

Bookmaking odds: Robespierre, even money; Riley, 4 to 1; Bill Letcher, 5 to 1; Prince Fonso, 5 to 1; Palisade, 8 to 1; Outlook, 10 to 1.

No auction pools or mutuels sold at track after 1889 until 1908. However, auction pools sold in 1890, 1891 and for years thereafter in downtown

Louisville, on night before, and morning of Derby.

\$2,500 added. Net to winner \$5,460; second \$300; third \$150.

BILL LETCHER broke in front with PALISADE in close pursuit. ROBESPIERRE forged to the lead nearing the first turn. After a half RILEY and PALISADE had taken over second and third places. After three-quarters it was RILEY, ROBESPIERRE and BILL LETCHER. RILEY went on to win by 1 <sup>34</sup> lengths and 2 lengths separated BILL LETCHER and ROBESPIERRE. 115 nominations.
