Grammar

- To help the teacher understand some basic concepts in grammar such as notions of appropriateness, usage, correctness, etc
- To create in the teacher an urge for proficiency development
- To create in the secondary school teacher an awareness of grammar with special emphasis on some areas in grammar viz.:

a. Tense and Time

b. Modal Verbs

c. Form and functions of sentence element

d. Passive Voice

e. Relative clauses

f. Reported speech

- To create in the teacher an awareness of support materials for teaching grammar
- To expose the teacher to various different tasks for teaching grammar topics
- To make the teacher aware of the common mistakes committed by learners and good reference grammar

Speaking

- Mainly focus on two broad areas:
 - i. Sound patterns:-


The section on sound patterns highlights the distinctive sounds of English and offers practice in them.

ii. Communication:-

The section on communication discusses certain selected functions in formal and informal situations.

Procedures for telephone Conversation, group discussions and making short speeches are delineated.

Pronunciation Games are used to train participants in the sound of English.



Writing

To use language without anxiety or self-consciousness

To write in a communicative situation

To use ice-breakers in class, and demonstrates the needs and qualities of ice-breakers through actual use.

To think about the early stages of writing
