Mission Statement

Southern Nevada Vocational Technical Center will provide career/technical and academic instruction which imparts technological, interpersonal, and entry-level job skills and enables students to meet the rigors of post-secondary education.

Principal's Highlights

The students who attend SNVTC are dedicated to acquiring a quality education. SNVTC continues to have one of the highest graduation rates and lowest dropout and transiency rates in the district.

- SNVTC continued to add new course offerings: genetics, commercial construction, and golf course turf management.
- 11 Future Business Leaders of America students received 28 State awards; 7 qualified for Nationals.
- SkillsUSA students received 69 state awards; 35 of those students qualified for Nationals in Kansas City, MO.
- SNVTC had one SkillsUSA student place 1st place in the nation and received the gold medal in HVAC.
- SNVTC had one SkillsUSA student receive the honor of being elected for National Office for SkillsUSA.
- SNVTC was selected as one of the four high schools in the State with outstanding CTE programs.
- Continued use of Edline; the online system allows parents to view grades, assignments, and school-wide information.
- Students were recognized quarterly for straight A's and a perfect attendance drawing for a DVD player is done each semester.
- SNVTC had it's first ever Naval Academy Appointment.

Goals and Objectives

Goal 1

IEP students at SNVTC will increase proficiency in mathematics by 10% to 48% on the spring 2007 NHSPE.

Objective(s):

IEP students identified as non- proficient in mathematics will increase their proficiency by 10%, as measured by the NHSPE test between fall 2006 and the conclusion of the testing program in May 2007.

Goal 2

IEP students at SNVTC will increase proficiency on the spring 2007 English Language Arts NHSPE.

Objective(s):

IEP students identified as non-proficient in English Language Arts will increase their proficiency by 5% as measured by the NHPSE between fall 2006 and the conclusion of the testing program in spring 2007.

Goal 3

Establish baseline number of students who receive 2+2 tech/prep credit, industry certification, or state licensure.

Objective(s):

The number of students receiving 2+2 Tech/Prep, industry certification, and state licensure will be collected and tabulated to establish a baseline as a reference for future years of comparison.





Parent/Community Involvement

Newsletters are sent to parents every quarter and contain information about student recognition, school news, student achievement, and school activities. Approximately 72% of our parents attend Open House. In addition, a parent from the SNVTC Parent Advisory Committee reports on all pertinent business that occurs at regional PAC conference.

Meetings are held with parents on an ongoing basis, which provide information about school curriculum, classroom instruction, and student achievement. Some examples include: Parent Advisory Committee, Parent Career/Technical Orientation along with apprentice, and internship orientation meetings. Monthly Joint Technical Skill meetings allow communication between the Career and Technical Instructors and Business Community Leaders that enhance our staffs' capabilities to be updated in current career trends.

Edline is the online system that allows parents to view grades, assignments, attendance, and school-wide information. It also includes counseling information on registering for classes, applying for colleges, and scholarship application sites.
