Stamp news from Sweden Post 3/2007



2007 is the 300th anniversary of Carl Linnaeus' birth in Råshult in southern Sweden. The tercentenary is being celebrated in many places in Sweden and across the world. Sweden Post started off the anniversary year with two engraved coil stamps in January, and May 10 sees a beautiful minisheet engraved by Lars Sjööblom.

Linnaeus tercentenary continues with engraved minisheet

The minisheet shows Georg Dionys Ehret's botanical illustrations from Linnaeus' bedroom wall in Hammarby. Linnaeus bought the Hammarby estate, a small farm just outside Uppsala, in 1758. He found Uppsala itself a noisy city with poor air quality. Hammarby came to be the Linné family's refuge, and the location close to nature Linnaeus had long dreamed of. He moved his unique collections to Hammarby, where he taught and conducted research. He could grow plants on the farm that could not survive the conditions at the university gardens, and he could also keep livestock.

On a small hill at Hammarby, Linnaeus had a stone house built to house his extensive collec-

tions. The location and construction materials were chosen to withstand fire and flood. The house, which he called 'my palace in heaven', was also where he taught his private students.

After Linnaeus' death, his widow Sara Lisa stayed at Hammarby until her death in 1806. The farm remained under the family's ownership until 1879 when the state bought it, and it came under the management of Uppsala University. Today Hammarby is one of Sweden's best-preserved 18th century farms, featuring household utensils, clothes and art from Linnaeus' own home. The plants Linnaeus himself grew and used in his teaching are still grown in the gardens today.

The stamps are illustrated with a banana plant, Musa x paradisiaca, and a plant called mayapple or mandrake, Podophyllum peltatum. The stamps and minisheet are based on photographs by Per Myrehed and the National Property Board. Stamp engraving by Lars Sjööblom. The First Day Cover is illustrated with a snake's head fritillary, Fritillaria meleagris, and the cancellation bears Linnaeus' signature. On the collector's sheet is a portrait of Linnaeus in bridegroom attire, painted by Johan Henrik Scheffel in 1739, from a photograph by Björn Hansson. The minisheet, stamp products and FDC cancellation are all designed by Roger Jonsson and Michel Östlund/Hera.

Stamp designer and engraver **Lars Sjööblom**

Lars Sjööblom is the only permanently employed engraver at Sweden Post. His artistic career began at the Berghs School of Advertising in 1977, from where he was hand-picked for the special engraver's course at the Royal University College of Fine Arts. Lars began at Sweden Post in 1983 and in his more than 20 years with the company he has been behind the design and engraving of many beautiful issues.

Exclusive book on Linnaeus with stamps and cylinder impressions

To celebrate the Linnaeus 2007 tercentenary we are publishing an exclusive book about Carl Linnaeus' life and works. In addition to fascinating text and beautiful pictures, the book also contains two specially produced sheets with prints of the four stamp engravings from the



stamp printing works, known as *cylinder impressions*, as well as a transparent pocket containing all four stamps featuring Linnaeus from 2007.

The ring-bound book depicts in words and pictures Carl Linnaeus' life, from his childhood in Småland, southern Sweden, to his journeys in Sweden and abroad, his botanical works and his time as an esteemed professor in Uppsala. The author of the book is Marita Jonsson, who is also responsible for the majority of the book's photographs. Marita's text is translated into English and German.

The Carl von Linné book is presented in a specially designed protective case and is a must for stamp and history enthusiasts alike.

The special issue contains another transparent pocket of older Linnaeus stamps, all long since discontinued from Sweden Post's standard range. You will find:

- Two coil stamps showing portraits of Carl Linnaeus, both from the 1939 Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences issue. The stamp denominations are SEK 0.15 and SEK 0.50 respectively.
 - Two coil stamps showing pictures from Carl Linnaeus' Hammarby country house, both from the 1963 Historic Buildings issue. The stamp denominations are SEK 0.20 and SEK 0.50 respectively.
 - The Linnaeus' Travels issue from 1978, which comprises a Carl von Linné booklet of 6 stamps and an equal number of motifs.

