

Carbon County

Carbon County is Montana's twentieth most populous county, with an estimated 9,756 residents as of July 1st, 2009. Red Lodge, the county seat, is the state's thirty-first largest city, with a population estimated at 2,483 in 2009. Other cities and towns in Carbon County include Bearcreek, Belfry, Boyd, Bridger, Edgar, Fromberg, Joliet, Luther, Roberts, Roscoe, and Silesia.

Carbon County took its name from the vast coal deposits discovered there; and for much of its history, coal mining was the county's major industry. The present day economy relies more on agriculture, recreation, and tourism.² The Red Lodge Mountain Ski Area and the Custer National Forest are major tourist draws, providing ample opportunities for outdoor recreation. The Pryor Mountain National Wild Horse Range, located in southeast Carbon County, is home to about 130 wild, free-roaming mustangs believed to be descended from a herd that may have arrived as early as the 1700s.³



Distribution of Population by Age Montana and Carbon County, 2009






