About Greenwood: Greenwood is a laboratory school located on the campus of Missouri State University and is a department within the College of Education. Greenwood has a comprehensive Kindergarten through grade 12 educational program with an enrollment of approximately 350 students. High school enrollment is 105 students.

Accreditation: Greenwood is accredited by the North Central Association of Schools and meets the graduation requirements of the Missouri Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.

Faculty: More than 90% of the teaching faculty have a masters' degree or higher and have an average of 9 years teaching experience at Greenwood Laboratory School. Many faculty members hold multiple certifications.

Graduation Requirements: Requirements include 22 credits, 4 service learning merits, and mastery of all components of the Graduation Exhibition.* Students completing 4 additional service learning projects qualify for the Public Affairs Honors Diploma. Units of credit requirements are shown in the table below:

***Graduation Exhibition:** Students must master all components of this rigorous project including: a research paper on a current topic, a related service project in the community, and a final public presentation including public speaking, a media presentation comparing the search topic to the service learning experience and a Q & A session.

Grading and Grade Point Averages: A letter grade system is used for permanent records and transcripts. All courses are considered when grade point averages are determined. In computing a student's grade point average, the following grade distributions are used:
