

A region of 650,000 people, but a sphere of influence stretching to over 1 million would expect to have one 'city scale' centre.












- The Tees Valley has several centres.





The Site


- 250 ha.

- The River and its corridor already improving.














Key Land Owners views:

- The two Councils and English Partnerships want to use their land to stimulate regeneration.












The Vision

- Improving the area by upgrading road, rail and river infrastructure.

















































BARRAGE DEVELOPMENT SITE







A tidal marina, housing and Wildlife Trust's visitor centre and HQ










PROJECT 3 – MAZE PARK














- 11 hectares of land formed with spoil.

- Supports grayling and dingy skipper butterflies (nationally threatened species).

























- Continual improvement.




































- 16 Hectares of wetland (reedbeds, pools and wet grassland)
- Supports important numbers of water birds (teal wigeon and redshank).
- Valuable for breeding birds including reed bunting, reed warbler and ringed plover.
- Used by otter returning to the Tees.























PROJECT 8 – LAND AT MARSTON ROAD














- Look at connections to south, west and east.
