RECENT METS: The Mets are 1-3 on their 10-game road trip...This road trip is the club's second longest road trip of the season...New York went on an 11-game road trip, July 15-25, going 2-9...New York is 18-28 since the All-Star break...The 18 wins since the break are tied for 23rd in the majors...After June 27, when the Mets were a season-best 11 games over .500, they have gone 22-36.

ON THE ROAD: The Mets have a winning record on two of their nine road trips this year...The Mets are 10-19 in their last 29 road games and 13-25 in their last 38 games away from Citi Field...Overall, New York is 27-43 on the road this season...The .386 winning percentage on the road ranks 21st in the majors.

SERIES NOTES: The Mets are 23-20 in the first game of a series, including 7-15 on the road...The Mets are 3-15-4 in road series this year.

ON THE BOARD EARLY: The Mets have scored first in 12 of their last 16 contests...The Mets are 7-5 in these games when plating the first run of the game...Overall, New York is 54-24 this year when scoring first and 25-19 when doing so on the road.

THREE RUNS OR LESS: The Mets scored four runs last night at Atlanta...It was the second time in New York's last seven contests that the club plated four or more runs...New York has scored three or fewer runs in 65 of its 134 games (49 percent)...Since the All-Star break the Mets have scored three or fewer runs in 28 of their 46 games (61 percent).

OFFENSE: The Mets are hitting .221 (341-1505) with 137 runs scored, 61 doubles, 11 triples and 28 home runs in 46 games since the All-Star break...The Mets are 18-28 in these games...New York hit .233 (212-910) in August, ranking 29th in the majors during the month...Oakland was 30th (.231).

AT THE PLATE: Since July 1, the Mets have a .295 on-base percentage ranking 29th in the majors...New York's team batting average during that period is .228, ranking 30th in the majors and the club's .338 slugging percentage is 29th...The Mets have 126 extra-base hits during this span, ranking 29th in the majors...Overall, New York ranks 24th in the majors with extra-base hits with 352.

HOME RUNS: David Wright hit the club's 98th home run last night in Atlanta...The Mets are tied for 25th in the majors with 98 long balls...The Mets have hit 100 or more home runs as a team in 34 of their 49 seasons...Last year, New York finished with 95 home runs...The Mets have not hit more than one home run in any of their last 31 games...It's their longest stretch without a multiple-home run game since a 41-game streak from June 22-August 8, 1992...The Mets last multi-home run game was on July 30 vs. Arizona when David Wright went deep twice.

TRIPLES: Carlos Beltran collected his second triple of the year last night at Atlanta...The Mets have 37 triples ranking second in the majors behind Colorado (43)...The Mets have three players in the top 10 in the National League...Jose Reyes is tied for fifth with eight triples, Angel Pagan is tied for seventh with seven and Jason Bay is tied for ninth with six triples.

ROOKIE DOUBLES: Ike Davis registered his 26th double last night...Davis' 26 doubles rank fifth in franchise history among rookies...Ty Wigginton holds the rookie team mark with 36 doubles in 2003, Kaz Matsui is second with 32 in 2004 and Ron Hunt (1963) and Gregg Jefferies (1989) are tied for third with 28...As a team, the Mets are tied for 26th in the majors with 217 doubles.

IKE DAVIS: Currently has 57 RBI during his rookie campaign which is tied for sixth place with Cleon Jones (1966) among Mets rookies...Jason Phillips is in fifth place on that list with 58 RBI in 2003, Jay Payton is fourth with 62 RBI in 2000, Steve Henderson ranks third with 65 RBI in 1977, Ty Wigginton is second with 71 RBI in 2003 and Darryl Strawberry holds the club rookie mark with 74 RBI in 1983...Davis has also drawn 56 walks this season, the third-most among Mets rookies...Only Johnny Lewis, who had 59 walks in 1965, and Lee Mazzilli, who had 72 base-on-balls in 1977, have more.

METS-CUBS SERIES HISTORY: The Mets and Cubs have met 685 times with the Mets holding a one game advantage, 342-341, with two ties...New York has won three of the last four series at Chicago dating back to 2006...Since 2000, the Mets are 12-18 against the Cubs at Wrigley Field...New York is 6-4-2 in their last 12 season series vs. Chicago.

JOHAN SANTANA: Left last night's game with a strained pectoral muscle...He is day-to-day...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, last night was Johan Santana's ninth career win as a starter in a game in which he pitched only 5.0 innings...Santana had seven such wins for the Twins and one other five-inning victory with the Mets: July 9, 2008 against the Giants at Shea...He didn't allow a run and was removed from the game after a 42-minute rain delay.

RISP: New York was 1-7 with runners in scoring position last night and has hit .174 (29-167) with RISP over its last 23 games...Overall, the Mets are 24th in the majors with a .249 (278-1118) batting average with runners in scoring position...They rank 18th with 1118 at-bats with RISP...The Mets are hitting .240 (138-575) with runners in scoring position on the road...New York is batting .200 (108-540) with runners in scoring position and two outs, ranking 30th in the majors...The Mets are hitting .183 (28-153) with runners in scoring position after the seventh inning, ranking 30th in the majors...New York was 1-2 last night with the bases full and is hitting .200 (22-110) with the bases loaded, ranking 30th in the majors.

TWO OUTS: The Mets scored three of their four runs last night with two outs while the Braves plated one two-out run...New York pitchers have allowed 14 two-out runs over the last four contests...The Mets pitching staff has allowed 224 runs after two outs, ranking 15th in the majors...New York has scored 183 runs overall, ranking 28th in the majors...The Mets have scored 75 runs with two outs on the road and allowed 133 runs with two outs away from Citi Field.

