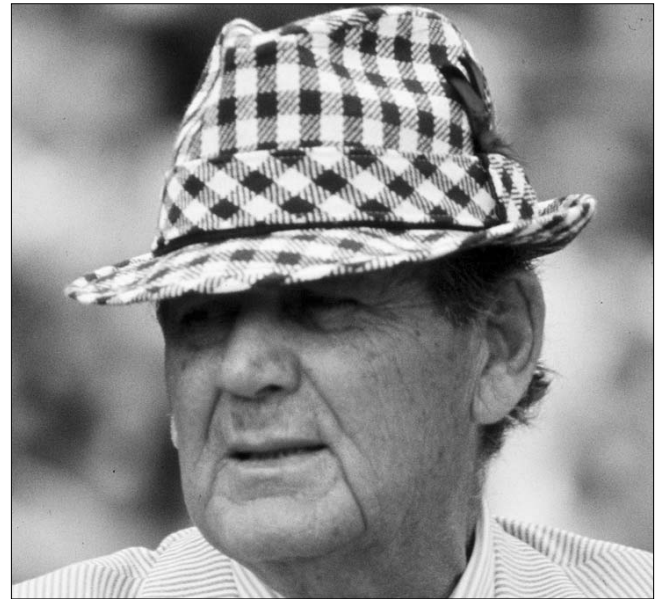

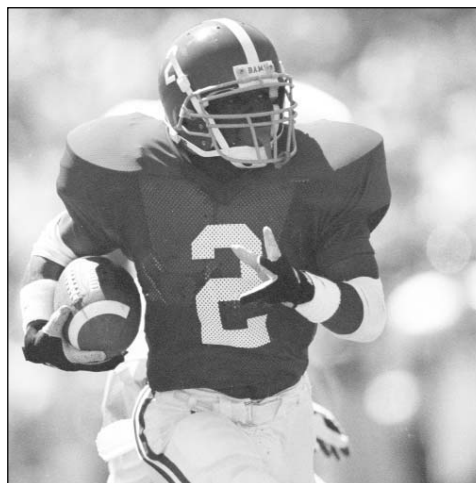
Alabama in the Heisman Trophy Balloting
