## Elementary Music - Grades 1-6

## General Music

Classroom instruction 1x per week, Kindergarten every other week.

- Orff instruments, tone chimes, percussion instruments, recorders, singing
- Grade level programs in each building that involve EVERY student in a speaking or singing part (1 to 2 per school)

Rock and Roll show with every student in a grade has a part in the show

Creating a memorable musical experience at each level of instruction

## Elementary Music - Grades 1-6

Voice

Vocal Ensembles - Auditioned
A Culture of Singers. One trend: more males than what is typically found in school districts. Lots of male sopranos.

Chorus - All students have an opportunity to participate in chorus. Close to 70\% of students participate in chorus (5th \& 6th chorus).

## Elementary Music - Grades 1-6

## Instrumental

Creating a culture of musicians, which has led to excellent participation in the elementary instrumental program

Small group lessons once per week with a large ensemble rehearsal every other week

- Junior Orchestra - grades 3 and 4
- Senior Orchestra - grades 5 and 6
- Junior Band - grades 4 and 5
- Senior Band - grades 5 and 6
- Jazz Ensemble


## Junior High Music - Grades 7 - 9

## General Music Class

- Moving towards a performance-based class where students experience and create music rather than listen and analyze.


## Orchestra \& Band

- Both ensembles meet every other day for 40 minutes. Students also receive a small group lesson once per cycle.
- Orchestra is one ensemble for grades 7-9. Also an auditioned Select Ensemble which combines students from both East and West. 4-5 performances each year.
- Marching Unit
- Concert Band
- Band - one ensemble for grades 7-9. 7-8 performances each year. East and West Junior High School bands frequently combine.


## Junior High Music - Grades 7-9

## Chorus

- Chorus for $7^{\text {th }}$ grade which meets in $3-4$ sections (about 30 students) 120 students
- Concert Choir for $8^{\text {th }} \& 9^{\text {th }}$ grade in two sections (meets twice per cycle) ~ 200 students
- Show Choir - An auditioned ensemble (meets twice per cycle)
- Musicals - Full scale productions - 65 students

A number of students are in band, orchestra, concert choir, and show choir. Sometimes up to 10 periods of music per cycle (6 day rotation)!

## Senior High Music - Grades 10 - 12

- Keyboarding

Students have an opportunity to learn basic keyboarding skills. Helps to bring in some of the students that would not be in a traditional performing ensemble.

- AP Music Theory

Learning the foundations of harmony, melody ear training, and composition in preparation for the AP music exam.

## Senior High Music - Grades 10-12

## Choir

- Women's Choir
- Concert Choir - PMEA twice in the past 5 years
- Show Choir - Selected to perform at the MENC AII-Eastern Division Conference in April.
- Chamber Choir - An auditioned ensemble of 10-12 students



## Senior High Music - Grades 10 - 12

## Symphony Orchestra

Select Ensemble, String Ensemble
Concert Band - 4 performances annually
Jazz Ensemble - Performed at MENC All Eastern Convention in 200
Performing at the PMEA convention in April (1 of 2 high school jazz ensembles). 10 performances annually.

## Senior High Music - Grades 10 - 12

## International Performing Arts Tour - every 3 years

- April 2012 will be the 14th tour to Prague, Vienna, and Salzburg
- 225 students - open to all students in music groups
- Also an Observer Tour which includes parents, school board members, and other members of the community
- Performed at the Vatican, Rome, Florence, Siena, Verona. Romania (during communism), England, Belgium, France, and Germany, festivals


## Senior High Music - Grades 10 - 12

## Marching Unit

- 17 performances a year
- Cavalcades - recent state champion
- Parades
- Games



## Senior Migh Music - Grades 10-12

## Musical Productions

- Large scale production that involves nearly 100 students
- Musical Cast, Stage Crew, Pit Orchestra
- Many community volunteers
- Costumers, set designers, pit orchestra members
- Stage crew (own culture)
- West Side Story, Les Miserables, Beauty and the Beast

## Lead Teacher for Fine Arts

Observe curriculum in action, Constantly working towards a unified curriculum across all buildings. Provides the materials that are necessary to teach the curriculum as it has been developed by the teachers.

Also coordinates international tour and all events related to district fine arts activities.

Performances at the Sunnybrook Ballroom in Pottstown, the Jazz Base, and other community venues.Students have an opportunity to sit-in with this group during rehearsals and performances, providing a semi-professional experience.
