THE THOMASIAN IN YELLOW

or her strong adherence to the principles of democracy and her faith in the capacity of the Filipino people to defend their democratic rights and individual freedom..." for "her sincere efforts in bringing about the full realization of peace and prosperity for the Filipinos through non-violent and humane means..." for "her exceptional gift of making politics and humanity companionable in contemporary Philippine society through her program of reconciliation and peaceful negotiations...", for "her personal example of dedication to the Christian universal ideals of love and faith in God,"; for her "determination to impose by example, the highest measure of honesty and integrity in the discharge of both private and public office." These were the words read during the conferment of the degree of Doctor of Laws, "Honoris Causa", to President Corazon C. Aguino last February 19, 1987 at the UST Chapel. On the same occasion, President Aguino was also given the UST Golden Cross Award. The Golden Cross is the highest award given by the University to persons who "excel in the promotion of the arts, humanities and the sciences, or who have distinguished themselves by their total commitment to the service of mankind."

Cory, as she was popularly called, united the opposition, won the 1986 presidential election, and led the people to the streets when then Pres. Marcos fraudently declared himself the winner. The people rallied and Cory was peacefully installed as a democratically legitimate president. She crushed several coup attempts and, in 1992, at the end of her term, voluntarily left office.

Last August 1, 2009, the former President passed away at the age of 76. During her wake at the Manila Cathedral, around 400 Thomasian students, administrators, employees, faculty members and Dominican priests attended the requiem mass. On the way to her interment at the Manila Memorial Park last August 5, 2009, two recognized alumni associations, the Thomasian Alumni Leaders Association (TALA) and the Thomasian Scholars Alumni Association Inc. (TSAAI), joined the nation

in the funeral of Cory. Angeline S. Tuazon, Founding Chair of TALA and Dennis Arapeles, Member of the TSAAI Board of Trustees, led the group. TALA and TSAAI distributed a hundred yellow umbrellas to the people who patiently waited for the arrival of the remains of the late President inside the Manila Memorial Park despite the rain. Witnessing the burial rites at a very close range, the two alumni groups were overwhelmed with great sorrow.

In her acceptance speech during the degree conferment in UST, Cory Aquino touched on "reconciliation," on peaceful and non-violent resolution of conflicts, and on an abiding faith in the love of God. These were her principles which the Filipinos admired. Hence, Cory was truly an icon of peace and democracy to the Filipino people.

Cory Aquino's yellow trademark symbolizes the return of democracy in the country. Cory is a Thomasian and the University will always be proud of her.



MediSining: The Art of Toribio Herrera, MD

n his lifetime, he never exhibited his works for the public to see. He did not want monetary rewards for his art and he never sold a painting. His very first exhibition was held in 1972, four years after his death. Born in Tondo, Toribio Herrera (1892 -1968) first graduated in Medicine at the University of Santo Tomas in 1912. Later, he took a second course in Fine Arts at the University of the Philippines, and was eventually accepted to teach there. He was part of the Amorsolo, Castaneda Miranda Group of Filipino Genre Masters who set the tone of Philippine Painting, particularly during the twenties.

37 years after his first exhibition, his available works and memorabilia were given importance at the GSIS Museum of Art mounted "MediSining: The Art of Toribio Herrera, MD." The exhibit opened last July 24, 2009 at 6:00 PM at the GSIS Museum of Art Upper Gallery in Pasay City. Dr. Ma. Graciela G. Gonzaga, Dean of the UST Faculty of Medicine & Surgery, delivered a message as well as Dr. Abdulmari Asia Imao, national artist and student of Dr. Herrera. The exhibit runs until November 30, 2009.

The National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) has appointed RONALDO G. VERIAN (1992 BS Nursing) to serve as member of the NCLEX item development panel of subject matter experts last May 12-15, 2009 in Chicago, Illinois.
