Saturday 15 January, 10am - 2pm Woodland management

An enjoyable and rewarding task with a roaring fire. In the last few years we have coppiced the newly emerging woodland. This year we will get to grips with the mature woodland, doing essential thinning and coppicing that will encourage wild flowers and provide a crop of fresh timber.

Saturday 5 February, 10am - 2pm Rhos pasture management

The Welsh black cattle are making short work of grazing the grass in the rhos pasture, but even they won't eat willow and rush. We will be cutting and removing these ourselves, creating excellent conditions for spring flowers to emerge.

This is a new project for the volunteers. A nature trail needs to be created in the park ready for the Easter rush. This will involve planting many nature trail posts in the ground.

It's a foe that just won't lie down. We start our annual battle with this invader a bit later than usual, with the hope of cutting it down in its prime and stop it seeding.

An annual tradition. Cutting, raking and removal of vegetation from this area, ensures a fresh crop of wild flowers next spring.

Autumn hay rake and barbecue

Another tradition dating all the way back to 2005 is the hay rake and BBQ. The hay rake performs a vital management tool for our meadows and if you bring along food and drink we will provide the barbecue.

Japanese garden management

Our ponds will need their annual weeding and paths will need cutting back. This is a lovely place to work in early autumn.

Saturday 5 November, 10am - 2pm

Sycamore wood management

To get the best crop of bluebells we need to stay on top of the bramble and bracken, so this is a day in the woods with slashers, brush cutters and rakes.

Saturday December 3, 10am - 2pm

Woodland management

The year's programme ends as it begun, with coppicing in Coed Kensington, helping the woodland biodiversity and giving a crop of hazel and willow.
