TOP 50 CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL

STA has been honored for the fourth consecutive year as one of the TOP 50 CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOLS in the nation! Only 11 Catholic High Schools in the nation have achieved this honor for four consecutive years in a row. We are also the only high school in the state of Florida to have this distinction. The 2007 Catholic High School Honor Roll recognizes schools that embrace a vibrant Catholic identity and instill an appreciation of the social, political, and economic dimensions of the world that students will engage.

STA has two students from Sacred Heart School in Milan, Italy, one of the best Catholic schools in Europe. The seniors are taking part in an international education program begun by the archdiocese's department of schools. Their presence not only enriches their cultural education but serves as a reminder to them and their classmates that the church is universal.

ALUM IN THE NEWS

The STA Office of Alumni Relations is working with Raider Review staff in getting interviews with former alum. Senior staff writer Maria Muller '08 recently met with Alumni Director MARCY CALLAHAN '76 at the Miami Dolphins Training Camp for an interview with TWAN RUSSELL '93. Just after the interview, Twan was named a Sun-Sentinel Shining Star for his contributions to promoting literacy helping children with the Russell Life Skills and Reading Foundation. Congratulations Twan and thank you!!

FRONT OF THE LINE: TWAN RUSSELL ~Maria Muller

STA is famous for its ability to produce high quality scholars and athletes. Twan Russell, a football veteran turned philanthropist, is an ideal example of the well-rounded adults students here try to be. Mr. Russell's mother, a teacher, understood the importance of instilling in him the good values of succeeding academically. While a student at STA, he was on the honor roll and managed to excel in two sports, football and track. STA welcomed Mr. Russell with open arms; he was extremely fond of the whole new culture of high school, which really allowed him to grow into the person he is now. Mr. Russell went to the University of Miami on a football scholarship, turning down an offer by Notre Dame partly because "when [he] visited Notre Dame it was snowing and cold and [he] hadn't brought a jacket and had to borrow someone's."

During his stay at the UM Mr. Russell majored in creative writing and minored in criminology and broadcast journalism. Mr. Russell confessed that his choice to major in creative writing was more of a homage to Ms. Modic, who "wouldn't accept mediocrity," than because he had a real passion for it. Although one may think that working with the Dolphins, as the Director of Youth and Community Programs, may not be the best outlet for those skilled in creative writing, broadcast journalism, and criminology, Mr. Russell says that he employs knowledge he gained at UM on a daily basis. "As long as you can take the principals you learn and put them into play, you're making good use of the information."

Following his stay at UM, Mr. Russell was drafted by the Washington Redskins where he played from 1997 to 1999. He then played for the Dolphins from 2000 to 2002 and for the Falcons for one year before finally retiring from Pro-football due to a knee injury that prevented him from performing at the same level.

For Mr. Russell the best part of Pro-football was the competition, "I'm a competition addict... I could play scrabble as long as I feel challenged." Since his retirement, he has been creating football and educational programs, opening an active mortgage and real estate company, and teaching at church every third Sunday.

Mr. Russell started a help foundation with his mother, Corliss Russell, called *The Russell Life Skills and Reading Foundation*. Mr. Russell started the center because of his own past. When he was in school his mother did everything from cooking to taking him and his four brothers to football practice to helping with homework. Mr. Russell's mother could have used help, and he figured that other parents could also. The program uses 60 percent phonetics and 40 percent whole language. Twan Russell wanted to make a difference in the community by "going in with sutures not just a Band-Aid to fix the problem."

When asked what he thinks people should know about him he said, "I'm just a Christian man trying to live righteously on a daily basis who understands I need God to do it."

USS NITZE CAPTAIN COMMANDER ROBERT HEIN JR. '83

One of the United States Navy's newest destroyers, the USS Nitze, DDG94, stopped in Fort Lauderdale in August. The Captain of the ship is CDR Robert Hein Jr., Class of 1983. The stop came after Bob had a six month deployment to the Horn of Africa. While in Fort Lauderdale, he spoke at the Tower Club to members of the Navy League and their guests. STA was also honored to have Bob stop by and visit with students and former teachers. Bob has been in the navy for twenty years and been the captain of the Nitze for over a year and a half.

