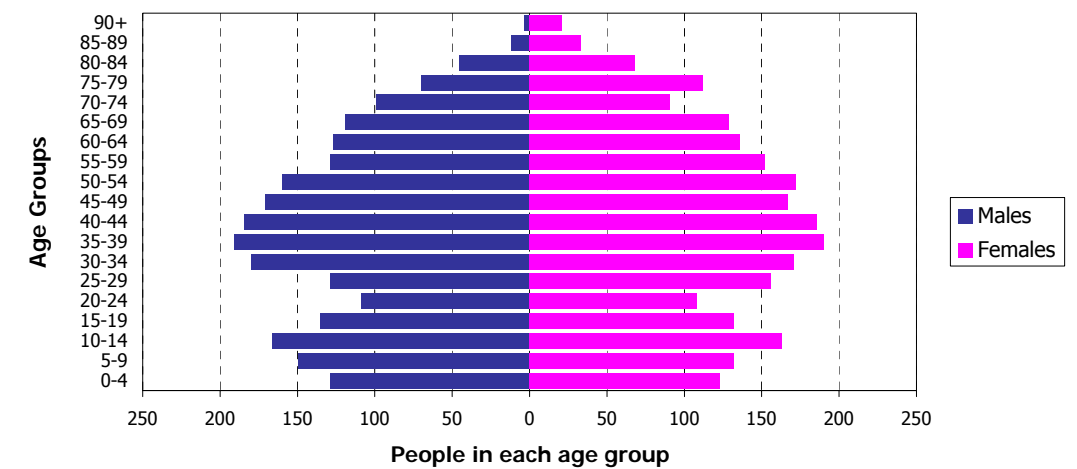

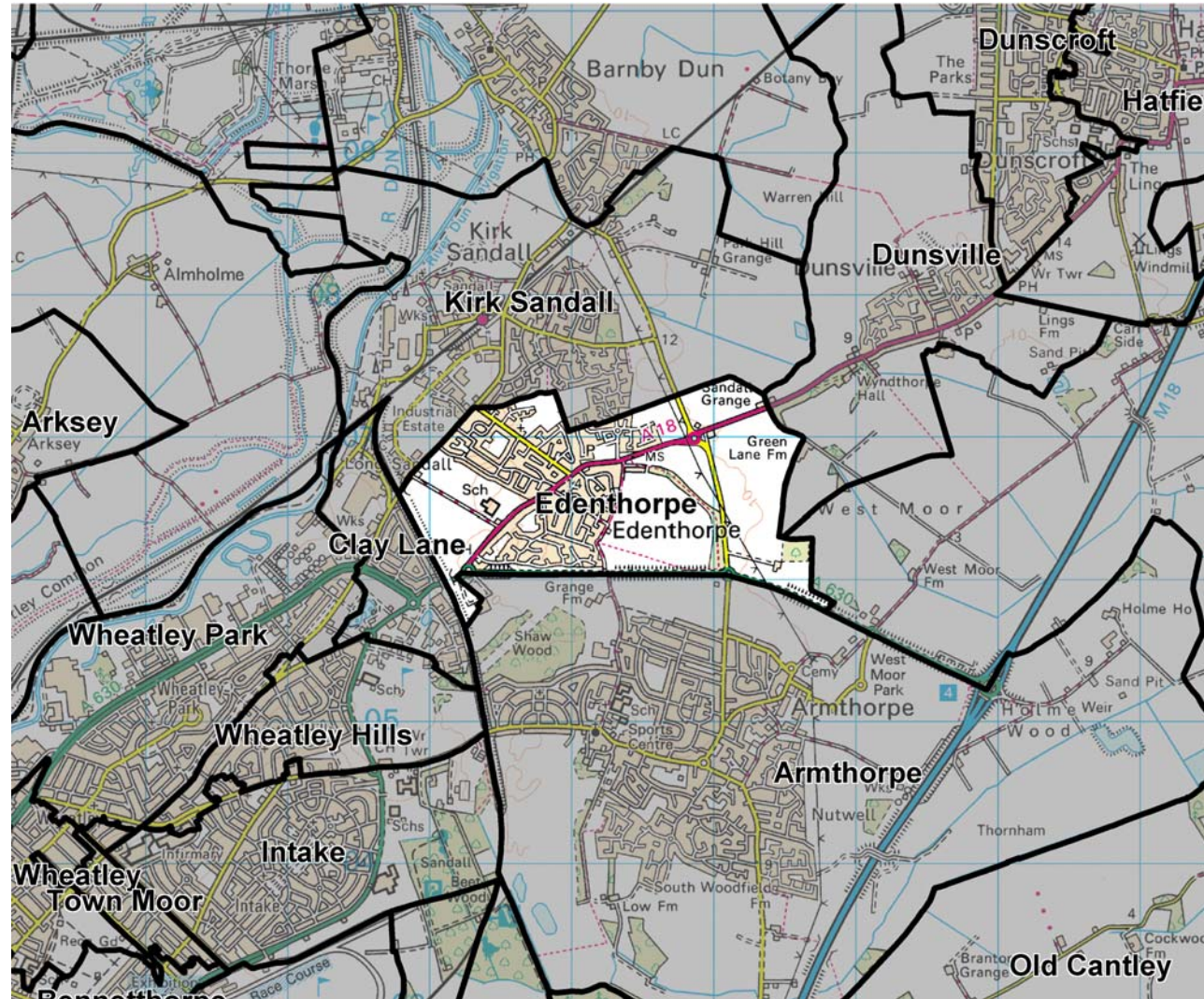

## Births and Child Health

There were 125 births in Edenthorpe between 2001 and 2003.

The general period fertility rate is 43.6 live births per 1,000 women aged 15-44, significantly below the Doncaster average of 56.4 per 1,000.

## Modelled Prevalence Data

Using national survey data, we can predict that, in Edenthorpe:

- 874 adults (22.8% of the 16+ population) and 56 children (6.8%) are obese
- 245 adults (6.4% of the 16+ population) have coronary heart disease
- 83 males (3.6% of the population) and 126 females (5.2%) have diabetes
