With ever increasing caseloads, and with courts expanding into new areas of law such as drug court and family court, our courthouses must grow and change in ways that keep up with today's demands on the courts. Planning for new construction, renovations, or simple repairs requires extensive oversight. The Facilities Management Division provides the administrative framework necessary to meet the facility needs of the courts at the local level. This includes providing courtroom and office space through county governments, city governments, and, when necessary, through private sector lease.

The Facilities Management Division undertook numerous construction, renovation and maintenance projects during this biennium (see maps on page 15). The 2000 General Assembly approved 15 new construction projects. The division is designing guidelines to outline minimal finishes and structural content of all new buildings, with the goal of building structures that will meet 30-year projected needs. This means buildings should require only general maintenance during the 30 years following their construction.

Other special projects during the biennium included: installing electronic key systems for local courts; working towards passage of House Bill 734, which brought additional control and accountability to the AOC and the Court Facilities Standards Committee; and establishing Kentucky Standards for the construction of courthouses, including devising "Rural One-Court," "Rural Two-Court," and "Kentucky Metro" standards in accordance with the mandate of HB734. Kentucky Standards will include guidelines for security, accessibility, and equity in space allotted to all court staff.





Rountine facilities projects included: resolving space and facility problems while addressing long term space needs; performing space audits; maintaining a current inventory of all furniture and equipment; overseeing vendor maintenance on all equipment; assisting local officials with issues relating to bond obligations on new construction projects; monitoring the Local Facilities Fund based on court occupancy of locally owned buildings and other relevant cost data; reimbursing local governments for the courts' pro rata share of estimated operating costs, including verifying actual costs and adjusting current year payments accordingly; performing on-site inspections; reporting and giving presentations to the Capital Planning and Advisory Board and the Capital Project and Bond Oversight Committee; coordinating meetings of the Court Facilities Standards Committee; providing expertise and guidance in updating HVAC (i.e., heating, ventilation, and air conditioning) systems; and reviewing and working towards statewide compliance with the 1990 Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

INFORMATION SYSTEMS

The Division of Information Systems puts a strong focus on customer service. With more than 40 employees working in three locations, the division is equipped to respond quickly and effectively to the technology needs of nearly 3,200 Court of Justice employees.

The Help Desk is a major means of assisting court personnel, now available to callers from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. ET, Monday through Friday. Previously staffed by only one person, the Help Desk now has four people answering telephone calls and e-mails regarding computer problems. In addition, six field services computer technicians travel around the state to help resolve complaints received by the Help Desk. In-coming questions and complaints can often be resolved in a matter of minutes.

Replacement of the case management system known as *SUSTAIN* has been a top priority in this biennium. The new system, *KyCOURTS*, which records the activity of every court case in the state, is Windows-based and offers timesaving, easy-to-use features such as bar coding and touch screens. Statewide installation of the system began during the FY1999-FY2000 biennium. The projected target date for completing installation is Spring 2002.

Through *KyCOURTS*, our courts will be much more "connected" to the world. For example, every Court of Justice employee will have e-mail capabilities. Every judge in the state, and their staff, will be able to easily access online legal research. And internet capabilities will allow *KyCOURTS* to link to a centralized information system in Frankfort.

Chief Justice Lambert spearheaded an effort to create a network which will provide current information to local and state authorities on all criminal cases in Kentucky. In December 1999, working closely with Chief Justice Lambert, U.S. Representative Harold "Hal" Rogers (KY-5) secured significant federal law enforcement grant funding totaling \$4,370,000 to create a statewide, internet-based computer network in Kentucky.

The new information system will be updated every fifteen minutes and will be available to any authorized state or local official with internet access. The current system, known as *COURTNET*, is updated daily, with access limited to specific computer terminals. Local law enforcement officers, jailers, prosecutors, public defenders, judges, and other court officials will have access, via the internet, to data regarding charges, convictions, bench warrants, bail, pretrial release conditions, and sentences, with nearly "real time" accuracy.

A website has been introduced which allows easy access to court dockets. By logging on to the Kentucky Court of Justice Docket Information website, anyone can view a list of all district and circuit court cases scheduled to be heard in any given county during the coming week. The site address is:

Installation of the Windows-based Appellate Information Management System (AIMS) was completed during this biennium. AIMS is used by the Supreme Court and the Court of Appeals. The case management system previously used was mainframe-based.

