GENERAL ORGANISATION

The Venue for the Oceania Football Confederation (OFC) Beach Soccer Championship—New Zealand 2007 was originally planned for an indoor facility at the Vector Arena in Auckland.

The decision was made to change to Narrow Neck Beach in Davenport due to the tremendous costs involved with building a FIFA specific indoor pitch and the risk of causing permanent damage to the Vector Arena floor.

Narrow Neck Beach turned out to be an excellent location for the tournament with the support of the North Shore City Council.

Security and medical precautions were superbly managed by the LOC and the pitch was presented in immaculate condition for each match day.

The weather held out for a beautiful two days in Auckland and the event attracted a 500-strong crowd on the first game day and that number heavily increased for the finals.

OFC ran an invitational tournament in conjunction with the main Event which involved three teams from local communities Including Fiji, Solomon Islands and Asia and was a big success,

MEDIA AND MARKETING



The interest and attractiveness of beach soccer resulted in the 2007 OFC Beach Soccer Championship being fully self funded from sponsorship.

The event garnered a lot of media interest and video clips were shown throughout New Zealand's national news channels and ESPN.

The event received a front page write up in the North Shore Times as well as coverage in the New Zealand Herald and the national sports channel—Radio Sport.

The promotion of the event was a great success, particularly within the ethnic Auckland communities who

turned out in large numbers. Entertainment between games was provided by an ethnic tournament with teams from Fiji, Solomon Islands and Iraq.

Posters were also developed and placed around Auckland in key areas and sent to clubs which helped stir a lot of interest.

Having an MC and a DJ at the venue added to the atmosphere. Future entertainment could be developed to include cultural performances.







MATCH DAY 1

VANUATU GET OFF TO PERFECT START

Vanuatu exploded into life in the first match of the FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup Qualifier when they sparked an unlikely comeback to beat defending Oceania champions Solomon Islands 3-2.

James Naka scored the first two goals of the tournament in the 1st period, and the Bilikiki boys were cruising, until the Masauvakalo brothers Ken and Fenedy pulled two goals back for Vanuatu. Dereck Malas finished the job late in the 3rd period for Vanuatu and set the scene for an exciting first day.

Not to be outdone, Tahiti stormed to a 9-5 demolition of a young New Zealand side. Despite being a relative novice on the international scene Tahiti thrilled the crowd with slick interplay and awesome acrobatics. Their impressive win was built on the skills of Teva Zaveroni who scored four goals.



Vanuatu then overpowered a tiring Tahitian side 10-5 in the afternoon with the help of seven goals from the Masauvakalo brothers and some incisive finishing.

In the final match of the day the Solomon Islands stole the show with a James Naka winner to come from behind and beat a very talented New Zealand side. The scene was set for a very exciting match day two.

MATCH DAY 2

Match day two began with an exciting contest between the Solomon Islands and Tahiti. After an intense opening stanza with the sides locked at 3-3 experienced striker James Naka proved to be the match winner with two late strikes to propel the Bilikiki boys to a 5-3 victory.

This result relegated Tahiti to the third - fourth playoff and left New Zealand needing a win against a polished Vanuatu side to make the final.

But Vanuatu proved too strong and in the highest scoring match of the tournament and ran out victors 10-8 with Sam and Soromon both notching up four goals a-piece.

New Zealand then beat Tahiti 5-3 in the third-fourth playoff, in the curtain raiser for the highly anticipated final Between Vanuatu and the Solomon Islands.

The Solomons outgunned a fatigued looking Vanuatu side in the final in an intense and passionate affair. The experience of Henry Koto and the pace and trickery of James Naka proved too hot to handle as they pumped the Bilikiki Boys off to an early lead.

Vanuatu attempted a spirited comeback and though they scored three goals in the third period, it was not enough to stop the Solomon Islands from claiming their second successive OFC Beach Soccer Championship and a spot at the FIFA Beach Soccer World Cup in Rio De Janeiro.


