TABC BOASTS AWESOME CLINIC LINE UP!

The annual convention and clinic in San Antonio May 20, 21, 22 has another awesome speaker line-up. All the college speakers participated in NCAA March Madness including three final four coaches. Heading the list is Duke long time assistant and former player **Steve Wojciechowski** ("Coach Wojo"). The Blue Devils were men's national champions. Coach Wojo will be the final speaker on Saturday at 1:00 p.m., while the clinic will tip off on Thursday at 3:00 p.m. with **Bob Huggins** whose West Virginia Mountaineers were in the men's final four. **Sherri Coale** also qualified her Oklahoma team for the national semi-finals and will speak right after Coach Huggins. **Larry Tidwell** has rebuilt the Lady Cardinal program and earned a March Madness invite for Lamar University's women for the first time in 19 years and the second in school history. Larry is a two time TABC board member, a former high school coach and will inform and entertain us. **Scott Drew** of Baylor was three minutes away from a final four berth and he will share the Bears elite eight success with our membership on Friday afternoon. **Bill Self** of Kansas is always a favorite with our membership and he will talk about Jayhawk basketball at 7:30 p.m. Thursday evening. **Aaron Johnston** of South Dakota State, **Connie Yori** of Nebraska and **Buzz Williams** of Marquette all had excellent seasons and will speak on Friday.





On Thursday at 6:30 p.m. **Brett Ledbetter** will talk on basketball footwork and Friday morning **Ganon Baker** will give instruction on innovative player development. Both come to us well recommended by the Iowa, Indiana and Ohio state basketball associations and have spoken at clinics internationally.

As in the past, there are three financial sessions entitled "Know Your TRS Facts". These sessions are of great value to young coaches as well as those nearing retirement. **Jerald Reiner** will give counsel on investments and other preparations to supplement your TRS plan.

Friday morning the UIL will answer your questions on the coaching box, off-season league organization or any other areas you need clarification on.

For those who aren't attending the late all-star games on Friday, there will be an informal "Pass the Chalk" session where coaches can share information with each other. The TABC board will lead this opportunity to share with each other at the El Tropicano hotel.

WHY YOUR PLAYER NOMINEE WASN'T SELECTED

Many members contact our office for an explanation of why their player, assistant or middle school coach wasn't chosen for an award. There are several reasons: 1) We have many players and coaches in our huge state and the competition is tough. Only tweleve 5A all-star players are selected from the entire state and each region must be represented. Class AII only gets three all-stars and private schools have two. This is based on percentage of TABC memberships within each conference. 2) Many awards require nomination by either the coach or a committee. If it is left to the committee alone, some worthy recipients are missed. Please nominate and follow up to be sure it is received. 3) Many times an assistant or middle school coach was nominated and selected by the committee, but they are not a current member. Please make sure coaches that you nominate have renewed each year. If they aren't selected, nominate them again next year.

With almost 4,500 members, special recognition is difficult to attain, but when received, it is truly an honor. Thanks for all each of you do to support TABC. Let's make 2010-11 an even better year in every way!
