

# Showhouse Showstopper: Georgian Heights

t's been called the most breathtaking Showhouse property ever made available to the JLMN.

Georgian Heights, a turn-of-thecentury mansion, located at 99 Lloyd Road, is the Montclair home of Michael and Jean Strahan. Mr. Strahan is the star Defensive End for the NY Giants Football Team and is the NFL Sack Record holder. In addition to generously loaning us their home for three months, Mr. and Mrs. Strahan will act as honorary chairs of Georgian Heights Showhouse and Gardens and will assist with Showhouse publicity during the next eight months. We officially kick-off on Sept 30th when several hundred renowned New Jersev

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and New York City designers attend an open house there. The grounds and house will be open to the public during the month of May 2003.

eorgian Heights boasts 28 rooms, a carriage house, stunning panoramic views of the ecstatic about this house and we know the general membership will feel the same way. By May of 2003, we'll be ready to welcome the more than 15,000 people expected to visit Georgian Heights. This will make a substantial financial impact on

Children at Risk in our community as well as for HomeCorp."

HomeCorp is a designated recipient of a portion of the proceeds from the Showhouse, as voted by the JLMN general membership in June. This Montclair based affordable housing agency was established in 1988 and to date



has helped low income families realize the dream of home ownership. "We are very excited about the upcoming collaboration and we hope that the result will continue to preserve affordable

housing in Montclair. This is the true spirit of Montclair helping Montclair," says Beverly Riddick, HomeCorp Executive Director.

The JLMN will take over the house at the end of February. At that point, designers and

The Placement/Nominating Committee is happy to announce the addition of Linda Wolf as Advisor. Linda will replace Catherine Halbert who resigned from the position last month. We are thrilled to have Linda on the Placement/Nominating team.

Enclosed in this issue of the Postmark are 3 extremely important forms: The JLMN Straw Ballot, The JLMN Self-Submit Form, and the JLMN Leadership Questionnaire.

These forms give you an opportunity to help the Placement/Nominating Committee chart the future of the JLMN. We use the Straw Ballots, and Self-Submit forms we receive to begin the Nominating process. Your diligence in filling out these forms, along with the information you provide during your Placement Interview and future discussions with your Advisor, all provide the Nominating Committee with the necessary information needed to slate a strong and balanced Board for next year.

The JLMN Leadership Questionnaire is a new component to the Nominating Process this year. This Questionnaire, which is used by other Leagues around the country, will be yet another indicator used by the Committee to help decide the Leadership slate for next year. All League members interested in Leadership roles for next year will be required to fill-out this form. When deciding the slate for next year, the Committee will evaluate candidates using a set of Competencies (provided by AJLI), an Evaluation of Skills (developed by JLMN Nominating Committee), and the JLMN Leadership Questionnaire. These indicators will insure that each JLMN Member is evaluated fairly and that we identify those Members who are best suited to govern our League.

cross the country, Junior League's are adopting this new logo and tag line. The objective of which is to create a national identity a brand that is recognized in the same way as other organizations such as the Girl Scouts, the American Red Cross and even corporations and products such as Citigroup, Coca Cola and AOL are. At the direction of the member Junior Leagues, the Association of Junior League's International (AJLI) is in the process of developing a comprehensive marketing campaign. The creation of the tag line and logo are the first step in that process.

Extensive research was undertaken directly with a variety of Leagues to ensure that the newly developed logo and tag line would accurately

represent our collective organizations, while allowing individual League's to maintain their own identity. The result was the identification of several core attributes common to all Leagues: a focus on local communities, volunteer impact and women working together. The new tag line, Women Building Better Communities – is a direct outcome of this research. It clearly brings to mind community service, collaboration, and the impact of women.

dditional components of the marketing plan will provide us with the tools to communicate individual League accomplishments and promote our collective strengths. The next stage will be rolled out at the Fall Leadership Conference in October and will include televised Public Service Announcements, a brochures. In the spring, at Annual Conference, radio and print public service announcements, a press kit, and a general brochure will be launched. Ongoing support from AJLI will include public relations training and technical assistance, an AJLI Newsletter and an upgrade to the Association website.

The benefits of a common marketing program promoting our shared identity and the collective strength of 296 Leagues comprised of 195,000 women are tremendous. As we gain national recognition for our volunteer efforts, we have the potential to gain access

> to limited corporate dollars earmarked for philanthropic services that thousands of worthy organizations are vying for. We'll gain exposure to an untapped source of potential members. And, we'll have an

opportunity to communicate who we are and what we stand for - it will help us to shed an outdated image of the Junior League and tell the story we already know, that Junior League women build better communities!

So, how does this affect the JLMN? We will make the transition over a period of time, to manage the costs of adopting the new log and tag line and to ensure no unnecessary funds are spent. New stationary will be ordered when our current supplies run out, additional Blue Books will display the new look (existing books will not be replaced), and any other printed material will be replaced only as existing supplies are depleted. Going forward the JLMN logo will be discontinued. Anything that is printed from this point forward must carry the new logo - promotional items - tshirts, bags, notepads, invitations, etc. Any questions should be directed to Mary Jane O'Hare, Communications Vice President. Graphic standards are available from Jan at the League office.
