Neil Thomas Goalkeeper – Known as 'Tomo'. Ex Merthyr and Carmarthen Town where he played in Eurpoe on numerous occasions. One of the most consistent keepers in the Welsh Premier Division. Experienced, great organiser and distributes the ball so well.

Scott Hayward Defender – Strong defender, signed from Cambrian in the summer. Can also play centrally. Great engine, loves to get forward from full back.

Dale Otten Defender – Dale was with the Swan's as a youngster, then signed for Llanelli for a season. Caught the eye playing for Pontardawe last season. Great left foot and loves the banter too!

John Meacock Defender (Captain) – John has been one of the most consistent defenders in Welsh League over the last ten years. Reads the game well. Pacey and his distribution from the back is second to none. Signed from Goytre United in the summer.

Mark Sage Manager – Started Welsh League at Garw AFC followed by Maesteg Park before joining Bridgend Town winning Welsh League Div 2. Went back to Garw, in the same side as Darren Lyons in Garw's most successful period. Went on to manage Bettws, taking them from the bottom of Div 2 to Div 2 champions and then finishing fourth in 1st Divisoin.

Darren Lyons Assistant Manager – Strong, committed, honest player. Started with Porthcawl then joined Garw AFC and then to Goytre United where he captained through their most successful period. His first position in managerial duties.

Van Jenkins Physio – Great infectious character. Signed from Bettws in the summer, he had been doing the job for more than 10 years. Vocal and great presence at club.

BRIEF HISTORY OF BRIDGEND TOWN

Bridgend was formed in the early 1920s and joined the Welsh section of the Southern League in the 1922 -23 season. But after three seasons during which they finished 6th 13th and 4th, they left that league and disbanded.

They did not start up again until the early 1960s. In the 1962 -63 season they joined the Welsh League and became Division 2 East Champions in their first campaign. From then on there was a very successful period in the club's history. In 1968 - 69 Bridgend were crowned Welsh league champions and won the title for the second time four seasons later. By that time their name had changed to Everwarm as the Bridgend central heating company were their main sponsors.

In the 1976 -77 season, the name reverted to Bridgend Town and they reached the semi-finals of the Welsh Cup only narrowly losing to Cardiff City. They were also runners up in the Welsh League that season. In 1977-78 the club rejoined the Southern league and were runners up in Division 1 North being promoted to the Premier Division.

In 1978 -79 the league was reorganised and they were in the Midlands Division which they won and became overall Southern League champions after beating Dorchester 5 -1 in the play offs. This was their proudest moment.

In 1983 -84 they left the Southern League and concentrated on the Welsh League becoming runners up two seasons running.

Since then, they have been relegated to Division 2 on two occasions. The first time they bounced back as champions and were promoted to Division 1, where they stayed as a mid table side until 2001 -02 when they were relegated again.

In the following season, under the guidance of Francis Ford and Cohen Griffiths, they regained their Division 1 status, narrowly missing out on the runners up spot on goal difference.

Over the following two seasons Francis and Cohen restored pride back into the Bridgend club when they took them to 10th and 7th place respectively.

The 2005 -06 season started off poorly and as the club had League of Wales aspirations it was decided a change of management should take place and Nicky Tucker (ex Llanelli) was appointed with Drewe Phillips (ex Garw) as his assistant.

Unfortunately this did not have the desired affect and it was decided by mutual agreement that Nicky Tucker should stand down. Drewe Phillips was given the position of manager and Ryland Morgan, who has a top FIFA coaching qualification, was appointed as team coach. This partnership proved successful as the team climbed up from the lower reaches of the division to a respectable 6th place.

When we left Coychurch Road in 2006 we relocated to Locks Lane, Porthcawl for 2007 -08. Unfortunately this arrangement did not meet with the approval of the residents despite the fact that we would have left them with a brand new clubhouse.

We moved to brand new facility with an excellent playing surface at The University of Glamorgan Playing fields for 2008/9. & 2009/10 seasons. We have completed the circle by playing at The Brewery Field, (Bridgend's Rugby Stadium) which is being revamped and will be host to both Bridgend Town and the Bridgend Ravens.

We are also upgrading the social facilities as our intention is that the clubhouse is a focal point for several different sports in Bridgend.