Work continued on the statewide network known as WAN, wide area network. Installation was one-third completed during the biennium. The anticipated completion date for statewide WAN installation is October 2001.

Advances have been made in the area of courthouse facilities projects. In an effort to simplify future network installation and maintenance projects, data networks are now being incorporated in the earliest planning phases of all courthouse construction and renovation projects.

BUDGET AND PROGRAM REVIEW

The biennial budget for the Judicial Branch is monitored by the AOC Division of Budget and Program Review. Staff members analyze legislation for fiscal and programmatic impact, and the division closely monitors legislative committee meetings during sessions of the General Assembly.

The budget enacted by the 2000 General Assembly represents a 14% increase in general fund support. The budget provided for the continuation of current services, including a 5% annual salary increment in each upcoming fiscal year for all court personnel. Additional funding was provided for salary improvement for certain classifications of nonelected employees, restructuring of circuit clerks' salaries, increasing trial commissioners' salaries, and three additional circuit judgeships. Other notable items in the 2000-2002 budget include an increase in funding for court facilities and the senior judge program in the Judicial Retirement System.

LEGISLATIVE HIGHLIGHTS

In an effort to achieve pay equalization, the 2000 General Assembly approved the restructuring of pay classifications used for CIRCUIT COURT CLERKS. Pay grades were reduced from 31 separate classifications to 8 pay grades.

Also approved in 2000, DEPUTY COURT CLERKS will receive pay raises equalling 7% in FY2001 and 7% in FY2002.

OFFICE OF GENERAL COUNSEL

The Office of General Counsel (OGC) provides a full array of legal services to the Chief Justice, the Director of the AOC, judges, circuit court clerks, and AOC central office staff. The OGC closely collaborates with other AOC departments. Projects for the FY99-FY00 biennium included:

- Development of an in-house management training series for all AOC managers in conjunction with the Personnel and Education Services divisions.

- Representation of the courts on various statewide committees and task forces, including an initiative to restructure the way court fees and costs are imposed.
- Reviewed all bills introduced during the 2000 legislative session and prepared a summary of all bills impacting the courts. Provided regional training on new legislation.
- As a result of the General Assembly's adoption of the "Rule of 75," the OGC is now coordinating the Senior Judge Program.
- Created procedures for implementing new legislation and designing new forms for use by the public and court personnel.
- Teaming with the AOC Print Shop and Information Systems Division to make AOC forms available to the public and court personnel on the Court of Justice website.
- In tandem with the Court Improvement Project, the OGC served as staff for the Commission on *Guardians ad litem*. After hearing testimony on ways to improve the representation of children in dependency, neglect, and abuse cases, the commission published its recommendation in October 1999. - Developed the "Kentucky Court of Justice Computer, Software, Voice Mail, Internet Access, and E-Mail Usage Policy" with the Statewide Technology Committee.
- Trained circuit and district judges, circuit court clerks and deputies, pretrial officers, and court designated workers.


PRETRIAL & COURT SECURITY

PRETRIAL RELEASE

In operation since 1976, this division continues to refine and improve the services it provides. Current technology is making it easier to provide better data to the courts than in years past. Our ability to access enhanced criminal history data from CourtNet continues to improve. And, in conjunction with AOC's Division of Information Systems, a new generation of hardware is being implemented using connections over wide area networks (WAN) and Internet Service Providers (ISP). This will aid in providing timely access to records at the local level.

Automating the capture of our interview information by electronic means is an ongoing effort. We believe this will permit the courts broader and easier access to our background information and reduce the amount of time required to maintain and track paper files by our local Pretrial Officers.

We are proud to have the most comprehensive source of demographic data on defendants in the state and perhaps the country. Using our pretrial interview information, coupled with our criminal history data, researchers have begun studying issues such as domestic violence. Additionally, a comprehensive Driving Under the Influence study will soon be conducted by the University of Kentucky under a grant from the Justice Cabinet. Our process of automation will significantly enhance the possibilities for future research opportunities.



