# President's Message

With this issue of KOL Ezras Israel my



latest (and last) term as the shul's President comes to an end. With your indulgence, I am using my "lame duck" status to reflect on where our shul has been, where it is going

and hopefully, with Hashem's help and all of your participation, where it is going. I am writing this the evening after our Fourth Annual Dinner where we honored the Kliksbergs for their lifetime of service to the Latin American Jewish Community, we raised a little money to help with the shul's expenses and where we all had a wonderful time. The overwhelming sentiment of the evening was that our shul is a special, warm and embracing place. For lack of any better descriptions, Rabbi Groner (Z"L) called it the "shul of your childhood" because it made you feel at home; where you can daven like (and with) your parents no matter how observant you are. The Rabbi conveys a sense of Torah learning, not unlike the kind you felt while growing up. He brings you into his reassuring inner circle even if your religious knowledge and practice is not great today, with his and the shul's help and a little effort on your p art you too can achieve spiritual selfactualization as a Torah observant Jew. Some of the people who came to and through our shul have in fact gone through that transformation. Thanks to Ben Beroukhim who in addition to continuing as the shul's web master, will also assume the role of Financial Secretary. A special thanks to Ilene Van Houter for continuing to serve the important function of Recording Secretary, while also working to help the shul in may other areas. My thanks to Sheldon for agreeing to assume the leadership responsibility, and a special welcome and thanks to Itzhak Goldberg for agreeing to serve on the Board for the first time and seeking ways to help the shul with Programming and finally, thank you to Manny Zymelman for agreeing to resume serving on the Board after a few years absence.
