FROM THE RABBI

DEDICATION, REDEDICATION & PHILANTHROPY

Chanukah in translation has been defined in many ways. It is a reminder that Chanu B'Chaf Hay, they (the Maccabees) rested on the 25th of Kislev, from the war against the Syrian-Greeks. Also the word Chinuch "education", is derived from the word Chanukah. The word Chanukah also means "dedication", or perhaps in this usage "re-dedication", because the Hasmonean priests (Kohanim) cleansed, purified and rededicated the Holy Temple for Service (Avodah) to HaShem. After the Jews returned to Jerusalem they found the Bait HaMikdash had been defiled by the Yevanim, the Syrian-Greeks.

"Dedication" is a word which connotes commitment. In this case, *commitment* can be explained as something that was so important and valuable, that there were those who were willing to fight to protect and defend it, even if it came to sacrificing their lives. That commitment was to G-d's Torah and *Mitzvot*. The Torah and *Mitzvot*, the observance and the heritage of Judaism were more important to the Hasmoneans than their very lives.

In Cheshvan (November) our synagogue and community lost a beloved supporter of Jewish life and Torah, Jewish education and Israel. His name is George Davidson.

George was always a major part of Etz Chayim and before that, B'nai Jacob. He was a quiet leader who always put his shul and his community before others. George was a true philanthropist. It's not that he considered that which he gave to so many institutions, which was a great deal, as a gift. He considered it a *Chiyuv*, an obligation and responsibility.

Once the great financier and contributor to Jewish causes and Palestine (pre-State-of Israel), Sir Moses Montifiore, of Great Britain, was asked a question. "Sir Moses", he was queried, "How much are you worth?" The great man thought a few seconds and answered, "I would say at this time I am worth about 80,000 English pounds." The man looked skeptical. "What is the matter?", Montifiore asked. "Well, to tell you the truth, I was disappointed to hear that. I was told you were worth millions of English pounds sterling." "Sir", said Sir Moses, "You asked how much I was worth? So far this year I have given approximately 80,000 British pounds. As far as I am concerned said the great Jew, G-d has let me amass a fortune worth millions. I, however, am worth what I give—not what I have."

George: leader, role-model, participant of shul events and community causes, supporter of Israel, gave so much, too much to be called simply a "contributor". He was the greatest definition of the word: philanthropist. George supported what was he considered G-d's causes. He <u>was</u> the definition of what that word means.

George Davidson was PRICELESS—and we will miss him. Let us <u>re</u>dedicate ourselves and our resources to worthy causes in recognition of what Mr. Davidson did. Let us strive to be "worth" a great deal, according to Sir Moses' definition. Our worth is not what we have, but what we give.

Shalom, George. Rest in peace, dear Shemuel Yosef ben Yehuda Chayim. Rest in peace.

NOTES FROM THE CANTOR

British historian and moralist Lord Acton once said, "Power tends to corrupt. Absolute power tends to corrupt absolutely". I suppose most would think these strange words with which to begin an article about Chanukah, but a closer examination of the era brings the quotation into focus.

Prior to the rebellion against the Syrian-Greeks led by the Maccabees, two distinct families had leadership roles in Israel. The Kohanim, descendants of Aaron, were in charge of the service in the

Beit Hamikdash. They were the religious heads. Descendants of David, however, were always the political leaders. All of that changed at the time of Chanukah. With the victory of the Hasmoneans these two offices were combined. The Macabees, who were from the family of high priests, also now assumed the position of King of Israel. Unfortunately this arrangement did not work out very well, and the situation worsened after a relatively short time. Rome soon came in and took over, and unfortunately we are still suffering from the events of that era.

This Chanukah, may we learn all the lessons that the holiday has to teach us.


