In parallel with the professional awards, the chapter recognised future talent through the Noel Hill Student Travel Awards Programme. Entries are sought from students currently enrolled in UK universities for a portfolio of their work and a proposal for study/travel experience abroad. This year a single award was given to Mark Kelly, Mackintosh School of Architecture, Glasgow. Mark will be using the £1500 prize to travel to Tibet to study traditional building technologies and assist with construction projects in a remote village.