CPL GREG HOGANCAMP '01 - US ARMY COMBAT MEDIC

CPL Greg Hogancamp and his unit were on routine patrol in May in an area known as Sadr City, Iraq. They were working with US Army Special Forces and were led by 3 M1 Abrams Main Battle Tanks when they were ambushed. The lead tank was penetrated with an explosive formed projectile or EFP, and the three crewmembers, including Greg, were all seriously injured. All three men were placed in drug induced comas for medical treatment and evacuation to Germany. Greg spent a week in the coma and nearly lost both his legs. He has several more surgeries and months of therapy ahead of him before he can begin walking again. This was Greg's second and possible final combat tour since the Army will probably medically retire him within the next year. Greg asks for all our prayers and thoughts for his family and friends and for all the men that have served and their families. He especially asks for prayers for the other two men who were in the tank with him. One lost his arm and was paralyzed from the waist down and burnt over 35% of his body. He has a wife and two children. The other spent several weeks in the drug induced coma and is now battling blood clots in his lungs, joints and back. He has a wife and three children. Greg asks us to remember these men and women who pledged to keep our way of life safe and free from fear and asks us to keep them in our prayers.

ASHELY FLORES '05 WINS NATIONAL CONTEST

The national winner of the 2007 Venus Breeze Legs of a Goddess contest was STA alum Ashley Flores. Singing sensation Rihanna, had kicked-off the nationwide contest in June and announced the winner in September. She presented Ashley the award at New York City's Nokia Theatre in October. Ashley won the contest against competition from all across the country. Contestants from San Diego to Boston competed before a panel of judges that included actress and "Dancing with the Stars" alum, Stacy Keibler. In addition to toned and shapely legs, the judges looked for women with a confident and charismatic personality. Ashley has a passion for dancing and is currently enjoying her third year as a dancer for the Miami Heat. She stays in shape with daily dance practice, but also enjoys yoga and running. Now in its fifth year, the Venus 'Legs of a Goddess' contest celebrates women who exude beauty both inside and out.

KIRK OLIVADOTTI '92 – REDSKINS LINEBACKERS COACH

After beginning his NFL career coaching with the Washington Redskins in 2000, Kirk Olivadotti became a position coach for the first time in his career. Kirk was promoted earlier this year to oversee the Redskins linebackers. Redskins coaches say that he has performed well in every assignment since he was hired and despite his relative inexperience, his ability to identify opponents' tendencies and provide useful tips for players has helped make him a key contributor on the coaching staff. The Redskins have even denied other teams' requests, including the Dolphins, to interview Kirk for assistant positions because he is too important to them. In linebacker meetings, Kirk gives each player a review sheet of the unit's performance from the previous day's practice. How well, or poorly, the unit fared is explained in detail, not something many players have seen coaches do. Kirk began his coaching career working with wide receivers and tight ends at Maine Maritime for one season in 1997. He moved to Indiana State as an assistant for the next two years and then joined St. Joe's as defensive coordinator before being hired by the Redskins. Kirk earned his bachelor's degree in education and his master's degree in education administration, both from Purdue, where he was a four-year letter winner at wide receiver.

ALUM ATHLETES IN THE NEWS

SEAN GALLAGHER '04 was drafted by the Chicago Cubs in '04 and made his Major League debut 6/9/07 against the Atlanta Braves in Atlanta. Pictured is Sean celebrating the Cubs clinching the Pennant on 9/28/07, as Sean pours champagne on teammate Ryan Dempster.



WESLEY CARROLL '07 was named the SEC freshman of the week after throwing for two touchdowns in Mississippi State's 31-14 win at Kentucky. He was the first MSU player to ever earn the freshman honor since the league instituted the award in 2004. Wes completed 17 of 28 passes for 152 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions. Going into the Alabama game, he had thrown a school record 137 passes without an interception. The true freshmen quarterback helped lead MSU to upset Alabama even after MSU's first drive ended with his first career pass interception. In the MSU-Arkansas game two weeks later, Wes's four touchdown passes tied for the most ever for a Bulldog quarterback in a single game. And his 421 yards passing in that game was third all-time in MSU history. Since stepping in at quarterback midway through the season, Wes has helped lead MSU to finish with a 7-5 record and its first postseason bowl bid since the 2000 season.

GENE ATKINS '06 was named the Most Improved Defensive Tackle at conclusion of spring drills. He has gone on to help lead the #4 Georgia Bulldog football team with 5.5 sacks and 37 tackles, leading the defense with 12.5 tackles for loss. He also had 29 quarterback hurries. Gene was named the SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week after he had five tackles, 1.5 for a loss and a .5 sack against Kentucky. He led the team with a career-high eight tackles including one for a loss against Vanderbilt. Coach Richt commented that Gene was a little bit more advanced than some guys last year when he played as a true freshman. He also complimented Gene and said that they have confidence in him and that he was not surprised for Gene to have such a big year.

