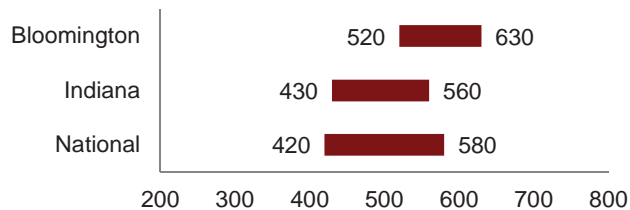




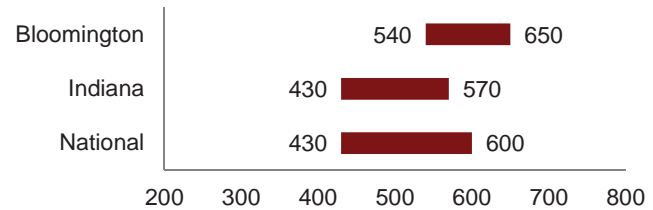

**SAT Reading Score (Middle 50%)**

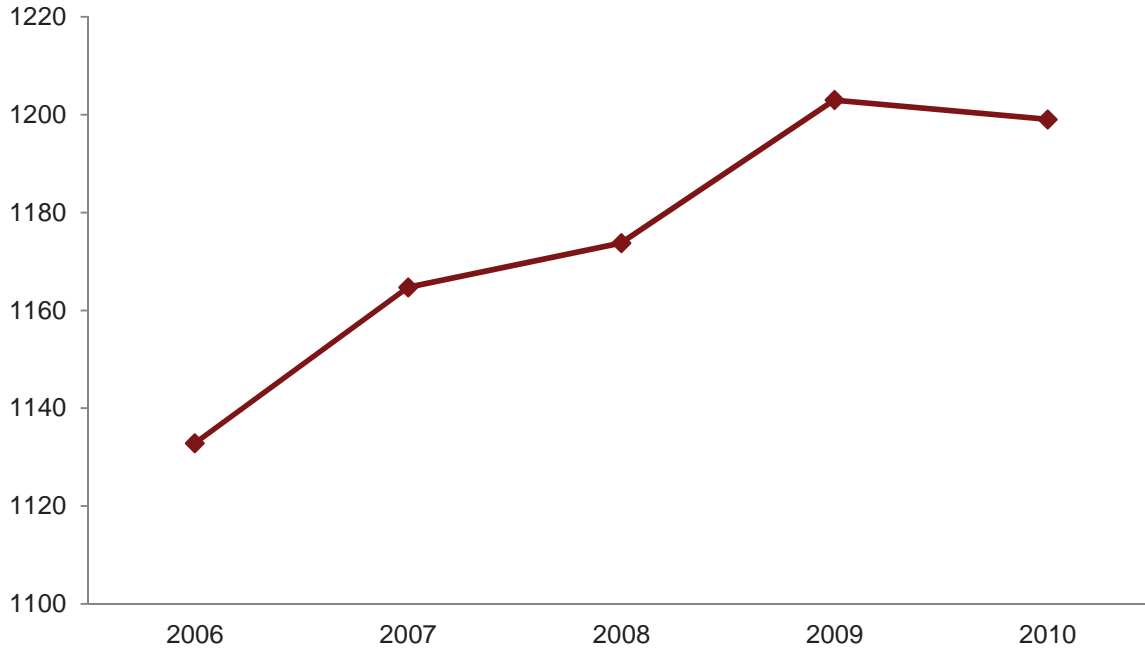


**SAT Math Score (Middle 50%)**

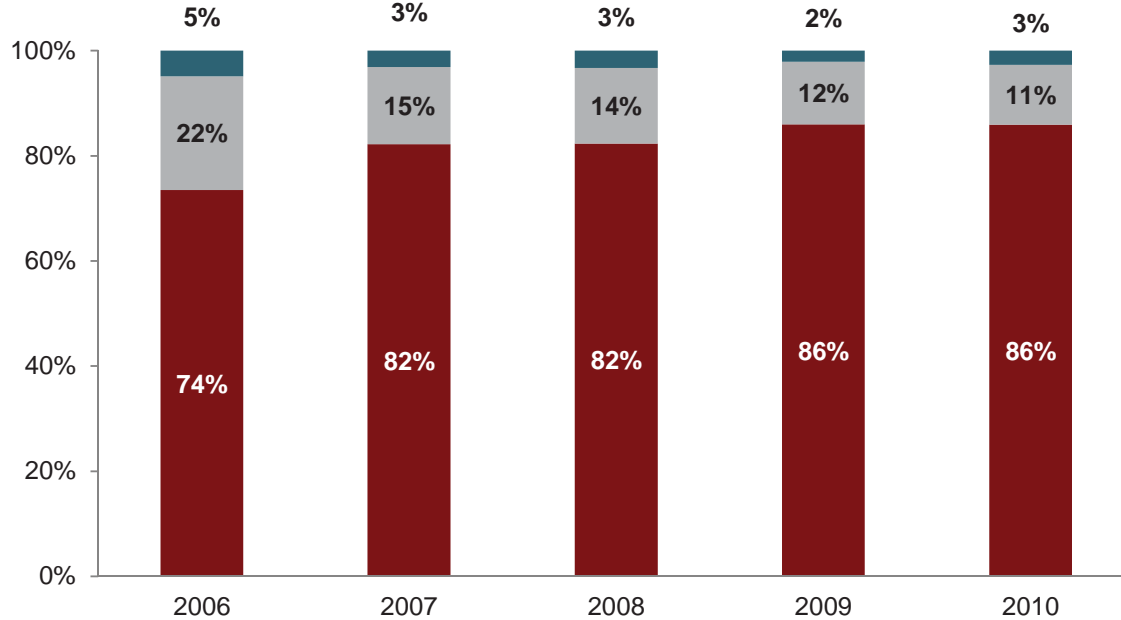

