



## Bloomington Enrollment Distribution of Sex within Ethnicity/Race - Fall 2010







## Bloomington Intercampus Mobility By Campus and Year Fall 2008 through Fall 2010








#### Degrees Conferred by Level Bloomington 2005-06 through 2009-10



#### **Distribution of Residency Status within Degree Level**






## Graduation Rates of Bachelor's Seeking Students Receiving Bachelor's Degrees Bloomington 1997 through 2006






## Bloomington Full-Time Beginner Retention Rates to Second Semester & Year Fall 2002 through Fall 2009



#### Percentage Receiving Aid by Type











# Undergraduate Work Study by Source Bloomington 2005-06 through 2009-10

Federal Work Study (FWS) is funded using both federal funds and employer funding. The employer may be an IU office, using federal, IU, state, or private funding, or a non-IU employer providing academically relevent work in the public interest. These figures include students who were enrolled on one of their four campus census dates, or who completed a degree during the year.

#### **Work Study by Source**










