### **Baddesley Clinton**

Rising Lane, Baddesley Clinton, Knowle, Solihull, B93 oDQ (Signed 1 mile West of A4141)

This is a moated manor house, dating from the 15th century, it has delightful walled gardens, with stewponds used to provide fish for the household in mediaeval times. There is also a lake, a woodland walk and wildflower meadows. There is on-going work to develop the vegetable garden.

### **Barton House**

Barton on the Heath, Moreton-in-Marsh, GL56 oPJ (2 miles West of Long Compton; 2 miles off A3400 Stratford-upon-Avon to Oxford road; 1.25 miles off Chipping Norton to Moreton-in-Marsh road.)

6 acres of gardens surround this delightful manor house designed by Inigo Jones. (House not open). There are mature trees, azaleas, species and hybrid rhododendrons, magnolias, and tree peonies. There is a Victorian kitchen garden. The creation of a Japanese garden, catalpa walk, rose garden, and a secret garden containing many rare and exotic plants demonstrate the creativity to be found here and that continues. The Vineyard was planted in 2000, while the exotic garden with its palm, cypresses and olive trees was established in 2002.

# **Compton Verney House Trust**

Compton Verney, Warwickshire, CV35 9HZ (9 miles East of Stratfordupon-Avon on the B4086 between Wellesbourne and Kineton; 6 miles from the M40, Junction 12.)

A Grade I mansion designed by Robert Adam in the 1760's, Compton Verney is set in more than 120 acres of classical parkland landscaped by Lancelot 'Capability' Brown, now listed as Grade II\*. Like the mansion, the grounds had become semi-derelict in the 1980's. Rescued and restored by the Peter Moores Foundation, Compton Verney had discovered a new lease of life. Today the house is a gallery of international standard and the grounds are coming back to life too. The 'pleasure grounds' still reflect the sweeping parkland, ornamental lakes and Cedars of Lebanon associated with Brown and there is an extensive recovery and replanting programme in hand. The landscape is used to present artists' projects, outdoor film screenings and concerts associated with the gallery's exhibitions. A good plan of the grounds and their important features and trees can be downloaded from the website.

### **Hill Close Victorian Gardens**

Warwick (Behind Linen Street in Warwick)

Hill Close Victorian Gardens are a rare survival of something which was very common in the last century: a group of hedged gard enjoyed by the shopkeepers and professional people who lived over their businesses in the town centre and so had little or no gar privacy and shelter, and many of them had a summer house at the higher end from which there was a view out over the Common to relax, enjoy their lawns and flower beds, make tea or a meal, and cultivate their fruit and vegetables. Most such gardens were s Gardens themselves were acquired by Warwick District Council with the intention of building on them. However, their historical summer houses are now listed buildings, and the gardens have been registered as of exceptional national importance.

# **Kenilworth Castle**

With its imposing Norman keep, Tudor gardens and John of Gaunt's Great Hall, Kenilworth is the largest ruined castle in Englarglories, pleasures and rebellions. It also offers stunning views over the countryside and features the site of a restored renaissance remains of Henry V's Pleasaunce (1417).

### **Packwood House**

Grove Road, Lapworth, Solihull, B94 6AT (Signed from the A340, 2 miles East of Hockley Heath).

This house and its setting, for many years home to the Fetherstones, is notable for the intact layout of the gardens dating from the 16th and 17th centuries. There are courtyards, terraces and gazebos, a sunken garden and the unique and justly famous yew garden. The last Fetherstone squire of Packwood died in 1876 and the Ash family acquired the house in 1904. Inherited by Graham Baron Ash in 1925, he set about painstaking and exquisite restoration of the house and gardens. Very tranquil, the gardens are a marvellous blend of the Carolean gardens of the 17th century and the lavish planting style of the country house created by Baron Ash that reflects the great days of the house in the 1920's.

# **Ragley Hall**

Alcester, Warwickshire, B49 5NJ (8 miles West of Stratford-upon-Avon, 2 miles from Alcester off A46/A435)

Ragley Hall sits on a hilltop with its gardens and estate surrounding it as far as the eye can see. 27 acres of gardens include an enchanting formal rose garden, the Mead - a wildflower meadow - and the Fountain Garden, with good borders and lovely mature trees. There is also a bog garden and a 'secret' garden. The Jerwood Foundation's collection of modern sculpture is now installed throughout the gardens. The 400 acres of beautiful parkland was landscaped by 'Capability' Brown in the 18th century. There is always something to see here in any season.