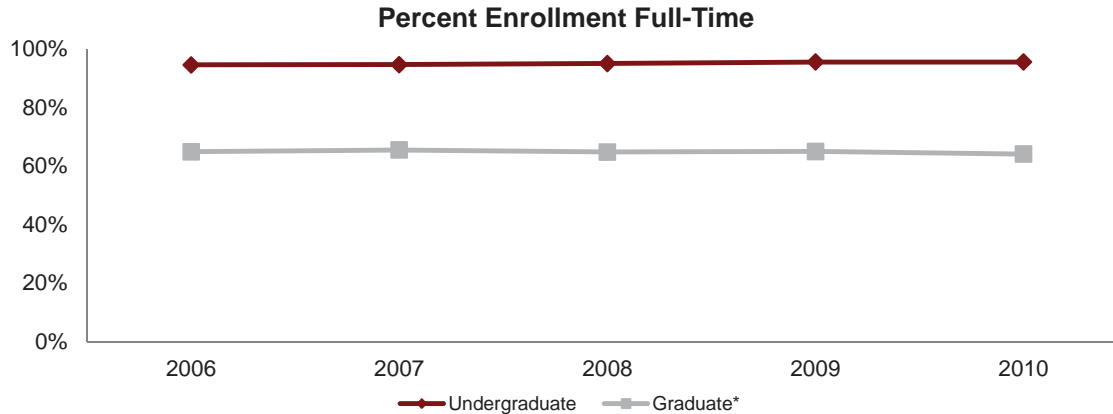

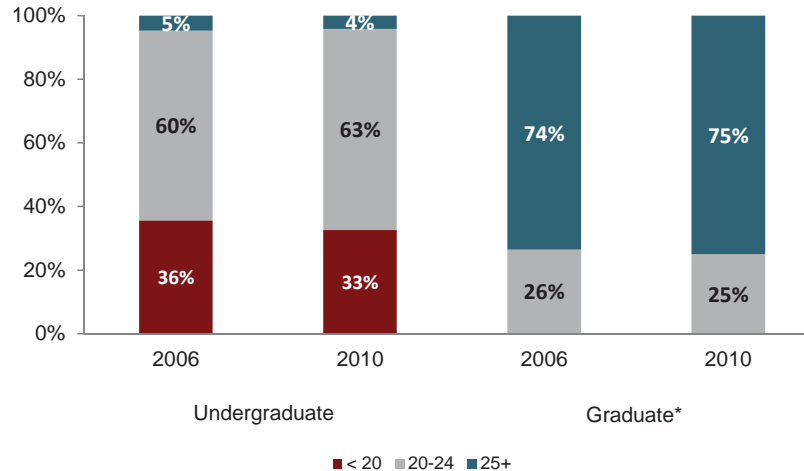

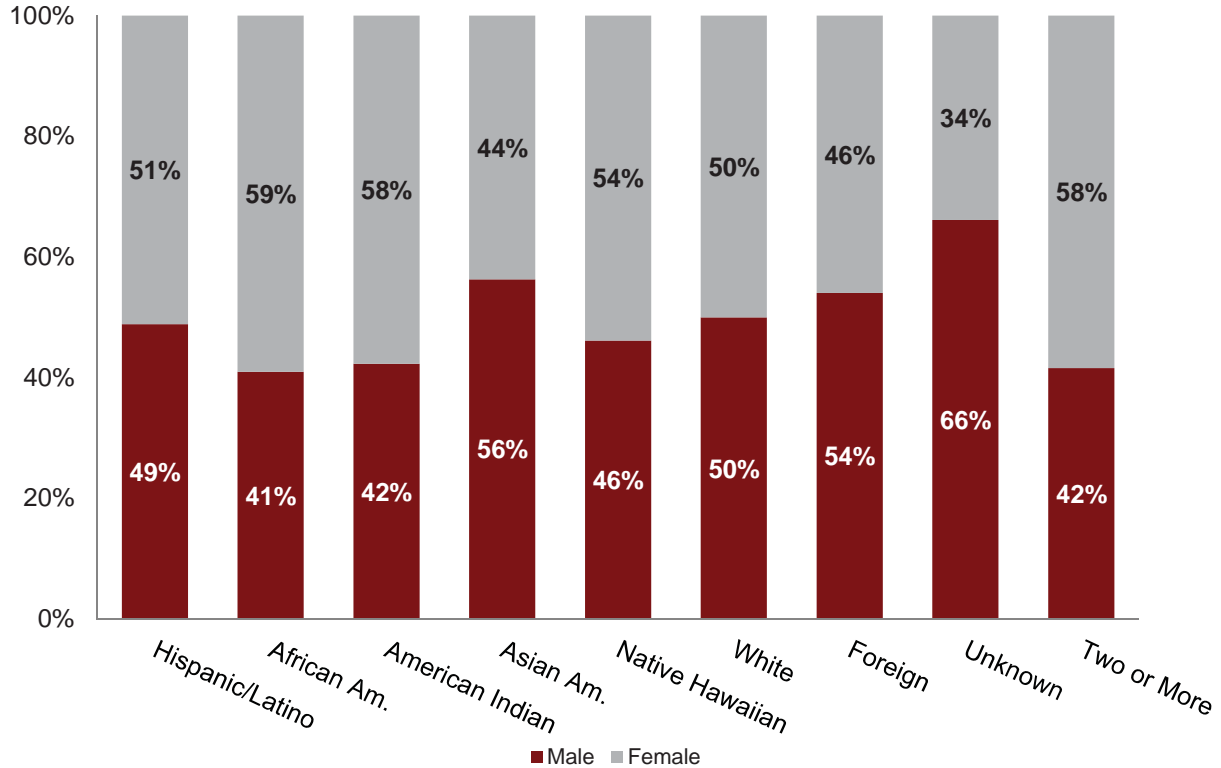

### Bloomington Enrollment Distribution of Sex within