

Logan Library Annual Report 2009

Usage of the library continued to grow during 2009 with the circulation of materials increasing by 11% over the previous year.

The library staff along with the library board, with more than 18 months of effort, completed the updating and re-writing of the library's long range plan. The plan contains monitoring and updating procedures that allow for future growth and vision. This plan will serve as an on-going guide for the library for many years to come.

The library continues to analyze and develop its collections and services in order to ensure high quality resources for the public. Every effort is being made to reflect the changes in how the public uses the library, how technology provides access and resources, and what the expectations of the public for collections and services provided by the library should be.

During 2009 the library received grants to expand the Spanish collections, to add centralized printing for the general public, to purchase four computers specifically designed for young children, and six computers for young adults, and to purchase disc cleaning equipment to maintain the library's collections of CDs, DVDs, and CD-ROMs.




eLibrary Usage Statistics – 2009






Circulation by Neighborhood - 2009







Circulation by Logan Neighborhood - 2009




Reference Database Usage





Online Requests from Patrons for Materials




Total requests by destination:





Total requests by format:




- 1. Responses given to patrons have been standardized to eliminate confusion.

Highlights of the Year:


- 1. 1045 items were added to the Special Collections in 2009. Many of these are family genealogies.

- 4. The bound periodical collection has been removed from storage and will soon be available for patron use in the new Special Collections room.



Items Purchased





Types of Items Purchased







Graphic Novel Collection: Circulation Analysis

It has been 10 years since the Logan Library began collecting graphic novels (novel-length 'comics'), with just three series: the *Sandman* series by Neil Gaiman, the *Ranma 1/2* series by Rumiko Takahashi, and the *Tintin* series by Herge. Five years ago, the Library began collecting graphic novels in earnest, with separate collections for children, teens, and adults. Since then, the collection has grown to over four thousand volumes, which account for a significant portion of the library's total annual circulation (42,914 circulations in 2009).

The circulation numbers on many of the graphic novel series are impressive. For example, *Naruto*, as a series, has a total of 3856 circulations (84 per volume). In prose fiction, this number can't even be matched by the *Twilight* series (2414 circulations, average 40 per volume). The following chart shows the highest-circulating graphic novel series owned by the Logan Library.

Of the 40 highest-circulating graphic novels by series, 27 are Japanese manga,11 are compilations of American comic strips or comic books, and two are European comics (*Asterix* and *Tintin*). 15 are for adults, 18 for teens, and 7 are children's titles.

Of the 40 highest-circulating graphic novel series by circulations per volume, 32 are Japanese manga, two are European comics (the same two), and six are American comics. 16 are for adults, 20 for teens, and 4 are children's titles.

Not all graphic novels are in series; the Logan Library owns many graphic novels published as individual titles. Here are the 40 highest-circulating individual graphic novels.

Unlike the series, the majority of the highest-circulating individual graphic novels are American in origin (35), with only five titles being Japanese manga. Two are children's titles, nine are for teens, and the remaining 29 are titles for adult readers.
