Sam overcame a series of injuries to have the best season of his career to date in 2008 – winning a World Cup medal, qualifying for the Beijing 2008 Olympic Games and then finishing 10th on his Olympic debut.

His performance in Beijing was the best by a British pentathlete in an individual competition at an Olympic Games since Graham Brookhouse's eighth at Barcelona in 1992.

Sam took up the pentathlon in 2000 after progressing from doing biathlons and triathlons. The last pentathlon discipline he tackled was the riding, and he admits to finding it the most difficult.

He missed his chance to qualify for the Athens 2004 Olympics when he suffered a stress fracture to a bone in a foot a month before the qualifying competitions. He missed two years of competition because of the injury.

Sam went to Beijing carrying a knee injury, but produced a strong performance to finish 10th. He underwent surgery on the knee two months after the Olympics.

Sam also produced a terrific performance to win bronze at the World Cup in Millfield, Somerset in March 2008 – his first World Cup medal. After 12 hours of intense competition, he was just beaten to silver by Italy's Nicola Benedetti in a sprint finish at the end of the 3k run.



He ended 2008 fifth in the World Cup rankings, but didn't compete in the World Cup Final following his knee operation.

In 2008 Sam also became the first British male pentathlete to reach the finals of each World Cup event of the year for a decade.

He was ranked 22nd in the overall world rankings at the year end, making him the highest ranked British male pentathlete.

Sam made a bright start to 2009, finishing fourth at the International Budapest Cup in Hungary at the end of February – a competition run using the combined run/shoot format.

He followed that up by winning the men's title

at the Bath International in March with a personal best points total of 6044. He went into the run/shoot in second, 13 seconds behind Ondrej Polivka (CZE), but crossed the finish line 20 seconds clear of him.

Then in May he finished agonisingly close to the medals in fourth at the third World Cup of the year, in Budapest - the second best World Cup result of his career.

Produced a solid all-round performance two weeks later at the Rome World Cup, going into the run/shoot in third place before dropping down the field to end the day in 12th. That performance meant he finished the 2009 World Cup season ranked eighth.

Sam has a degree in Sports Technology from the University of Bath and combined studying with training at Pentathlon GB's High Performance Centre at the University. He now trains full-time and is on Pentathlon GB's World Class Podium Programme.

When not competing he enjoys surfing, photography and golf. He also starred alongside actress Rita Tushingham and dancer Lorena Randi in Daria Martin's 2005 film Loneliness and the Modern Pentathlon, which was showcased at the Tate Modern.

Sam has an identical twin, Chris, who is a professional footballer – he is currently on Bristol City's books and has also played for Yeovil Town.
