Rebounding From A Tough Weekend

The emotional high of a No. 1 ranking and a sweep of a fellow No. 1 boiled over last weekend when Vanderbilt handed Arkansas a pair of losses at Baum Stadium before rain cancelled game three. Now the Razorbacks attempt to regroup to face a very tough Louisiana-Monroe team at Baum Stadium on Tuesday and Wednesday with games at 6:35 p.m. and 3:05 p.m., respectively.

Arkansas (24-8, 10-4 SEC) hopes to end its first two-game losing streak of the season on Tuesday night. The Razorbacks were handled easily by Vanderbilt thanks to dominating pitching but extra time in the batting cages as well as a day of practice should help the struggling Arkansas hitters. Louisiana-Monroe (21-12, 11-7 Sun Belt) enters the midweek series with one of its best teams in years and hopes to build upon its growing NCAA resume by winning a game or two on the road.

The Razorbacks send sophomore right-handed pitcher Brett Eibner to the hill on Tuesday night. Eibner has been brilliant in his last three starts for Arkansas with eight shutout innings over two starts against Missouri State then allowing just two runs against Arizona State last Tuesday. Wednesday's starter is TBA, but the Razorback bullpen is well rested after two days off from competition giving the Arkansas coaching staff options.

Arkansas' hitters feel like they must atone for their lack of production against Vanderbilt which could produce any number of results for the Razorbacks. Solid plate discipline along with patience could result in big numbers on the scoreboard while pressing could keep the Razorbacks right where they are. Look for leadoff hitter Chase Leavitt to bounce back from a rough series as Arkansas' table setter could be an indication of what happens throughout the two-game set.

The Louisiana-Monroe series can be heard on the Razorback Baseball Network from ISP with Chuck Barrett handling the play-by-play duties.

Arkansas Remains Steady in the Polls

While the Razorbacks lost their No. 1 ranking in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper*, Arkansas did manage to remain somewhat steady in the polls despite its first two-game losing streak. The Hogs are ranked as high as No. 5 by *Collegiate Baseball* and as low as No. 12 by the *USA Today/Coaches* and *Collegiate Baseball Writers*. Arkansas moved up one spot in the *Baseball America* poll to No. 11 and remained steady at No. 7 in *Rivals.com*.

A Program First

Arkansas' No. 1 ranking in *Collegiate Baseball Newspaper's* April 6 poll is the first time in program history that the Hogs earned a No. 1 ranking. The Razorbacks had been ranked as high as No. 3 in previous years but never achieved a No. 1. *Collegiate Baseball* was cool to the Razorbacks through the first three weeks of the season as they did not rank the Hogs, but in the next four weeks Arkansas went from No. 23 to No. 9 to No. 4 to No. 1.

Scouting the Warhawks

Louisiana-Monroe can hit and a .328 team batting average is certainly hard to overlook at any level. Eight players on the Warhawk roster have batting averages greater than .300 and seven of those averages exceed .340 making Louisiana-Monroe a dangerous team to face, especially midweek.

The Warhawks enter their two-game set with Arkansas with a 21-12 record and just swept Louisiana-Lafayette at home over three games. The Warhawks have won eight of their last nine games and 12 of 14 since late March.

While the Warhawk bats have power and can flat out hit, Louisiana-Monroe's pitching has been somewhat questionable. The team boasts a 5.71 ERA and is not overpowering with just 187 strikeouts over 293.1 innings. Teams are hitting .315 against Monroe and Tuesday night starter Keith Christensen is just 2-2 with a 5.05 ERA and .325 opponent batting average over 41 innings.

The All-Time Series

With as close as Fayetteville and Monroe are on the map one would believe that these two teams have met numerous times over the years, but the reality is that it has only been 11 and Arkansas holds a slim 6-5 lead. The 2009 meeting is the first between the two teams since the 1999 season and the Hogs defeated the Warhawks in their last meeting, 10-8 in Monroe, La.

A Look at the Razorbacks' Rotation

Tuesday - Brett Eibner, RHP (3-2, 3.18 ERA) - Brett Eibner has been hot and cold on the mound for the Razorbacks this season, but has been brilliant in his last three starts. He is 3-2 on the season and has allowed just two runs in his last three starts (13.0 innings) and surrendered just seven hits. Eibner was a fourth round draft pick of the Houston Astros in the 2007 draft and possesses an overpowering fastball with movement and a sharp curve. In his last start against Arizona State he was excellent as he threw five innings, allowed five hits and struck out three.