Ethnicity/Race - Fall 2010



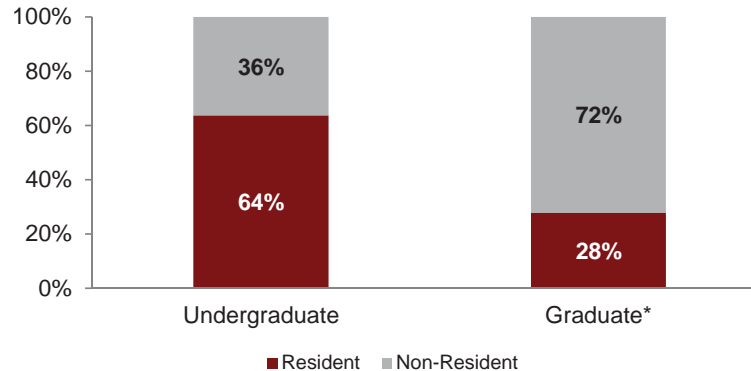

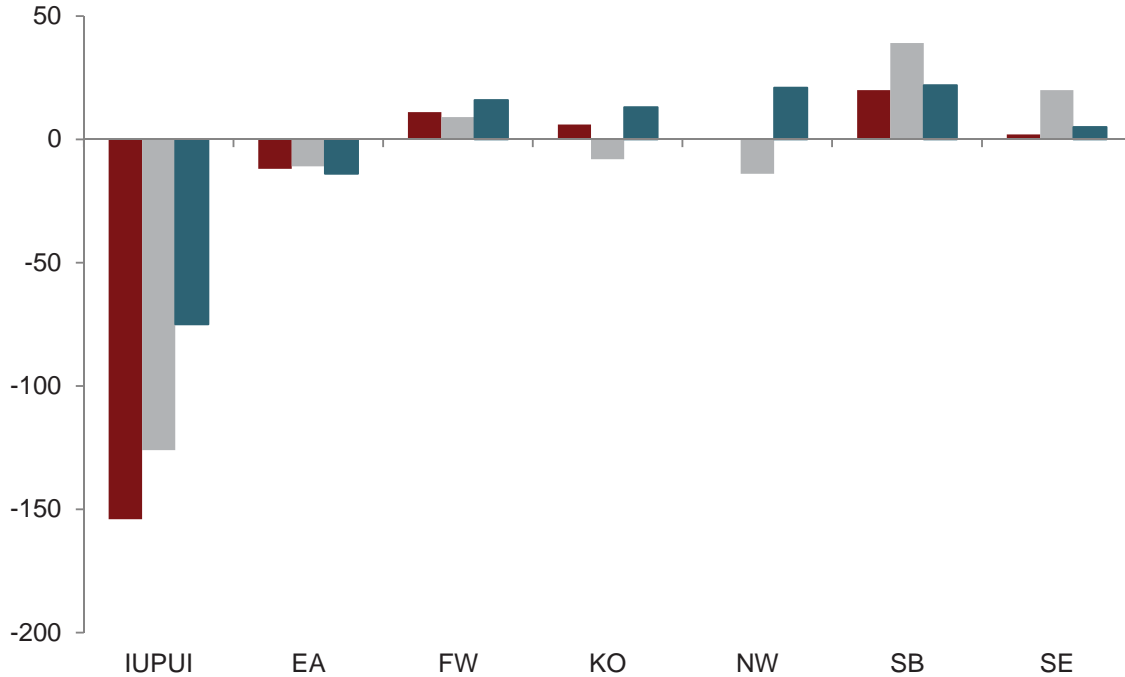

■ 2008 ■ 2009 ■ 2010



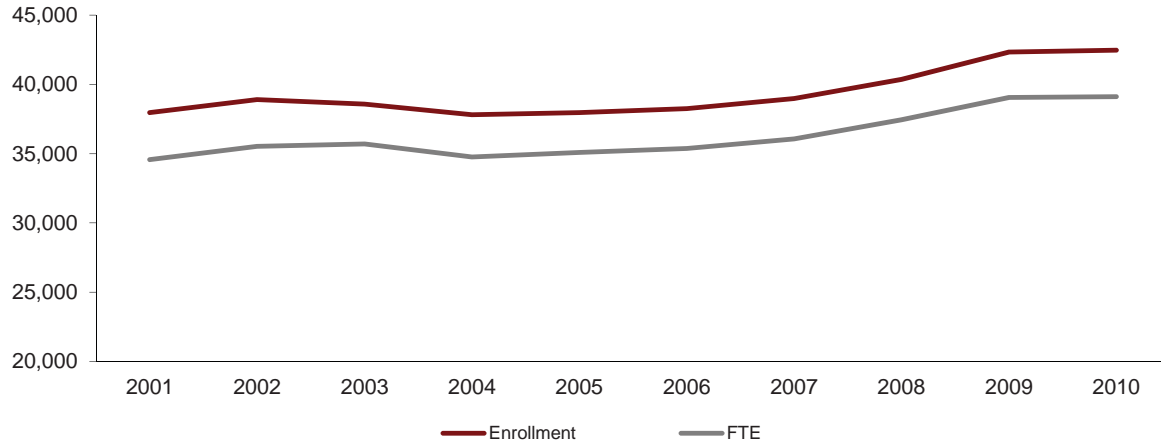

Historical Enrollment and FTE, Fall 2001 - Fall 2010



