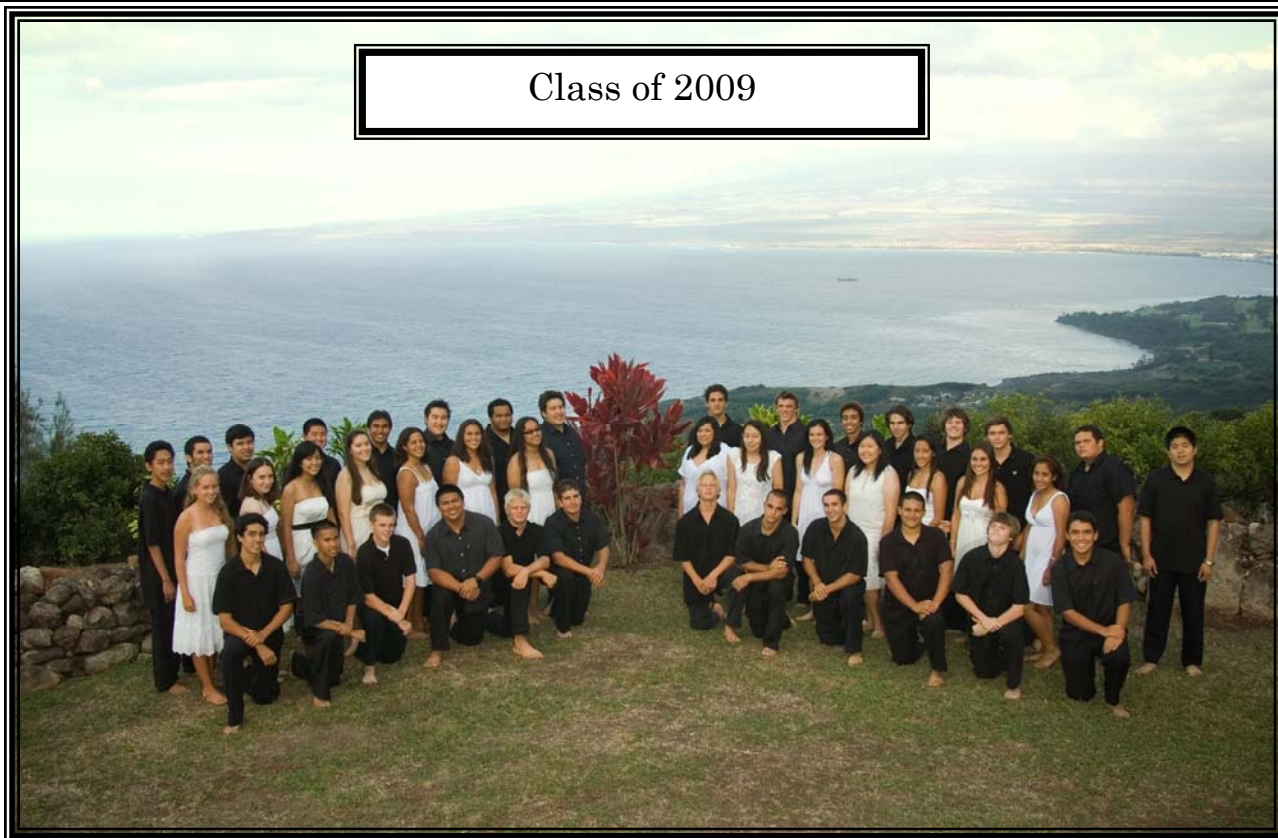

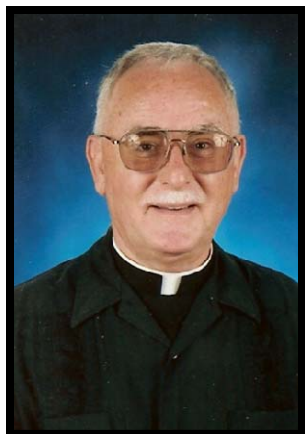

We really hope you can come to the annual Ho'olaulea celebration on June 27<sup>th</sup> to get completely caught up on the latest news and separate fact from rumor! The Class of '59 – our Golden Anniversary Class – will take their place of honor in the Alumni Hall of Fame. The Class of '69 -- our first co-ed class – will be out in force to celebrate the year of their 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Good fellowship, good food and entertainment --- don't want to miss out !