Wednesday - TBA - The Razorbacks are not positive who will get the start on Wednesday against Louisiana-Monroe but likely candidates include LHP Drew Smyly, RHP Sam Murphy and RHP Bryan Bingham.

His Best Week

Sophomore Brett Eibner had his best week of the season as he hit a team high .500 over three games and pitched brilliantly only to get a no decision. Eibner clocked one of Arkansas' four home runs on Saturday afternoon and smoked a ground-rule double against Arizona State which started a rally on Wednesday. As a pitcher he allowed just two runs over five innings against Arizona State.



Eibner First Freshman to Lead Razorbacks in RBI Since . . .

Brett Eibner quietly led the Razorbacks in RBI last season when he drove in 48 runs. The significance of that feat is that he became the first true freshman to lead Arkansas in RBI since former Major Leaguer Jeff King drove in 55 runs during the 1984 season.

Eibner Named Freshman All-American

A huge miss in the media guide this season was the fact that Brett Eibner was a first-team *Baseball America* Freshman All-American. Eibner was slotted into the utility spot by *Baseball America* based on his pitching and outfield play.

A Player to Watch

The online publication *SEBaseball.com* went through its list of players to watch this season and named Brett Eibner as one of the six players it looked at. Eibner, a former fourth round pick of the Houston Astros as a pitcher, blossomed last season as a defender and at the plate and has looked solid all fall with added muscle and awareness.

Baseball America Projections

In their string of prospect projections this winter *Baseball America* has mentioned Brett Eibner a couple of times. He was tabbed as the No. 5 projected prospect in the SEC for the 2010 draft in the publications SEC preview. He was also the No. 2 sophomore prospect in their list of the top players in the country.

Arkansas' MVP Candidate

At the midway point in the season many players could be considered Arkansas' MVP, but perhaps the most compelling case goes to senior shortstop Scott Lyons. A sure-handed fielder when it counts, Lyons entered the 2009 season with a career .200 batting average and is currently hitting .316 with two home runs, seven extra-base hits and 24 RBI. Lyons has also secured the No. 2 spot in the batting order giving Arkansas a left-right-left look through its first three hitters.



Matching a Season Best

Scott Lyons quietly matched Ben Tschepikow's season best hitting streak at 11-games and then extended it to a season best 13. Beginning at the California game on March 8, Lyons may not have the gaudy numbers that Tschepikow's streak had, but the West Covina, Calif., native batted .385 with 20 hits, 11 runs, two doubles, a home run, three walks and 14 RBI. Lyons streak, which ended against Mississippi State had him batting .330 for the season after a .200 campaign a year ago.

SEC Player of the Week

Thanks to a once-in-a-lifetime weekend, senior Chase Leavitt was named the Southeastern Conference's Player of the Week on March 9. Leavitt was a thorn in California's side as he reached base in 14 of 17 plate appearances and cracked nine hits against the Bears. His startling numbers included nine hits, five walks, two runs, two doubles, a stolen base and seven RBI. He also came through with the game-winning hit on Sunday afternoon and set career bests with four hits and five RBI.

**College Baseball Foundation National All-Star Lineup**

Along with his SEC Player of the Week honors, Chase Leavitt was also placed on the College Baseball Foundation's National All-Star Lineup. He is the second Hog to make that prestigious list in the last two years joining head coach Dave Van Horn who was honored after winning his 800th career game as a coach.

Leavitt Remains at the Top of the Lineup

Senior Chase Leavitt was a player that not many people noticed at the beginning of the 2008 season, but the Utah native was on everyone's mind by the time the NCAA Regional came. Leavitt led the Razorbacks with a .366 average last season and hit .388 in Southeastern Conference play. Arkansas' catalyst at the top of the order, Leavitt's plate discipline earned him 41 walks, 13 hit by pitches and a team high .518 on-base percentage.