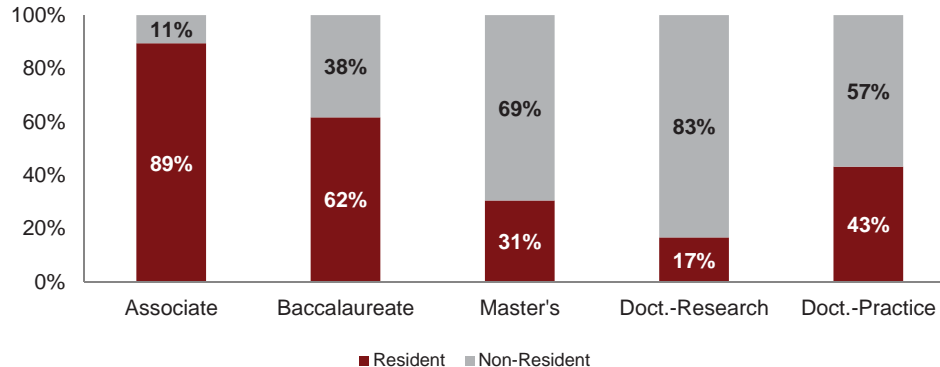

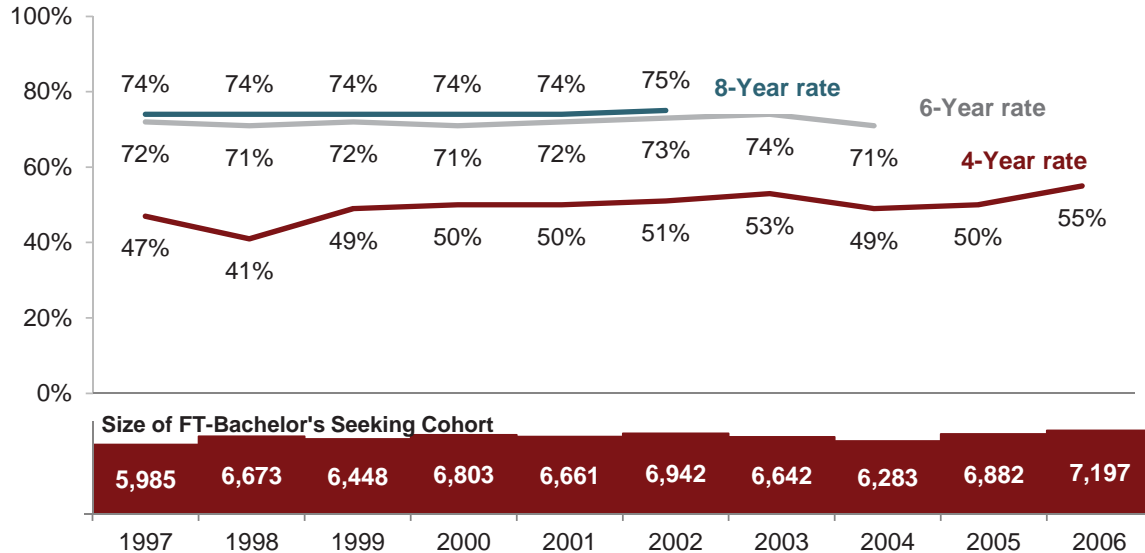

#### Distribution of Residency Status within Degree Level



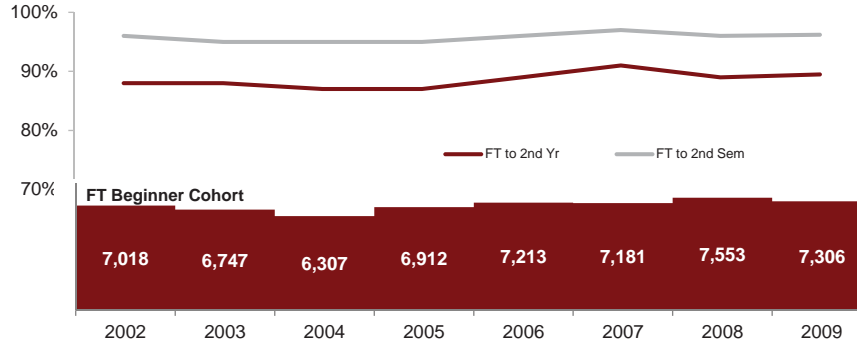