## St. Anthony boosts *TWO* Flyin' Hawaiians...

### THE PILOT

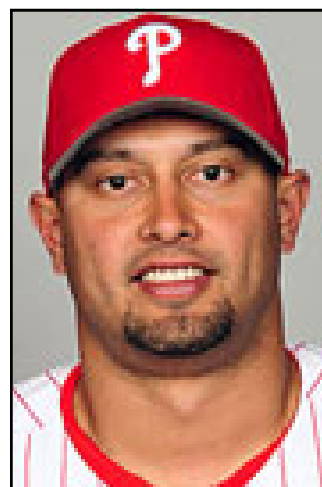

Mr. Nobriga, *the Flyin' Hawaiian*, was extraordinary to the point of becoming a legend. He was always calm, cool and collected. Soft spoken and deliberate in all he did. A true gentleman. He liked to wear leather flight gloves when he flew and wore clean, well-tailored uniforms. The most extraordinary occasion I can recall while flying with Mr. Nobriga was capturing a fleeing Viet Cong. When the VC broke across the rice paddy, Mr. Nobriga gave us strict orders not to fire a shot. We came in low and hot, banking so severely I thought our rotor blades were going into the ground. The nearly vertical rotor plane cut right in front of Charlie who was now backpedaling as fast as he could in the mud of the rice paddy. After getting solid footing, he took off in another direction, and Mr. Nobriga gave it full cyclic forward, swooping down for another pass. The ground was so close I found myself pushing back, as if that would give us more room between the tip of the rotor plane and the rice paddy. We may have made another 4 or 5 passes in the same manner...all of us hanging on for dear life as Mr. Nobriga deftly guided 440 through more swooping turns and banks, as a maestro would play a Stradivarius in Carnegie Hall. The now panting figure in black pajamas finally stopped, threw up both arms and remained still. Tropic Lightning ground troops who had lined up on the dikes of the rice paddy to watch this amazing performance, rose to their feet to give us (Mr. Nobriga) a standing ovation.

*After my year in Viet Nam, I was assigned to an Air Cav outfit in Ansbach, Germany. On one of our flights close to the Czech border, I bumped into Mr. Nobriga again at some obscure airfield. We were both surprised to see one another, but before I could say "how ya been", Mr. Nobriga grabbed me by the arm and took me into the pilots lounge and presented me to the group. "O.K. Frye, tell them about how we rounded up that VC". Evidently this "story" had preceded Mr. Nobriga, and all of the pilots in the room were skeptical that such an event ever happened. I recanted my recollection as Mr. Nobriga took it all in...arms folded and eyes flashing as we all re-lived that incredible event.*

## THE BASEBALL PLAYER

Victorino was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in 1999 in the sixth round of the 1999 amateur draft out of St. Anthony High School in Wailuku, Hawaii. He spent most of the 1999 through 2005 seasons in the minor leagues.

Victorino obtained the nicknames "**The Flyin' Hawaiian**" and "The Pineapple Express" because of his island heritage and great speed.

Victorino became a starting player when he replaced Bobby Abreu, who was traded to the New York Yankees midway through the 2006 season, in right field. He then replaced Aaron Rowand who left by free agency to the Giants, in center field.

On June 3, 2007 the Phillies celebrated "Shane Victorino Day" with Victorino hula figurines, and flew his father in from Maui for the game. Victorino ended the day's game with a walk-off home run in the bottom of the ninth against the San Francisco Giants. ( *Shane Victorino—Wikipedia—the free encyclopedia*).

In the 2008, Shane was honored with the NL Gold Glove (OF) and played on the US team at the Olympic Games. He continues to excel in his career with the Philadelphia Phillies and has several stats high on the list in the NL.

Shane was also instrumental in the MLB Players Trust/Volunteers of America contacting St. Anthony Junior-Senior High School's Student Activities to office to be a part of a nationwide association dedicated to community service. A group of ten students "ACTION TEAM CAPTAINS" coordinate two major community volunteer projects a year. St. Anthony did so well this year that the school was featured in the Wall Street Journal Classroom Edition March 2009 issue. One of our school's Team Captains was also featured as the Team Captain of the Month. Thank you Shane for thinking of your alma mater. The MLB Players Trust through the "Action Team" honored one of our seniors, Kristen Orth, with a \$1,000 scholarship to further her education.

#### **A Few Tips For Going Green**

1. Use cloth instead of paper towels and paper napkins. Not only are paper towels and napkins expensive in the long run, they don't work as well as their cloth counterparts.
2. Use stainless steel or cast iron pots and pans. The debate about the dangers of teflon coated pots and pans still rages on. Our parents and grandparents knew that nothing could beat a cast iron skillet. The best chefs in the world also cook with stainless steel and cast iron.
3. Eat more fresh fruits and raw vegetables that are grown locally. Not only are these fresher and tastier--because you don't have to turn on your stove/oven to prepare them, you're saving energy.
4. Change out your old light bulbs to energy efficient light bulbs. Doing this throughout your house will make a big difference in your monthly electric bill, and they last for several years before needing to be replaced.
5. Use environmentally friendly household cleaners like baking soda and white vinegar. They will not harm you or the environment, and they cost much, much less than the fancy packaged chemical-based cleaners. Baking soda and vinegar can also do double duty--baking soda can be used as a body scrub to remove dry, scaling skin; and you can use vinegar for the dressing on the salads you will be eating more of (see Tip #3).
6. Stop the bottled water habit. FDA and EPA reports show that bottled water is just as polluted as tap water--and bottled water even has less restrictions than water from the tap. 7. Reduce, reuse, recycle. Do you really need another pair of \$100 shoes? Do the other 50 pairs in your closet really need another pair to keep them company?