Preseason All-SEC

Rivals.com and *SEBaseball.com* each named Chase Leavitt one of its preseason All-SEC picks. Leavitt led the Razorbacks in hitting last season with a .366 average and was a valuable part of what the Hogs accomplished in their run to a NCAA Regional. *Rivals.com* had Leavitt on its one and only All-SEC team while *SEBaseball.com* placed Leavitt on its second team.

Record Crowds

The Razorbacks are setting attendance records. The season began with Arkansas' largest opening day crowd against Washington St. and continued into the Cal series where the Razorbacks set records for largest paid and actual non-conference series attendance. The Arizona State series saw a Baum Stadium record 11,014 fans attend Wednesday night's game with 11,434 tickets sold. That series broke a two-game attendance mark for a non-conference midweek series.

A Pure Hitter

Arkansas' lineup has pop, speed and great swings, but perhaps the best pure hitter on the club is sophomore Andy Wilkins. The Razorbacks' clubhouse leader in home runs, Wilkins is batting a healthy .339 this season with eight doubles and nine home runs. He has driven in 27 runs while scoring 26 of his own and all this while being pitched around as Wilkins has drawn 24 walks.

**SEC Play, No Problem**

Some hitters feast on non-conference pitching, but struggle against the best that the SEC has to offer. Not so in the case of several Razorback hitters including Andy Wilkins who boasts a .378 batting average against the conference. Wilkins has 17 hits in 12 conference games with a two doubles and three home runs.

Improving as a Defender

Everyone knew that Andy Wilkins could hit the ball, but he has never been known as a fantastic defender. While Wilkins does have five errors on the season, he has not made one since March 6 against California.

Coaching Milestones

Thanks to Arkansas' sweep of the Auburn Tigers last weekend Razorback head coach Dave Van Horn reached a pair of coaching milestones. The Razorbacks' Friday night victory was his 100th as Arkansas' head coach against the Southeastern Conference and the Saturday afternoon win was his 250th as the head man at Arkansas.

Keuchel Brilliant in First SEC Outing

Junior Dallas Keuchel was outstanding in his first SEC start of the season as he tossed seven innings and allowed just one run on four hits while striking out a near career best nine hitters. Keuchel retired the first 14 hitters he faced before surrendering a walk. He did run into trouble in the sixth inning when he loaded the bases with no outs, but a sacrifice fly was followed by a pair of strikeouts to get out of the jam. Arkansas' ace earned his second win of the season with the effort.



Another Stellar Performance

In a classic Friday night SEC pitcher's dual, Dallas Keuchel out-pitched Auburn's Grant Dayton last Friday night. Keuchel earned his second SEC win by going a season best eight innings and scattering nine hits while striking out four. Keuchel allowed just two runs during the performance.

A Great Start

Dallas Keuchel has had a great start to his junior season. Over his first six starts, Keuchel amassed a 5-0 record with a 3.45 ERA over a team high 44.1 innings of work and walked just five batters while striking out 35. Even more important than those numbers is that Arkansas was 7-0 in games that Keuchel started.

Best SEC Start

As far as we can tell, Dallas Keuchel's 4-0 SEC start was just the second time in Arkansas history that a starting pitcher had won his first four conference decisions. The only other time that we can locate is David Walling's 1999 campaign where he also opened the season 4-0 before a no decision ended the streak.

Best Start Ever

Arkansas opened the SEC season with an eight-game winning streak, its best start since joining the league in 1992. Arkansas' previous best through eight games was 6-2 and the Razorbacks extended the career best start through 10-3 before matching the 1999 team's start.

Second Longest Streak

Arkansas' eight-game SEC winning streak was the second longest in school history behind 1999's 10-game winning streak.

Two Significant Streaks

Senior Ben Tschepikow had an 11-game hitting streak snapped against Nebraska on March 18, but followed it up with another seven games streak. During Tschepikow's first stretch he batted .442 with 19 hits, 13 runs, a triple, four home runs, nine walks, five stolen bases and 16 RBI. His second run had him at .423, with 10 runs, two doubles, a triple, home run, seven walks and eight RBI.



Consistency

The Razorbacks are seeking consistency throughout the lineup and Ben Tschepikow is providing just that. He has at least one hit in 26 of 32 games this season and has reached base multiple times in 21 of the 32 contests.

