Herts & Essex Sixth Form – Dress Code

The school is noted for the smart appearance of its students and the Sixth Form play a leading role in this.

Boys

Suit (two or three piece) or blazer/jacket with smart suit type trousers Shirt (with collar) and tie Smart shoes or boots

Girls

Suit Smart tailored dress (at least knee length) Smart tailored/suit-type trousers Smart skirt (at least knee length)

These may be worn with -

A smart shirt or blouse with a smart tailored jacket Shirts/Blouses must have a sleeve and collar Smart closed toe shoes or boots (with a low heel - Health and Safety)

General

Suits, dresses, trousers, skirts and blazers/jackets should be in plain business colours (for example Black, Navy or Grey) In all respects, formal styles and lengths are required. No body studs other than earrings are allowed. Ties may be removed during the summer term, at the discretion of the Director of Sixth Form

The following are not acceptable:

Any denim (or imitation denim) items of any colour.

Casual clothing* including: jogging bottoms, combat, cargo or jeans style trousers, tracksuits, sweatshirts, hooded sweatshirts/jumpers, leggings, footless tights, shorts, trainers of any colour, flip-flops/sandals, Ugg style boots, tee shirts, polo shirts and other items of dress more suited to the gym, beach or a social outing.

Hats/headgear, aside from those worn for religious reasons.

Leather jackets are not permitted in school; they may be worn to and from school only and should be securely stored in lockers during the day.

Hair styles and colour should be appropriate for a working environment.

*students engaged in PE lessons, or helping juniors with PE, may of course wear school PE kit while they are engaged in these activities.

All clothing should be clean and in good repair.

In cases where there is uncertainty, decisions will be at the discretion of the Director of Sixth Form, Director of Student Progress or Learning Manager: Sixth Form.