### Graduation Rates of Bachelor's Seeking Students Receiving Bachelor's Degrees Bloomington 1997 through 2006

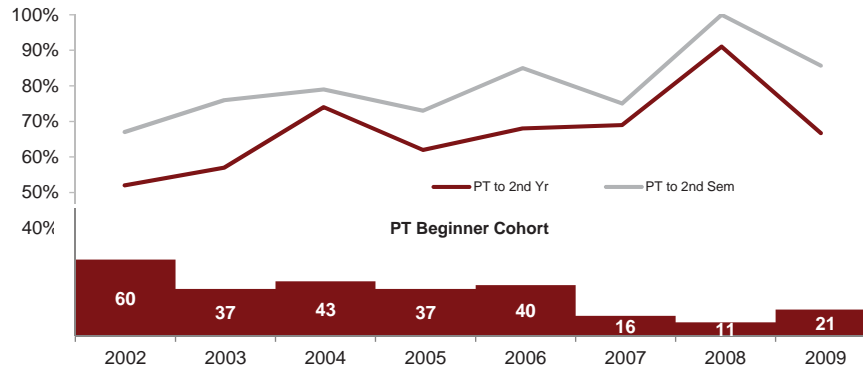




### Bloomington Full-Time Beginner Retention Rates to Second Semester & Year Fall 2002 through Fall 2009



### Part-Time Beginner Retention Rates to Second Semester & Year Fall 2002 through Fall 2009

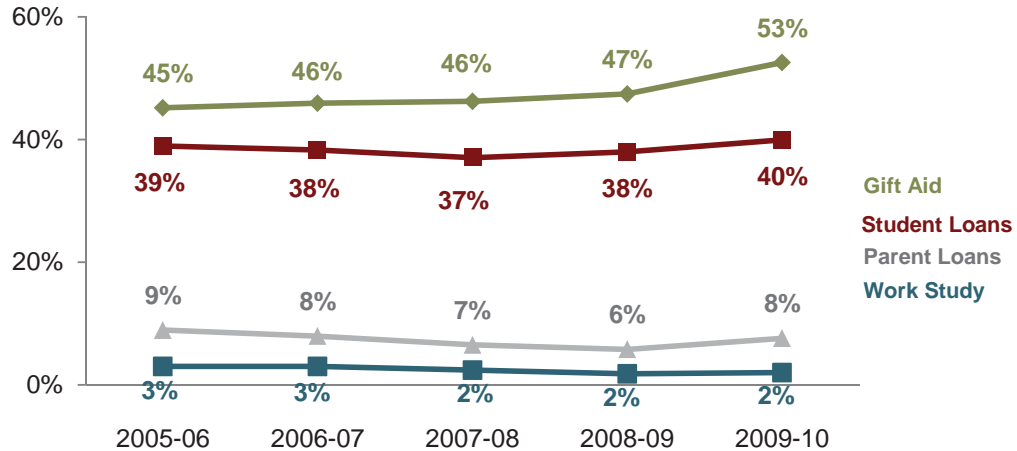

#### Percentage Receiving Aid by Type