The stamps in the booklet each have a denomination of SEK 1.30.

* The book contains: 24 pages of text and images about Linnaeus' life and 1 sheet of special prints featuring motifs from Uppsala from Suecia Antiqua et Hodierna by E. Dahlberg, 2 sheets of enlarged details of stamp engravings and information about them, 2 sheets of unique special prints of the engravings for this year's new Linnaeus stamps (known as cylinder impressions) and 1 transparent pocket with the 2007 Linnaeus stamps (2 coil stamps and 2 stamps in a minisheet). The special issue also includes a transparent pocket containing older issued stamps (see further information in the product text).

This year's summer stamps for domestic mail are based on the joy of angling. In a booklet containing four motifs, 10 stamps and a coil stamp, we see children busy fishing. Most children are fascinated by fishing, whether with an artificial bait, a worm or a spinning lure. It's a summer pastime, among all summer's other pastimes, and a big non-stop adventure.

The big adventure

Many of us have fond recollections of afternoons spent on the jetty, warm evenings on the craggy rocks or early mornings on the open sea. We recall the crabs scratching in the bucket, the jerk on the line when the fish bit at the hook, and the pride of actually touching a newly caught fish for the first time. We also remember the satisfaction of releasing the afternoon's catch back into the water, only to carry on fishing the next day.

Perhaps the attraction lies in the sense of freedom associated with the water. Perhaps

it's the inquisitiveness and the joy of discovery, or the fact that no two sessions are the same. It could also be the fine feeling of managing to accomplish something on your own that produces a buzz, or possibly the pleasure of being brave enough to handle a live catch. Whatever the reason, angling is a pleasure that attracts, enchants and entertains children and adults alike, generation after generation.

Why not get your old fishing rod out this summer?

Summer angling – a children's pastime

Day of issue: May 10, 2007

The stamps show children discovering the joy of angling. The stamps in this booklet are called Jetty Fishing, Fish Kiss, Double Joy and Fishing with Friends. The coil stamp is called Angling with a Worm. The stamps are based on photographs by P. Arsenault, V. Askland, B. Röhsman, J. Alexandra and T. Lilia. Graphic design by Olöf Baldursdottir. The collector's sheet shows a photograph by Mikael Engström. The First Day Cover picture is by Jan Töre and the cancellation is an illustration by Norbert Tamas. Graphic design for the collector's sheet and First Day Cover by Norbert Tamas.

Stamp designer **Olöf Baldursdottir**

Olöf Baldursdottir was born in Reykjavik, Iceland, where she studied applied art. She moved to Sweden with her family in 1984. Over the years she has designed logos, packaging, folders and stamps, as well as collector's items. Her first stamp designs were three issues of Olympic Gold in 1991-1992. This was followed by many assignments, the design of this issue being the latest.

On January 1, 2007 Sweden Post increased the rate for international mail from SEK 10 to SEK 11. As a result the stamp featuring Queen Silvia from 2005 is being issued in a new color and denomination. The stamp is based on a photograph by Ewa-Marie Rundquist and is engraved by Martin Mörck.

Sweden's Queen, H.M. Queen Silvia, is extensively involved in humanitarian issues. In spring 1999 the Queen took the initiative to establish her own foundation, the World Childhood Foundation (WCF). The goal is to promote the right of every child to its childhood and to work for better living conditions for children in danger. "We must fight against the extreme material, social and emotional poverty in which they live," writes the Queen on the WCF website www.childhood.org. The foundation supports many different projects in around 15 countries and today has activities in Sweden, Brazil, Germany and the USA.

Queen Silvia is also an honorary member of the international Mentor Foundation, which aims to support preventive action against drug abuse. Through the scheme, school pupils are given a mentor, an adult contact outside the family who can provide experience and be a contact for future working life.