Leading the League

Thanks to its 10-4 start in Southeastern Conference play, Arkansas currently holds a 1/2 game lead on the SEC Western Division. The Razorbacks are only five weekends into the 10-week season.

Arkansas' Recruiting Class Among the Nation's Elite

The Razorbacks have a large class of freshmen and transfers this season, but the recruiting prognosticators feel good about what Arkansas is bringing to the field. *Baseball America* named Arkansas' recruiting class the No. 8 class in the nation and tabbed true freshmen Zack Cox and Jarrod McKinney as the No. 72 and No. 157 prospects, respectively.

Cox Named One That Got Away

Freshman Zack Cox was tabbed as one of the top prospects in the nation that "got away" from Major League Baseball according to *Baseball America's* Nov. 3 issue. Cox, a 20th round pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 2008 First Year Player Draft, was named the No. 4 prospect that chose to attend college rather than play in professional baseball.

**A Prospect to Keep Tabs On**

Like Brett Eibner, Zack Cox has also been placed on a pair of *Baseball America* prospect lists. He was tabbed the No. 4 newcomer in the SEC in the publications SEC preview and the No. 5 freshman prospect overall.

The Bat and Arm are Coming

Zack Cox is a two-way player for the Razorbacks and as the freshman gets more comfortable with the college game one can see his abilities flourish. In a nine start span that ended after South Carolina, Cox had 12 hits, four home runs including a grand slam, 10 runs scored and 13 RBI. During a similar span on the mound he made five appearances, thrown 5.2 innings, allowed four earned runs and struck out eight. Against California and Florida he tossed 4.1 innings and struck out seven while allowing just one hit.

The Razorback Pitching Staff

As a whole, the Razorback pitching staff has done one thing very well and that is get the ball over the plate. Through 32 games the Razorbacks have walked only 113 batters which ranks fifth in the Southeastern Conference.

Kuhn Named SEC Freshman of the Week

Redshirt Freshman Collin Kuhn was named the Southeastern Conference's Freshman of the Week on Monday, March 16. Kuhn batted .353 over four games and in the Florida series was placed at the top of the order and hit .429 with a team leading six hits in the series. Kuhn had his first three-hit contest against the Gators and led off Sunday's victory with a triple to left-center field and scored the first of Arkansas' four runs.

**Earning His Playing Time**

When the season started, the Razorback coaches were high on Collin Kuhn, but also knew that they had a crowded outfield. Giving the Beaver Dam, Wis., player his time in the field was a blessing for the Arkansas coaches as Kuhn has flourished. On the year, the redshirt freshman is batting .348 in 22 games (17 starts) and has scored 21 runs and driven in eight more.

Don't Run on Kuhn

Collin Kuhn has been impressive at the plate, but his defense is getting better all the time. Against Cal, Kuhn threw out a would-be run at home plate from left field for Arkansas' first outfield assist of the season. In the Auburn series Kuhn threw out three runners, two at second and one at the plate to earn four outfield assists on the year.

First Time Since

As far as we can know, Collin Kuhn's two assist day on Friday against Auburn was the first two-assist performance by a Razorback outfielder since Blake Parker threw out two LSU runners at the plate on April 10, 2004.

Cardiac Kids

The 2009 Arkansas baseball team has a flare for the dramatic to say the least. They have been behind or tied in the eighth inning or later 12 times this season and have come back to win six of those games. The Razorbacks have delivered two walk-off home runs, a game-ending triple and a squeeze bunt to pull out their victories and have even received a two-out home run in the bottom of the ninth to tie a game and force extra innings.

The Back End Anchor

The Razorbacks feel that their bullpen is much improved over last year and a key component to that is a healthy Stephen Richards. Over his first 15 appearances, Richards has been very good on the mound with 21.1 innings pitched and three earned run allowed. He has struck out 29 batters, walked 10 and allowed only 11 hits. He did get touched up for a blown save when a batter that he struck out with two outs reached on a passed ball and eventually scored. In the Arizona State series Richards made two appearances and picked up two saves.

The Razorbacks had four current and six future players selected in Major League Baseball's first-year player draft in May. Junior Logan Forsythe went as the last pick in the compensation first round to the San Diego Padres followed by Cliff Springston, Jeff Nutt and Aaron Murphree.