STARTING PITCHING: Dating back to August 6, the staff as a whole has pitched to a 3.09 ERA to rank fourth in the majors...Oakland is first (2.99) ...**Since the All-Star break, Mets starting pitchers have allowed three earned runs or fewer in 32 of their 46 starts...**The starting staff has allowed six or more runs in seven of these 46 starts...New York starters are 12-21 with a 3.48 ERA (111 earned runs/287.1 innings) and 13 no-decisions during this span.

R.A. DICKEY: Needs 1.2 innings to qualify for the ERA title...His 2.57 ERA would rank ninth in the majors...Has pitched at least 7.0 innings in 11 of his 20 starts for the Mets, after doing that in only 11 of his 48 career starts in the majors before this season...For the season, Dickey has made six starts where he has not allowed an earned run, tied for the 14th-most in the National League.

METS PEN: Hasn't allowed an earned run over its last two games, spanning 7.0 innings...Dating back to August 14, New York's bullpen is 3-0 with four saves and a 2.03 ERA (10 earned runs/44.1 innings).

THIS DATE IN METS HISTORY

Jim Hickman becomes the first Met to hit three home runs in a game as New York posts a 6-3 win at St. Louis on September 3, 1965...Jerry Koonsman extends his scoreless streak to 29.0 consecutive innings by blanking the Phillies, 5-0, on September 3, 1973...Tom Seaver fans Philadelphia's Tommy Hutton for his ninth consecutive season of 200-or-more strikeouts on September 3, 1976...Seaver defeats the Phillies, 1-0, in that contest.

LAST START: Beat the Astros, 5-1, on August 29th at Citi Field...Went 7.0 innings and allowed six hits and one run, earned...Walked two and struck out two to earn his ninth victory and tie his career-high for wins in a season (2003 with Texas).

ERA LEADER: Dickey passed the one inning per one team game requirement for the ERA title in his last start, but then lost it again after last night's game (Game No. 134)...If he qualified, he would ranked ninth in the majors with a 2.57 ERA.

WALKS: Has a BB/9 rate of 2.23, the best mark of his career...His previous low was 2.70 in 2006, when he threw a total of 3.1 innings...He had a 2.84 mark in 2004 when he totalled 104.2 innings pitched...Has three starts this season where he has not walked a batter, after entering 2010 with only three starts for his career with no base on balls.

HITS: Dickey has allowed 25 hits over his last three starts, including a season-high 10 on August 24th vs. Florida, after allowing 20 in his previous five starts from July 25th-August 13th.

STRONG STRETCH: Is 3-1 with a 2.32 ERA (14 earned runs/54.1 innings) in his last eight starts...Has not allowed a run in three of those turns...For the season, has made six starts where he has not allowed a single earned run, tied for the 14th most such starts in the league.

FIRST INNING: For the season, has allowed just three runs and limited opponents to a .143 batting average (10-70), with two extra-base hits and 19 strikeouts in the initial frame this season...The .143 batting average is the second best mark in the major leagues among pitchers with at least 40 at-bats against them in the first inning...San Diego's Mat Latos leads with a .129 batting average (11-85).

ONE-HITTER: R.A. Dickey threw a one-hitter, the 35th in franchise history, to beat the Phillies, 1-0, on August 13th at Citi Field...It was the second complete-game effort of Dickey's career and the only hit he allowed was a line-drive single by pitcher Cole Hamels...He struck out seven, one off his season-high, and walked one...Dickey also paired with Johan Santana, who had thrown a shutout in his start the night before, to become the first Mets pitchers to post consecutive complete-game shutouts since Pedro Astacio and Jeff D'Amico tossed back-to-back two hitters on May 14th and May 15th, 2002 at Los Angeles.

MORE ONE-HITTER: Dickey's one-hitter on August 13th was the 35th in franchise history, with the lone hit coming off the bat of pitcher Cole Hamels...According to Elias, the last pitcher to throw a complete-game one-hitter in a 1-0 victory with the only hit by the pitcher was Sandy Koufax on May 23, 1960...Bennie Daniels (a career .170 hitter) got the only Pittsburgh hit that night, a second-inning single.

SCORELESS STREAK: Allowed a run in the second inning of his start on August 3rd to snap his career-best scoreless streak at 18.0 innings...The streak dated to the fifth inning of his start on July 20th at Arizona.

THREE-DAYS OF REST: His start on July 29th came on three-days rest...He became just the second pitcher over the past four seasons to start a game on short rest (no more than three days between starts) and throw more than eight shutout innings...The first is Johan Santana who accomplished the feat in a 2-0 shutout win for the Mets against the Marlins on the next-to-last day of the 2008 season.

LAST OUTING: In his lone appearance at Buffalo (AAA) of the International League, Mejia went 8.0 innings and allowed one run, earned, and five hits in a 4-1, 10-inning loss vs. Syracuse...He struck out nine and walked one...His last outing at the major league level came on June 20th at Yankee Stadium...Threw a perfect inning and struck out one in a 4-0 loss.

LAST OUTING VS. THE CUBS: Faced one batter and walked him in a 5-2 win on April 22nd at Citi Field...Also threw 2.0 shutout innings on April 19 in a 6-1 win.

CAREER AT WRIGLEY FIELD: Has never pitched at Wrigley Field.
