

STONE STREET, favored by the going and in prime condition, ran the best race of his career, followed BANRIDGE close up to the three-quarters post, where he went into the lead and easily held the others safe for the rest of the trip. SIR CLEGES disliked the going and sprawled repeatedly, made a game effort to get into the lead, but the going was against him and, on a dry track, would probably have won off. DUNVEGAN ran fairly well, showing improvement over his Lexington form. SYNCHRONIZED closed a big gap in the last half, was going fast at the end and would have been second in a few more strides. BANRIDGE showed the most early speed, but tired badly after going three-quarters. MILFORD, in poor form, was never a factor. The others were always badly outpaced.
