# **Conservatives Drop Back, Labour Gains a Point in Britain**

Governing party is now locked in a virtual tie with the Tories amongst respondents aged 18 to 34.

[LONDON – Feb. 11, 2010] – The Conservative Party remains popular in Great Britain but has lost support over the past fortnight, a new Angus Reid Public Opinion poll conducted in cooperation with PoliticalBetting.com has found.

### **Voting Intention**

Across Great Britain, 38 per cent of decided voters and leaners (-2 since late January) would support the Conservative candidate in their constituency if a General Election were held tomorrow.

The governing Labour Party remains in second place with 25 per cent (+1), followed by the Liberal Democrats with 20 per cent (+1).

### **KEY FINDINGS**

 Voting Intention: Con. 38%, Lab. 25%, Lib-Dem 20%, UKIP 6%, BNP 3%, Grn. 3%, SNP 2%, PC 1%, Oth. 1%

Full topline results are at the end of this release.

From February 9 to February 10, 2010, Angus Reid Public Opinion conducted an online survey among 2,002 randomly selected British adults who are Springboard UK panelists. The margin of error—which measures sampling variability—is +/-2.2%. The results have been statistically weighted according to the most current education, age, gender and region data to ensure samples representative of the entire adult population of Great Britain. Discrepancies in or between totals are due to rounding.

The United Kingdom Independence Party (UKIP) is fourth with six per cent (+1), followed by the British National Party (BNP) with three per cent (-1), and the Green Party also with three per cent (+1).

#### **Regional Breakdowns**

At least 40 per cent of decided voters and leaners in London, South of England and Midlands and Wales would support the Tories in the next General Election.

Labour remains on top in Scotland (30%, five points ahead of the Scottish National Party) and trails the Tories in the North (Con.35%, Lab. 30%).

The Lib-Dems stand at 23 per cent in the South of England, ahead of Labour by six points but trailing the Tories by a significant margin.

# **Other Demographics**

The Conservatives remain the favourite choice for voters over the age of 55 (43%, ahead of the combined totals for Labour and the Lib-Dems in this group) and hold a comfortable 14-point advantage over Labour amongst voters aged 34 to 54.

However, the governing party has made significant gains among respondents aged 18 to 34. In late January, the Tories held a seven-point edge over Labour in this group. This time around, the two parties are virtually tied (Lab. 32%, Con. 31%), with the Liberal Democrats a distant third (23%).