JAY OTTOVEGIO '03 was the only player on Stanford's football roster this year who was a fourth-year starter. Jay is Stanford's all-time leader in both punts (260) and punt yardage (10,623). He averaged 40 or more yards in 31 of his 44 career games, including eight times in the 2007 season. He had a career-high 10 punts and 429 punting yards in the season opener vs. UCLA. Jay contributed to Stanford's big upset of USC when he averaged 42.9 yards on his eight punts, with two touchbacks. Jay also had a huge game at Arizona when he had a season best 46 average on five punts and put a season-high five inside the Arizona 20-yard line. He only had two punts blocked while at Stanford. Jay, a Stanford co-captain, proved to be a consistent and reliable punter with a strong leg throughout his college career.

RICHARD GOODMAN '05 had an excellent spring and won the Second Effort Award from the FSU coaching staff. He has played in 28 games his first three seasons at FSU. Richard caught 20 passes this season, including a season-best 50-yarder against Alabama-Birmington, for 184 yards and had 2 touchdowns. Richard also played on special teams, had three tackles and recovered a fourth-quarter onside kick that preserved a Seminole 16-6 victory at Colorado.

VITO PELLERITO '04 was named the Liberty Co-Defensive Performer of the Week after notching a team-high 10 tackles in Union College's win over Rochester. Vito, a linebacker, finished the season with 82 total tackles, second on the team. He had 54 solo tackles and led the team with two forced fumbles.

MICHAEL DOUGHERTY '05 became the eighth player in Ivy League football history to pass for 3000 or more yards in a season, finishing the season with 3039 passing yards. The junior quarterback's 264 completions were fifth in the Ivy League record book. He ranked 3rd nationally in pass completions (26.4 per game), third nationally in passing (303.3 yards per game) and 6th in the nation in total offense (310.4 yards per game). Michael tied an Ivy League record by passing for 400 or more yards three times during the season. He set a Brown record by completing 82% of his passes in the game against Dartmouth, going 41 for 50. His total offense of 416 yards in that game was ninth in the Brown record book and his 41 completions are third in Brown history and fifth best in Ivy League football history. Michael had 42 completions against Holy Cross, second best in Brown history and his 447 yards of total offense in that game ranks fifth best. He was named the Ivy Offensive Player of the Week following the Holy Cross game after he also threw for more than 400 yards for the second straight week and two touchdowns. Congratulations to Michael for also earning All-Ivy honors.

MAJOR WRIGHT '05 became the first true Gator freshman to have his black stripe removed during the preseason workouts, a sign from head coach Urban Meyer that he had made enough progress to earn the right to compete for playing time. He saw immediate action in the season opener against Western Kentucky, finishing tied for third on the team with four tackles including three solo. Major, a safety for the University of Florida, played in all 12 games this season. He finished the season second on the Gator team in solo tackles, with 41. He had a total of 58 tackles and led the team with three forced fumbles.

WES BYRUM '07 was named a Lou Groza Collegiate Place-Kicker Award Star of the Week three times this season. He was given the award following both the Florida and South Florida games. Wes kicked the gamewinning 43-yard field goal on the final play of the 20-17 Auburn upset of Florida. He was also named SEC Special Teams Player of the Week following that game. Against South Florida, Wes made a season-long 49-yarder in the first quarter and a 46-




yarder with just 2:54 to play that gave Auburn a 20-17 lead. The third honor for the Auburn freshmen kicker came after he kicked three field goals against Arkansas, including the game-winning 20-yard field goal with 21 second remaining in regulation. Wes provided all the Auburn scoring in the 9-7 victory which also included kicks of 22 and 38 yards. The winner of the Lou Groza Award will be presented by the FedEx Orange Bowl. Wes was also named the Alabama Athlete of the Month for September by the United States Sports Academy. He is 16 for 21 this season and 33 for 34 in extra points, leading the Auburn team in scoring with 81 points.

FOLUKE AKINRADEWO '05 was named all-time Pac-10 Player of the Year, Stanford's 12th-time All-Pac selection. Foluke, a middle blocker on the Stanford volleyball team, is a three-time All-Pac selection on the All-Pac-10 Team. She led the league in hitting percentage (.493) this season, and was among the conference's statistical leaders in kills per game (4.01, 9th), blocks per game (1.20, 8th) and points per game (4.85, 5th). Foluke earned Pac-10 Player of the Week honors twice, and helped the Cardinal defend its Pac-10 title with a 27-2 record and a 16-2 mark in conference play. Her season hitting percentage currently leads the nation, and is on pace to break the Pac-10 single-season record. Foluke led Standford in clinching the Pac-10 Championship in November earning the overall No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Foluke also is one of only three collegiate players asked to train with the USA Women's National Volleyball Team in January.
