California High School Exit Exam

All tenth graders will be taking the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) for the first time on March 15 and 16. Since there are no makeup opportunities until May, it is critical that all tenth graders attend! The Language Arts sections will be given in a morning and afternoon pull-out on March 15 from 9:00-2:20. The two sections of the Mathematics section will be administered on March 16 from 9:30-2:20. Passing the CAHSEE is a requirement in order to receive a diploma for the Class of 2007. The Preuss School Classes of 2005 and 2006 established a stellar reputation for earning among the top passing rates in the state. The results will be available by July 2005.

Course Selection for 2005-2006 for All Grades

On March 2 or 3 all students were given course selection materials in their Advisory classes. Parents will be particularly interested in the *Course Description and Educational Planning 2005-2006* booklet, which contains a detailed description of each course in grades 6-12. The Advisory teacher shared an important presentation about UC eligibility, requirements for a Preuss diploma, available courses, and the process for securing courses for next year. Students will get signatures from math and Spanish teachers March 7-9, verifying their recommendations for advancing to the next level. *Current achievement will determine whether or not the student progresses onto the next course, or even on to the next grade.* Completed cards will be due to the Advisory teacher no later than March 11. Students who do not return a completed card with parent and Advisory teacher signatures, will not receive first-choice electives. Please help your student complete the process on time.

AP Test Orders and Payment Due by March 11

It's time to order the Advanced Placement (AP) examinations for our students who are enrolled in one or more AP classes! <u>All students are required to take the AP test!</u> Your student received a portfolio with all the ordering resources and the fee structure for this year. Full payment (cash or money order only) for exams is due according to the following schedule:

Grade 9 March 8

Grade 10 March 8 and 9
Grade 11 March 9 and 10

Grade 12 March 10 and 11

Students who are absent or late to school will not be able to take the test. <u>No refund will be given</u>. This is a standard AP policy. We will be giving the following tests this year.