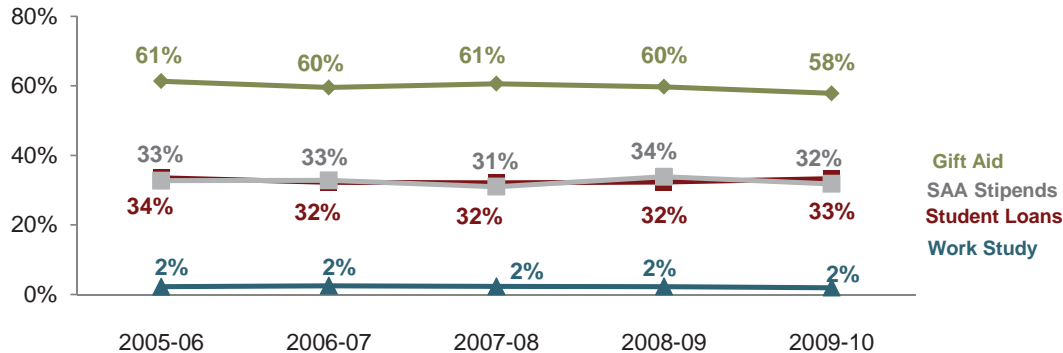

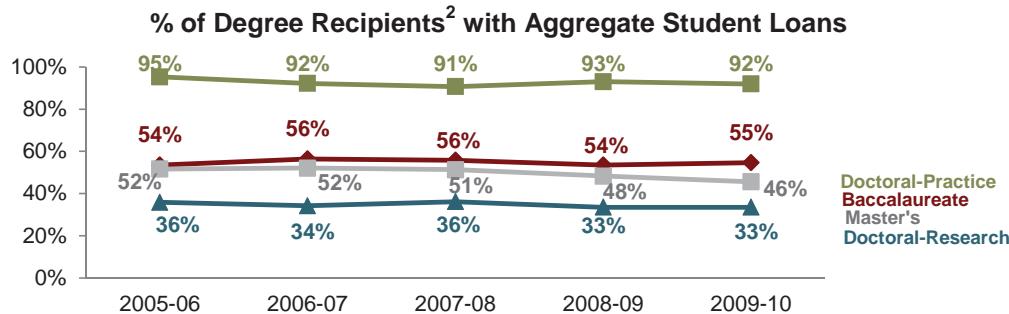

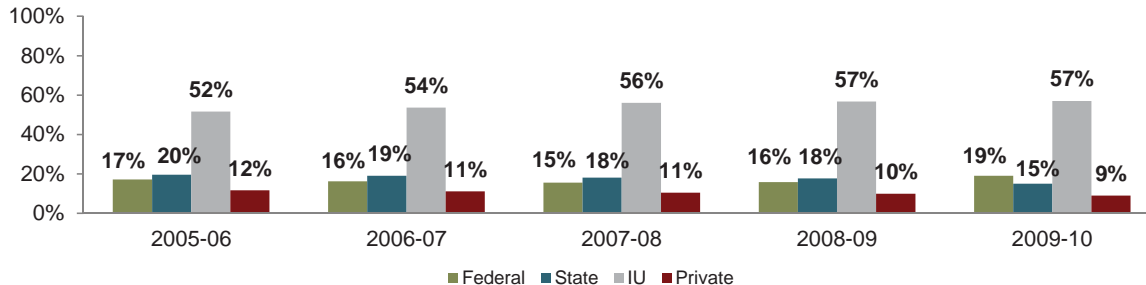

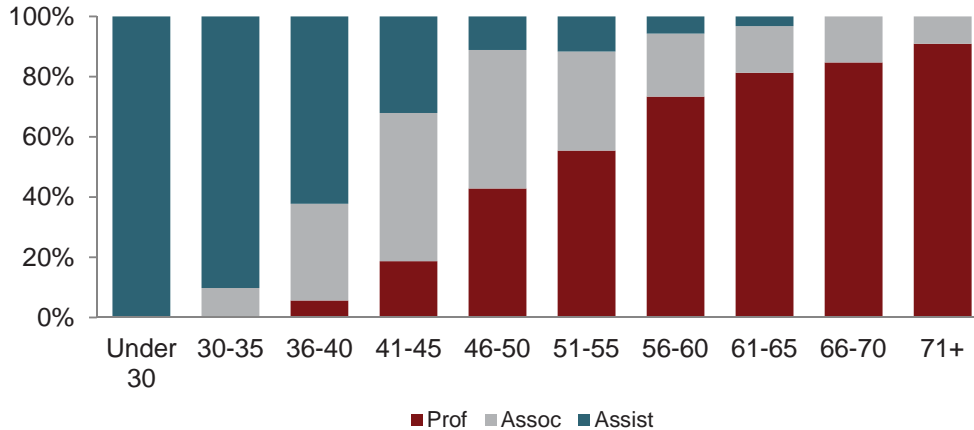


## Average Age and Age Distribution Bloomington - Fall 2010

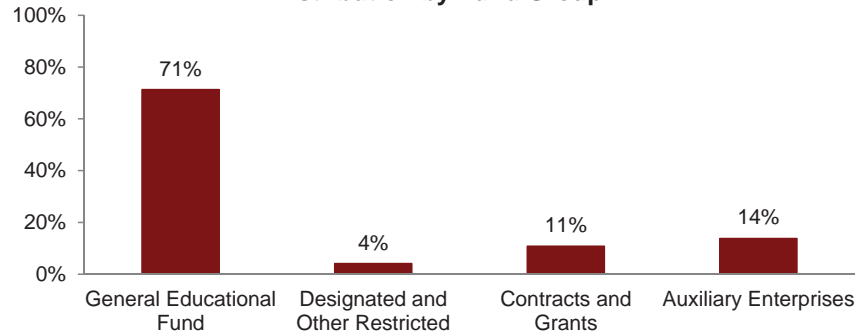

Distribution by Fund Group**

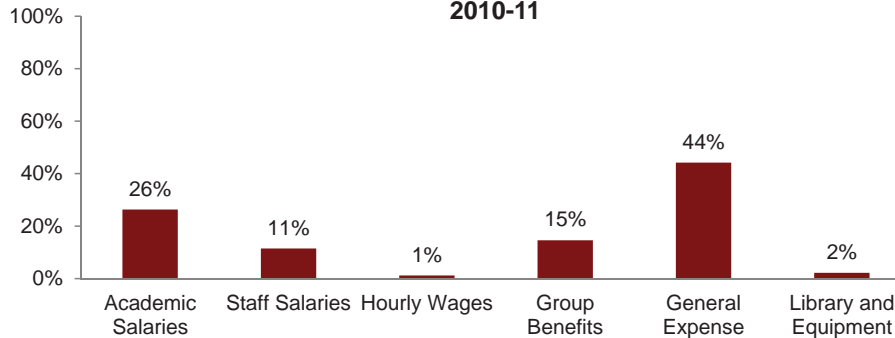

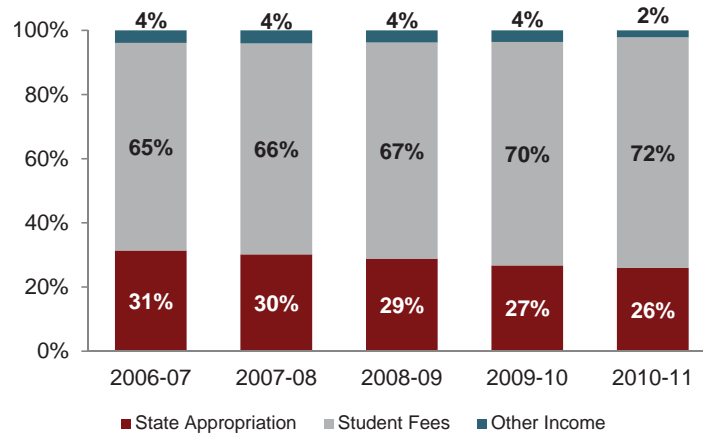

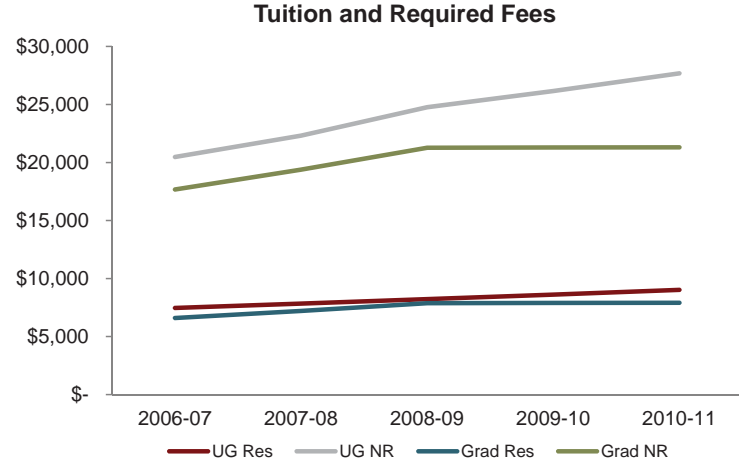