Also on the Queen's initiative the Silvia-hemmet or Silvia Home for dementia patients was set up on Drottningholm island, Stockholm. The Silvia Home Foundation, which the Queen actively chairs, promotes scientific research and prepares education, training and care in the field of dementia. Since its foundation in 1996, the Silvia Home has trained 34 assistant nurses in cutting-edge expertise with special knowledge in education and instruction relating to care for dementia patients.

Queen Silvia also works actively for people with disabilities, partly through her chairmanship of the Royal Wedding Fund. The fund, which was established in 1976, assists young people with disabilities by giving them access to sports equipment and supporting research in the field of young people and disabilities. The Queen also chairs the Queen Silvia Jubilee Fund for research into children and disabilities.

Queen Silvia stamp in new color scheme and denomination

The stamp portraying Queen Silvia is based on a photograph by Ewa-Marie Rundquist and is engraved by Martin Mörck. Graphic design for the stamp by Gustav Mårtensson. The collector's sheet shows a photograph of Queen Silvia on a state visit to Finland in 2003, photograph by Charles Hammarsten/IBL. The First Day Cover shows Queen Silvia receiving a donation for the WCF in 2004, photograph by Nils Petter Nilsson/Scanpix, and the cancellation depicts a crown. Norbert Tamas designed the collector's sheet and First Day Cover.

The issue's photographer **Ewa-Marie Rundquist**

Ewa-Marie Rundquist was born in 1958 in Vindeln, northern Sweden. She is one of Sweden's foremost photographers in the fields of fashion, advertising and portrait photography. The book Drottning Silvia (Queen Silvia) was published in 2001 in which the Queen openly talks about her life and commitment to important issues. Several of the book's photographs were taken by Ewa-Marie Rundquist and show the Queen in a way we may not be used to seeing her. The photograph which formed the basis for the stamp was taken in connection with the book.

The four stamps for international mail depict four landscape pictures of Sweden in her summer robes. From Lapland in the north to Skåne in the south we see the country at her very best.



Magnificent landscapes show different sides of Sweden

The four stamps in the issue portray Sweden's forests and her agricultural landscape. The stamp *Undulating fields* shows a field of rape in full bloom in Skåne. Rape is often seen in flower during the early summer and is a common crop in southern Sweden. We find further agricultural land on the stamp called *Hay field*. The picture was taken in Jämtland, north-west Sweden, and shows a view of Kallsjön lake with a hay field in the foreground. This type of field cannot be ploughed, instead it is used for hay which is harvested in the late summer.

The stamp depicting the elk looking inquisitively into the camera has been called *Magic*

forest and shows a photograph from Sveafallen in Närke, central Sweden. Sveafallen is a well-known nature reserve for geological research into events during the Ice Age. Today the area is covered with forest but there are still traces of the ice melt in the form of pot-holes and erratic blocks, for example. The final motif in the issue is called *Forest mere* and shows a view from Muddus national park in Norrbotten, northern Sweden. The national park comprises marshland and the surrounding tree-clad mountains. The forests are mainly primeval forest of pine, spruce and birch. The marshland is a breeding-ground for many birds.

Swedish landscapes from north to south


Day of issue: May 10, 2007

The issue's stamps were designed and engraved by Piotr Naszarkowski. The stamps are based on photographs by Jan Töve/ Naturfotograferna, Jan ferna, Per-Olov Eriksson/ Naturfotograferna and Tore Hagman/Naturfotograferna. Graphic design and originals by Gustav Cover shows agricultural landscape (photograph by Peter Gerdehag/briljans.se) and was designed by Norbert Tamas. Norbert also designed the First Day Cover which is a photograph by Anders Ekholm/ Tiofoto. The cancellation shows a rape flower.

Graphic design and originals **Gustav Mårtensson**

Gustav was born in Lund in 1965 where he was educated and learnt the craft. At university he read history of art and communications science, and he later attended the School of Design and Crafts at Göteborg University. He has worked at Sweden Post since 2002 and has designed stamps and collector's items. He is the creator behind many ingenious stamps such as Elks (1997), Star signs (1999) and Swedish Stamps 150 Years (2005).
