The School

Oak Hills High School, founded in 1954, is the largest and one of the most academically reputable public high schools in the state of Ohio. The school sits on a 35-acre campus in Bridgetown, a residential suburb located west of Cincinnati. The district is comprised of five elementary schools, three middle schools, and one high school. Enrollment in the district for the 2010-2011 school year is approximately 7970 students.

Affiliations & Accreditation

Oak Hills High School holds accreditation by the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and by the State of Ohio. Oak Hills High School is a member of the National Association of College Admission Counselors (NACAC) and subscribes to the NACAC Statement of Principles and Good Practices.

2010-2011 Faculty

There are 86 men and 167 women on the faculty at Oak Hills High School. Of the 253 faculty members at Oak Hills, 124 hold an advanced degree.
