THE GAME • Western Michigan travels 1,976.28 miles to Moscow, Idaho for its game against the University of Idaho Vandals. This will be just the second meeting between the two teams and the seventh time the Broncos have faced a team from the Western Athletic Conference in program history.

The last WAC team the Broncos took the field against was Louisiana Tech on Sept. 15, 1990, which resulted in a 27-21 victory for WMU.

TELEVISION • There is no television for this game. Bronco Insider subscribers can watch live on www.wmubroncos.com. Idaho, also a JumpTV client, will share the video and live stats with Western Michigan. This will allow subscribers to view the game as if it were a home game. Visit the home page to join.

RADIO • This and all Western Michigan football games will be broadcast live on the Bronco Radio Network and its new flagship station, WZUU - 92.5 FM. Robin Hook (play-by-play), calling WMU football games in his 25th season, and Monty Porter (analysis) will have the call as they have together for the past 10 seasons.

WEB SITE • WMU home football games (not televised by the ESPN family of networks) can be seen live via the official athletics web site (www.wmubroncos.com) by subscribing to Bronco Insider, which can be found on the home page of the site. SERIES IN BRIEF • The Broncos and Vandals have played only one game in this series and it occurred on Nov. 18, 1972 at Waldo Stadium. Western Michigan emerged victorious in that game, 27-16. The Vandals were the second of two WAC teams on WMU's schedule in 1972. Fresno State welcomed the Broncos to California on Sept. 16.

THE COACHES • Bill Cubit (Delaware, 1975) begins his fourth season as the head coach of Western Michigan. He is 21-17 overall (.553), 12-5 at Waldo Stadium (.706), at Western Michigan and led the Broncos to their first bowl game since 1988 following the 2006 season. Idaho is coached by Robb Akey (Weber State, 1988). He is in his second season with the Vandals after going 1-11 in his inaugural season as a head coach. Akey has over 20 years of coaching experience, mainly on the defensive side of the ball and most recently spent four seasons as the defensive coordinator at Washington State University.

UP NEXT • Western Michigan returns to Waldo Stadium on Sept. 20 for a showdown with Tennessee Tech of the Ohio Valley Conference. This will be the first ever meeting between the Broncos and the Golden Eagles. Western Michigan is 2-0 against teams from Division I-FCS under Bill Cubit.

GAME 3 — WESTERN MICHIGAN AT IDAHO — GAME NOTES

SAFE AT HOME • Western Michigan improved to 52-16-1 (.761) in home openers at Waldo Stadium with its win over Northern Illinois. WMU is now 214-136-4 (.610) all-time at Waldo Stadium and improved to 18-11 (.621) in home openers against Mid-American Conference opponents.

WMU improved to 4-0 when the MAC home-opening opponent was Northern Illinois and the Broncos have now won 11 of their last 12 home openers dating back to 1997.

NIP/TUCK • Western Michigan battled Northern Illinois for four quarters before emerging with a three-point win. It marked the 12th time in the history of the series, which spans 58 years and 34 games, that the two teams were separated by 10 points or less. The last three games, including this year's contest have been decided by two, four and three points respectively.

The last double-digit victory over Northern Illinois for Western Michigan was on Oct. 21, 2000. WMU defeated the Huskies, 52-22, at Waldo Stadium.

STARTING THINGS OFF RIGHT • The Broncos' win over Northern Illinois in the conference opener marked the 38th time in program history, and third year in a row, that Western Michigan has started its MAC schedule with a win. Of those seasons, the Broncos went on to have a winning conference record 17 times.

DEFENSE TO THE 10TH POWER • Senior free safety Louis Delmas was named Mid-American Conference West Division Defensive Player of the Week on Monday morning. The North Miami Beach, Fla., native compiled 10 tackles for the second-straight game and also filled the stat sheet with his 10th-career interception and the third fumble recovery of his career.

Delmas now has five games in his career with 10 or more tackles and has opened the 2008 season with double-digit tackle efforts in each of the first two games. He recorded 11 stops in the opener at Nebraska before registering 10 more against the Huskies.

The senior's 10th-career pick was his second in as many games. It came late in the third quarter with WMU clinging to a 14-13 lead. The interception was made at mid field and he returned it 18 yards to Northern Illinois' 32-yard line. His fumble recovery came in the fourth quarter, shortly after the Broncos had regained the lead, 22-19. On the second play of NIU's drive senior line backer Boston McCornell forced DeMarcus Grady to fumble. It was recovered by Delmas on the Huskies' 33-yard line.

The fumble recovery was Delmas' third career recovery but the first since Oct. 8, 2005 against Ball State. The turnover, Western Michigan's fourth in its first two games of the year, resulted in the Broncos scoring on the ensuing drive to take a 10 point lead with seven minutes remaining in the game.

This is the first MAC West Player of the Week award for Delmas, who has been named Second Team All-MAC after the 2005 and 2007 seasons.

GO FOR TWO • The Broncos made good on a two-point conversion attempt for the first time this season. Tim Hiller found Juan Nunez in the front right corner of the end zone to give WMU a three-point lead in the fourth quarter against Northern Illinois.

The conversion was the sixth two-point conversion attempted and fourth made going back to the beginning of the 2005. WMU was 2-for-3 on two-point conversions in 2007 and was a perfect 1-for-1 in 2006. The Broncos attempted one two-point conversion in 2005, against Ball State, but did score defensive two-point conversions on two separate occasions (at Temple, vs. Ball State).