During FY2000, our officers interviewed 84% of the total bondable arrest population. Thirty-six percent of the total arrest population was released prior to trial on nonfinancial conditions of release (67% under our supervision). In addition to the base information collected in the standard interview, we conducted 17,848 Domestic Violence Interview Addenda to assist the courts on these difficult cases, and we collected nearly 40,000 Affidavits of Indigency to assist the Public Defender's office in determining eligibility for their services. As a further refinement of our processes, we assisted law enforcement in serving 3,720 active bench warrants found as a result of our processing defendants through CourtNet.

RECORD OPERATION

During the FY1999-FY2000 biennium, the Pretrial Record Operation processed more than 551,000 record requests on behalf of state agencies, public housing, and private sector employers. Many licensing agencies utilize our records service including the Kentucky State Police, Alcohol Beverage Control, Kentucky Board of Nursing, and the Kentucky Bar

Examiners, to name a few. We also provide information on convicted felons to the State Board of Elections, and numerous record requests are processed on behalf of all Kentucky health care facilities and schools, now required to obtain background checks on every employee and volunteer.

Fees collected for the record service fully pay for the staffing of the operation, which employs more than 40 individuals.




MEDIATION AND DIVERSION

We continue to offer Mediation and Diversion Programs in Boone, Campbell, and Kenton counties, and Mediation Programs are offered in Jefferson and Fayette counties. These services are intended to allow citizens to choose alternatives to formal prosecution to resolve their disputes. Diversion from normal prosecution is also offered to first time offenders who might benefit from early intervention, hopefully precluding repeat offenses in the system. Steps have been taken to make these programs more beneficial to the courts in which they operate.

COURT SECURITY

Security plans are needed when high profile, volatile trials carry a greater risk than standard trials. Preparing a security plan can involve weeks of coordination, ranging from planning the travel route from the detention facility to the courthouse, to conducting





meetings with the judge, sheriff, local police, jailers, prosecutors, and other court security officers involved in a high profile case.

Nearly 6,000 hours of security services were provided by five Court Security Inspectors during this biennium. Utilizing specialized skills or equipment, security was provided for 102 trials in the last year alone. This does not include the many trials where last minute calls were made, nor does it include security for other court proceedings such as arraignments, pretrial hearings, and other court functions.

A Court Security Specialist conducts security surveys and provides training to bailiffs across the state as required by statute. Training ranges from a one-day seminar on appropriate conduct and procedures for bailiffs, to a 32-hour course on specialized security issues. The Court Security operation has been restructured to include a supervisory position to better coordinate the efforts of the unit.

EDUCATION SERVICES

Continuing judicial education (CJE) is mandatory for all members of the Kentucky judiciary. The Division of Education Services coordinates continuing education for judges, circuit court clerks, trial and domestic relations commissioners, court administrators and managers, and other court personnel. The division also serves as support staff for the Mandatory Continuing Judicial Education Commission, which, among other duties, supervises the administration of CJE for judges.

Under the guidance of the Circuit Judges' and District Judges' Education Committees, the division coordinates annual judicial colleges, as well as orientation programs for new judges and other educational programming for the judiciary. Topics featured in the Circuit and District Judges' Judicial Colleges held during this biennium included: dynamics of domestic violence, contested dissolution cases, mediation, parental divorce education, child abuse and neglect cases, risk assessment of sex offenders, youth offenders, Megan's Law, Kentucky's Crime Law (HB455), alternative

sentencing such as Drug Court, DUI case law, commercial drivers license cases, immigration laws, double jeopardy, rules of evidence, illegal dumping, Kentucky's sovereign immunity laws, Natural vs. Positive Law, court technology, special judge appointments, election finance laws, and judicial independence.

Kentucky judges also attended national judicial education programs sponsored by the National Judicial College and the National Council of Juvenile and Family Court Judges.

Training of circuit court clerks and deputy clerks is another major focus for the Education Services Division. Planning of two clerks conferences held each year and regional training programs for deputy clerks is done with the Circuit Clerks' Education Committee. In the FY1999-FY2000 biennium, clerks and deputy clerks received training on bookkeeping practices, personnel policies and procedures, office management, handling juvenile and mental health cases and the associated confidentiality issues, preparing the record for cases on appeal, issuing drivers licenses, election finance laws, court technology, and the legislative and budget process.

