The Impact of Children's Grief on the Family: Grief, Hope and Healing

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Description

The death of someone close to us can shatter our security, often challenging our assumptions about the world or even our life's purpose. This is true whether the death occurred in the course of a "normal life cycle" or was an "out of order" death. This is also true for children who are grieving. Their grief impacts the family system as parents and other family members deal with their own loss while trying to support the child. The impact of the loss ripples out beyond the family to other caregivers, clergy, employers and educators.

This program will discuss adaptation to loss and how to help those dealing with grief, including children.

Audience

Aftercare providers, bereavement specialists, child life specialists, chaplains, clergy, counselors, educators, funeral directors, nurses, social workers, and anyone who works with the bereaved.

Goal

To enhance participants' knowledge related to the grief of children and the family system, including those who work with children and families so they may support those who are experiencing grief.

Objectives

- Identify ways of helping children cope with their grief
- Identify common myths and assumptions about grief in children and adolescents
- Describe the components of a model for thinking about children's response to loss
- Identify four responses of siblings to the death of a brother or sister
- Identify the goal of adult interactions with grieving children
- Identify lessons learned about caring for bereaved siblings that can assist caregivers in helping grieving children
- Describe how from birth we experience life events
- Describe how the bereaved search for meaning in their grief reaction
- Identify the four dimensions of grieving response as a process of relearning the world
- Describe how the bereaved can cope with sorrow rather than fleeing from sorrow
- Describe how the bereaved find meaning in the world of their experience
- Describe how the bereaved learn to love in separation


Speakers

Betty Davies, RN, PhD , CT, FAAN is a Professor and Senior Scholar in the School of Nursing at the University of California, San Francisco. Her professional career focuses on the areas of death, dying and bereavement, with particular emphasis on palliative care. She is the author of *Fading Away: The experience of transition in families with terminal illness* and *Shadows in the Sun: Experiences of sibling bereavement in childhood.*

Thomas Attig, PhD is the author of *The Heart of Grief: Death and the Search for Lasting Love* and *How We Grieve: Relearning the World.* He has written numerous articles and reviews on grief and loss, care of the dying, suicide intervention, death education, expert witnessing in wrongful death cases, the ethics of interactions with the dying, and the nature of applied philosophy.