The last time a WMU opponent attempted a two-point conversion was Nov. 5, 2005. Eastern Michigan's Matt Bohnet attempted the pass but failed. The last time a team converted for two points against WMU was also during the 2005 season. Bowling Green's Anthony Turner completed a pass to Charles Sharon for the two-point conver-

MAKING THE MOST OF IT • Senior linebacker Austin Pritchard joined four other Broncos that have recorded touchdowns on their first career receptions dating back to the beginning of the 2005 season. Pritchard's first career reception resulted in his first career touchdown. Quarterback Tim Hiller rolled out to the right, finding the linebacker from one yard out.

Pritchard is the only one of this group to not be a current member of the offense when his first-career reception/TD occurred. Schultz, Stevens and Gardner were all tight ends and Saad was a fullback (he had converted from a linebacker prior to the start of the 2006 season).

SACK DAVIDSON • Senior defensive end Zach Davidson accounted for half of Western Michigan's four sacks against Northern Illinois. After not managing one sack against Nebraska, the Broncos got strong pressure from the edge as Davidson and Greg Marshall combined for three sacks and interior lineman Cory Flom registered the other.

Davidson's 2.0 sacks are just off the pace of this career best 2.5 sacks set against Cincinnati in the International Bowl (1/6/07). His 3.0 tackles for loss did tie his career best in that category, matching his effort against Indiana (9/8/07).

ALL SIGNS POINT WEST • Junior running back rushed for a career-high 175 yards on 25 carries against Northern Illinois. It was the second time in West's career he has rushed for over 170 yards in a game (171 vs. Ball State, 10/20/07) and it was the sixth 100-yard rushing game of his career.

West added nine yards receiving (his fourth career receiving TD) and 73 kick return yards to move into fifth in career all-purpose yards (3,871) and second in career kick return yards (1,676).

ANOTHER DAY AT THE OFFICE • Jamarko Simmons returned to form against Northern Illinois, hauling in eight receptions for 102 yards in the Broncos' win. It was the seventh 100-yard receiving game of his career. He also hauled in his 11th career receiving touchdown (26 yards from Tim Hiller).

Simmons' fifth catch of the game, a 20-yard completion in the second quarter on second down, moved the Flint, Mich., native into third place on the career

receptions list ahead of Kendrick Mosely (163). Simmons now sits alone in third with 167 career receptions behind Steve Neal (235) and Greg Jennings (238).

His 102 yards also moved him into seventh place on the career receiving yards list. At 1,866 yards, he is ahead of Bob Phillips (1,802) and just behind Josh Bush (1,889).

Simmons also has extended his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 20 games.

GOT 'EM • Western Michigan quarterback Tim Hiller threw three touchdowns in a game for the ninth time in his career with three (all to different receivers) against Northern Illinois. He boasts a record of 6-3 in games with three or more passing TDs.

Hiller also ran in his fourth-career rushing TD on a five-yard keeper up the middle. It was the first rushing touchdown for Hiller since Oct. 20, 2007 (Ball State).

FUN WITH RATIOS • Two games into the 2007, Tim Hiller had a touchdown to interception ratio of 3 to 3. Two games into 2008, the signal caller's ratio is 5 to 1.

WMU VS. WAC • Western Michigan has competed against a team from the Western Athletic Conference in football six times and the Broncos have come away with a 3-3-0 record. WMU has played a WAC team on the road only twice (Fresno State) and one of WMU's three bowl opponents was a WAC team (Fresno State - 1988 California Bowl).

Western Michigan will fly to Lewiston, Idaho (32.1 miles from Moscow). The flight to Idaho will last approximately five hours with the return flight lasting just under four hours.

DOME, SWEET DOME • The Kibbie-ASUI Activity Center, also called the "Kibbie Dome," is one of the unique facilities in all of the NCAA.

The Kibbie Dome has been the home of Vandal athletics since 1975, when the barrel-arch roof was completed. In 1976, the building earned the award for America's Outstanding Structural Engineering Achievement.

It took nearly seven years to complete the 14-story-tall structure, which is tall enough that Idaho's Theophilus Tower dormitory would fit inside. Construction began in 1969 on the site of the former Neale Stadium, which had been partially destroyed by fire. The field and stands were completed in 1971, but it took four more years to finish the unique roof. The east end addition, which includes the athletic department offices, locker rooms, training rooms and a weight room, was completed in 1982.

NO TIME AT ALL • Idaho captured its first win in 11 games with a 42-27 victory over in-state rival Idaho State and the Vandals did so with the help of the quick score. UI's first score came 38 seconds into the game and was one of two scoring drives lasting under one minute.

MOVERS AND SHAKERS • Western Michigan welcomed four new coaches to its staff prior to the 2008 season.

Mike Grant - Grant came to WMU after spending a season at Southern Miss and following nine season at Iowa State.

Rick Kravitz - Kravitz comes to WMU after spending a season as the defensive coordinator at Memphis. He brings 23 years of experience to Kalamazoo.

Mike Sabock - Sabock spent 24 seasons with MAC rival Northern Illinois under legendary head coach Joe Novak.

Ryan Cubit - Cubit, finishing graduate school, is in his first season with the Broncos as a member of the coaching staff, working with WMU's quarterbacks.

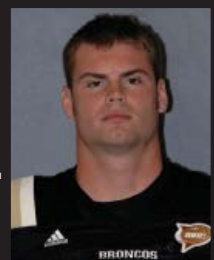
