

Unity and Compassion at Lambrick Park Secondary

It has been an amazing year of fundraising events, particularly for the Free the Children group at Lambrick Park. The goal this year was to top our \$8,500.00 goal of last year to build a school in Chismaute, Ecuador...our goal was reached by mid-May and Health Care in Chismaute is our focus!!

A committed group of LP students came together every Wednesday at lunch to plan and implement numerous events throughout the year. Regular weekly events rotated through the selling of Kapow Pops or popcorn at lunch.

Larger events included the *30 Hour Famine*, *Flowers 4 Freedom* and then *Freedom Fest Week* May 2nd – 6th. Freedom Fest included daily events for a week:

- **Monday Vow of Silence:** students gathered pledges to 'unplug' from electronic devices and remained silent for a day, supporting and bringing awareness to those children who do not have a voice due to their life circumstances.
- **Tuesday Thriller Mash-up:** all interested students and staff (175+) gathered in the gym to learn the Michael Jackson Thriller dance routine, we took this to the Library Hallway and have our efforts now on video. The power of the group and the building of community through this was fantastic!
- **Wednesday Water Walk:** 10 teams of 10 walked/raced in relay fashion around Gordon Head Middle School Campus, during the lunch break, with a 5 gallon bucket of water. Team themes were developed, all participants received a commemorative water bottle, prizes were awarded and each team raised \$200.00. This event was to raise awareness of the daily work the 'mamas'/ women do in countries where water is a scarce commodity.
- **Thursday Flowers 4 Freedom:** Students, sold in advance, amazing planters from Marigold Nursery, just in time for Mother's Day, this was the day for pick-up.
- **Thursday Fiesta Bingo:** An evening of Bingo, pizza and an amazing Silent Auction (thanks to our local businesses) for the Lambrick Family. A BIG thank-you to our Bingo callers Mr. Pitre and Ms. Weir...almost everybody went home with something.
- Friday Tape the Teacher to the Wall: with exploitation being the underlying theme Mr. Luchies, Ms. Trumpy, Mr. Kemp and Mr. Carter stood on benches, duct tape was sold ... 'Loonie for a Meter' for the entire lunch, the benches were removed and if all four 'stuck' then the students would earn an afternoon off prior to the long weekend. The students were 'generous' and not one of the teachers moved once the benches were taken away.

Lambrick Park Secondary School

Since October at Lambrick Park a small but enthusiastic group of young women have been working with Louise Milburn, Anishnoabe Traditional Teacher (who is a visitor here to Coast Salish Territory) on a number of activities designed to raise awareness of Aboriginal heritage.

As the group is only comprised of women, we have a unique opportunity to learn about women's teachings and have smudged, made medicine pouches, dream catchers, shakers (rattles), drums and drum sticks.

We learned about the teachings that the animals give us: grandmother spider reminds us of the connectedness of all things, the snail teaches us to slow down, the wolf teaches us to take care of our families.

These activities also taught us about patience and the inclusion of imperfections as we sometimes struggled to complete the task. We were mindful of our thoughts so only good energy would go into the finished products. We felt a sense of pride and accomplishment as we tried to embody Louise's sentiment that we are all on the Earth for two reasons: to learn and be helpers and that we are human beings first.

As always, we are grateful to Louise for sharing her traditional wisdom and knowledge and skills with us.
