Joint Professional Military Education (JPME)

Officer Joint PME is based on educational requirements specified in the OPMEP and mandated by the Goldwater-Nichols Defense Reorganization Act of 1986 (established by the Skelton Committee on Armed Services in 1989). Recently, Enlisted Joint PME has been established, but unlike Officer JPME, it is not currently based on requirements as it is an initial attempt to coordinate (recommend) an Enlisted JPME continuum amongst the Services.

Officer JPME consists of five levels: Pre-commissioning, Primary, Intermediate, Senior, General/Flag Officer (G/FO). Of the five levels, JPME requirements begin at the Intermediate (major/O-4) level where JPME Phase I credit is available by completing a Service Command & Staff College (resident or non-resident). The Services' War Colleges are now JPME Phase II accredited. National Defense University's (NDU) Joint Forces Staff College (JFSC) 10-week Joint and Combined Warfighting School (JCWS) is JPME II accredited. NDU also operates three Single-Phase JPME courses which grant the equivalent of JPME I and II in a single course (listed below).

<u>USMC Joint Officer Management (JOM)-</u> M&RA/MMOA has a JOM section that is responsible for the overall administration and oversight of Joint Officer Management (JOM) and Joint Duty Assignments (JDA's) for the Marine Corps. JPME is only a portion/prerequisite of Joint Officer Management (JOM). Joint credit or Joint Duty Assignment is the other components required to become a Joint Qualified Officer (JQO). Requirements to become a JQO are defined in the Joint Qualification System (JQS) and can be found on the JOM website. <u>M&RA JOM Website</u>

Educational Requirements for Joint Qualified Officers- To satisfy the educational prerequisites for JQO nominee designation, officers must receive credit for completing a CJCS-certified or accredited program of JPME. Paths for satisfying the educational requirements for JQO nominee designation can *generally* be accomplished by:

- a. An officer completes JPME Phase I at a Service ILC (resident or non-resident). This is followed by completion of JPME Phase II at a Service SLC (resident only) or at <u>JCWS</u> (10 week course).
 - b. An officer completes <u>NWC</u>, <u>ICAF</u>, or <u>JAWS</u> (Single-Phase JPME courses).

<u>Statutory Educational Requirements-</u> Are based on <u>title 10, US Code, chapter 38.</u>

Educational Requirements for Joint Duty Assignments Reserve (JDA-R)- To the extent practical, Reserve officers on the DOD RASL will complete the appropriate level of educational requirements before assignment to a JDA-R billet. Positions will be validated and documented to identify positions that require no JPME, those that require JPME Phase I and those that require AJPME. Officers in critical JDA-R billets will complete AJPME before assignment, where practicable. Additional guidance concerning Reserve officer joint officer management can be found in DODI 1215.20.