The Education Services Division supports other Court of Justice initiatives through adult education for professional development in the courts. One example is the regional Bench-Media Forum. Judges and journalists gather to candidly examine their often adversarial roles, setting aside their differences for an afternoon in order to explore ways to improve the working relationship between the two professions. This effort should lead to the public being more fairly and accurately informed about the work of the courts.

The Education Services Division assists with websites that provide information on the Court of Justice. The division is exploring the use of electronic media for distance learning within the courts. And the division has recently expanded into the area of creative design and multimedia services. Efforts will focus on the enhancement of training, programming and information materials produced by the AOC.

The Education Services Division is committed to the continued development of strategies, curricula, and technologies for high quality adult education in the Court of Justice.

YOUTH, FAMILIES AND COMMUNITY SERVICES

The Division of Youth, Families and Community Services is comprised of two departments, Court-Community Relations and Juvenile Services. The division coordinates numerous law related education programs and is also active in a wide array of juvenile justice initiatives. During the FY1999-FY2000 biennium, 18,000 newsletters were distributed to help keep people informed about the many activities of the division.

LAW RELATED EDUCATION

Participation in court sponsored law related education (LRE) programs is at an all time high in Kentucky. During the FY1999-FY2000 biennium, 163,987 youth participated in various programs organized by the Department of Court-Community Relations. The phenomenal success of this outreach and public education effort has been made possible, in part, through state and federal grants and contracts totaling \$465,875. Funding is also provided through the Court of Justice budget.

LRE programs are traditionally provided through school-based and juvenile correction programs on a statewide basis. In FY1999-FY2000, these programs included:

- **-Shoplifting Prevention**; Students in 796 primary schools were educated about the consequences of shoplifting.
- **-Teen Court**; Now operating in 26 different locations, first-time, minor, juvenile offenders can elect to be sentenced in the less formal teen court setting, where the judge is the only adult present in court. Over 1,790 students were trained in the juvenile justice process and served as attorneys, jurors, court clerks, and bailiffs during cases involving 410 juvenile defendants. Sentences constructed by peer juries are legally binding. Compliance is monitored by Teen Court Coordinators, most of whom are volunteers.
- -Mediation; 213 middle school teachers and counselors were trained in the "We Can Work It Out!" program, making it possible for them to begin conflict resolution programs in their schools. Students learn to resolve their differences through a six-step mediation process.
- **-Teens, Crime and the Community**; Created by Street Law, Inc., this program encourages students to examine crime in their schools and communities, and apply prevention lessons they learn through the program. Student participants totaled 5,500 in FY2000.
- **-We the People...The Citizen and the Constitution**; This popular program was used in nearly 900 Kentucky schools with 21,500 students participating. The program fosters civic competence and responsibility among elementary and secondary students by focusing on the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights.
- -Mock Trial; High school students learn about the American legal process by playing the roles of attorneys, jurors, plaintiffs, defendants, and witnesses in cases they prepare and present, often in front of a real judge. Regional and statewide mock trial tournaments are held to showcase the skills of the students, with the winner of the state competition representing Kentucky in a yearly, national competition. Mock trial participants totaled 768 students from 60 Kentucky high schools during the biennium.
- **-Under 18: Under the Law**; This program was used in 94 middle schools with 18,225 students participating. The program uses a

two-part, interactive video which examines the juvenile justice process in Kentucky. A resource person from the justice system participates in classroom discussions which are prompted by the video aired annually in a broadcast on Kentucky Educational Television's (KET) Star Channel 9.

- **Project Citizen**: The goal of this program is to develop students' commitment to active citizenship through learning about the methods and procedures of the American political process. During FY2000, student participation totalled 300.

RACIAL/ETHNIC FAIRNESS

The Implementation Task Force for Racial/Ethnic Fairness in Kentucky Courts, established in 1998, is coordinated through the Court-Community Relations Department. Chaired by Jefferson District Judge Janice Martin, the Task Force works to ensure racial fairness in the courts. Extensive research, including the use of focus groups and court-user surveys, has identified three major areas of concern: education, recruitment, and court interpreting.

