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Restrooms getting new look at Lambert

Airport Experience renovations will makeover 10 sets of restrooms when completed



(St. Louis) Lambert-St. Louis International Airport has opened its first set of restrooms that feature bright white counters, new terrazzo flooring and colorful walls. These restroom renovations are part of the on-going Airport Experience Program, Lambert's largest interior renovation in history.

The first set of renovated restrooms (Men's, Women's and a Family Assist) is now open in Concourse A near gate A-8. Eventually, all restrooms in Concourse A, Concourse C and Terminal 1 will be renovated. The Airport is also building a new set of restrooms in Terminal 1 Baggage Claim.

"This is a major focus of our renovation program because we've heard from our passengers and airport users," said Director Rhonda Hamm-Niebruegge. "We know clean and accessible restrooms facilities are important to our travelers and we think they will notice a dramatic change with the makeover of our facilities."

The full set of features include ADA-compliant counters, restroom stalls and restroom fixtures along with new lighting, new tile wall surfaces and terrazzo flooring.

The restrooms renovations are part of the \$50 million in projects for Phase II of the *Airport Experience* which includes renovations to Terminal 1 and Concourses A & C. Concourse improvements include new lighting, new ceiling treatments, full tile flooring through the main corridors, new signage and art displays. Construction is also continuing in Terminal 1. Major projects include new terrazzo flooring on the Ticketing Level, new ticket counters, an expanded B/C/D checkpoint along with new lighting, ceiling and signage throughout the terminal.

Construction on these projects is scheduled through late 2012.

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Lambert is the 30th busiest airport in the U.S. as ranked by Airports Council International-North America. Lambert served more than 12.3 million passengers in 2010. Lambert-St. Louis International Airport is an Enterprise Fund Department of the City of St. Louis. It is wholly supported by airport user charges. No general fund revenues are used for the operation, administration, promotion or maintenance of airport facilities.