- Education

Cicely Jaracz Lambert, Director of the AOC, chairs the Education Subcommittee. The group is developing an action plan for training judges, court personnel, and AOC employees about the various cultural issues they are likely to encounter through their work.

- Recruitment

The Recruitment Subcommittee is chaired by Donald L. Burnette, Jr., former Dean of the Louis D. Brandeis College of Law at the University of Louisville. Efforts of this group focus on recruiting more minorities into the legal profession.

- Court Interpreting

The Court Interpreting Subcommittee is chaired by retired attorney Robert Rodriquez. By establishing a certification process and training court interpreters, judges, and court personnel, the group hopes to ensure the provision of high quality court interpreting services.






FOSTER CARE

The Division of Citizen Foster Care Review Boards (CFCRB) recruits and trains foster care review board volunteers, and provides administrative support to the community-based boards. Review boards perform a vital service for the courts, reviewing the cases of all children in the foster care system due to abuse, neglect, and/or dependency.

After the courts have placed children in out-of-home care, whether it is with foster families, relatives, or in child care facilities, judges and social workers rely on CFCRB reviews in determining whether or not treatment plans are working. Reviews also help to ensure that these children are placed in safe, permanent homes as quickly as possible.

The CFCRB central office staff is notified when a child has been committed to foster care. Information is entered into the CFCRB Tracking System, which records the child's name, demographic information, case number and case type, and the date of his or her entry into foster care. The central office tracks which children remain in custody and which children are released.

Volunteers are recruited through local media and special, public awareness programs. All volunteers must undergo a background check and complete an eight-hour training session, organized by the CFCRB Division, prior to being appointed to the local board.

Approximately 750 people serve on 146 community boards. Boards meet at least once every three months, although monthly reviews are the norm. During the biennium, CFCRBs conducted over 33,000 case reviews of more than 13,800 children.

The CFCRB Division conducted a survey of reviewers, asking them to report the problems which they believe still exist in the child welfare system. They were also asked to suggest ways to alleviate these problems. Reviewers identified nearly 40 areas where improvement is needed. Following is a sample of their suggestions.

STATE LAW LIBRARY

Marge Jones was appointed as the new State Law Librarian in July 2000, following the retirement of Sallie Howard in September 1999. Marge brings with her a lifetime of library experience, working at the Department for Libraries and Archives for 19 years prior to joining the state law library staff in November 1976.

The state law library is a professional research library. It serves as the central collection of legal literature for state government and is available for use by public officials and their staff, state employees, attorneys, and citizens.

Beyond overseeing the central law library collection, staff maintain 266 local libraries for judges across the state, two for each Supreme Court Justice, one conference room library, and one for each judge in the state. Library staff also offer assistance to county and other publicly funded law libraries upon request.

Professional legal research assistance is provided to justices and judges upon request. The law library staff attorney prepares abstracts of recent federal cases involving state issues and summarizes reports of Kentucky cases. These abstracts are published in the Judicial College Notebook distributed at the annual Kentucky judicial colleges.

When the decision was made in this biennium to add an online legal database as a research tool, which is directly available to judges, library staff took on administrative tasks such as tracking system users and paying the monthly subscription fees for the service.

COURT SERVICES

The Division of Court Services provides technical support to Kentucky's 120 circuit court clerks in matters related to the management of court records and bookkeeping records. Court Services field representatives and auditors assist circuit clerks in person and by telephone. Extensive support is provided through on-site training of circuit clerks and their deputies in the various computerized systems used by the courts.

During the biennium division staff conducted 570 field visits. Auditors reviewed 2,952 Summary Financial Reports and supporting documentation detailing more than \$432.2 million collected by circuit clerks during the biennium.

The Circuit Court Clerks Accounting Manual and all bookkeeping forms used by circuit clerks are updated by Court Services staff. Keeping the Circuit Court Clerks Manual upto-date and accurate is a joint effort between the Court Services Division and the AOC Office of General Counsel. The two divisions also work together during regional, legislative review programs, and they collaborate on creating and revising court forms as needed.

Court Services staff are instrumental in the development of new case management and bookkeeping technologies. The division works closely with Information Systems in identifying and designing new technologies that will improve the day-today operations of the circuit clerks' offices across the state.
