I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. CHRONOLOGY OF TROPICAL STORM JUANING

July 25, 2011

- A Low Pressure (LP) located at 350 km east southeast of Virac, Catanduanes developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) named “JUANING”, moved closer towards Virac, Catanduanes and threatened the Isabela-Cagayan area

July 26, 2011

- TD “JUANING” moved towards Daet, Camarines Norte and intensified into a tropical storm and threatened Southern and Central Luzon including Metro Manila

July 27, 2011

- TS “JUANING” intensified further before it made landfall over Dinalungan, Aurora at 10:00 AM, but slightly weakened while it crossed the rugged terrains of Northern Luzon, traversed West Philippine Sea and headed towards Southern China

July 28, 2011

- TS “JUANING” re-intensified while over the West Philippine Sea, maintained its strength as it moved out from the Philippine Area of responsibility (PAR). However, TS JUANING will continue to enhance the Southwest Monsoon and bring rains over the western sections of Luzon and Visayas

STATUS OF LIFELINES

POWER

NGCP (As of 3:00 PM, 28 July 2011)

- The National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) is fast-tracking the restoration of the remaining affected facilities due to Tropical Storm “Juaning”
- Storm-affected facilities in the Bicol Region, Central Luzon and Batangas have been fully energized as of 28 July 2011, 2:00 PM except for the Daraga-Ligao 69 kV Transmission Line which serves the province of Albay
- NGCP linemen have been deployed in the area of this transmission line to ensure fast restoration of service in its remaining unenergized portion
- The following NGCP transmission lines tripped in areas affected by Tropical Storm “Juaning”, to wit:

STATUS OF ROADS AND BRIDGES

- As of 6:00 PM, 28 July 2011, Tanqui Bridge in San Fernando By-pass Road, La Union, Region I remained impassable due to damaged slab and eight (8) road sections in Regions III and V also remained impassable due floodwaters, landslides, washed-out abutment and collapsed pavement

II. EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

NDRRMC

- NDRRMC OPCEN disseminated NDRRMC Advisories on Severe Weather Bulletins; Gale Warnings; and General Flood Bulletins to all regions affected through SMS and facsimile, uploaded the same at the NDRRMC Website, Facebook, and Twitter accounts for further dissemination to their respective local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs) from the provincial down to the municipal levels
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective areas of responsibility (AOR) and subsequently advised local DRRMCs to initiate pre-emptive evacuation of families in low-lying and mountainous areas if situation warrants
- NDRRMC conducted an emergency meeting on 27 July 2011 attended by the member agencies to assess the extent of agencies' preparedness and

responses relative to TS Juaning. DOST-PAGASA presented the situationer on Tropical Storm Juaning (chronology, forecast position and track) while the member agencies presented their preparedness and responses

MEMBER AGENCIES

Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) closely coordinated with DSWD–Field Offices (FOs) concerned for any significant reports
- **The estimated cost of assistance provided by DSWD in Regions II and V is PhP9,319,324.06**
- Pre-positioned PhP59.77 Million in all DSWD-FOs along the typhoon path: PhP2.5M standby funds and PhP57.269M worth of relief supplies to wit:

- DSWD Field Offices (FOs) are continuously coordinating with local DRRMCs from the regional down to the local level for necessary response/intervention
- **DSWD-CO transported one (1) truckload of relief supplies 2,700 family food packages from the DSWD-NROC on July 28, 2011 to Bicol Region as additional standby relief resources of DSWD FO V**
- **DSWD I** alerted their SWAD teams and pre-positioned 1,000 family packs to the provinces of Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur and Pangasinan, activated QUART to monitor adverse effects brought about by TS “Juaning”, and implemented cash-for-work program in flood-prone areas (canal/river de-clogging) as flood mitigation activity
- **DSWD II** Field Office pre-positioned food and non-food items at the 65 evacuation centers in the region readily available for augmentation support.
- **SWAD teams of Nueva Vizcaya and Quirino** started their duty since 26 July to monitor possible effects of TS Juaning. Stockpiled sufficient amount of food packs and used clothings for augmentation to affected LGUs
- **DSWD IV-A** Field Office continuously monitored the five (5) provinces in the region for the number of municipalities/cities affected. Stockpile of their supplies is currently lodged at the SWAD Offices of the 5 provinces for immediate provision of relief assistance to the affected families
- **DSWD V** extended food and non-food items worth PhP9,217,908.00 in the following provinces:

- **DSWD CAR** pre-positioned relief goods (family packs) in the different provinces, pre-positioned 2,000 family packs in the regional office, placed on stand-by Quick Response Funds (QRF) worth PHP300,000.00, and activated their local QUART and SWAD teams
- **Pasay City and Quezon City Social Welfare Offices served hot meals and breakfast to the affected families on July 27, 2011**

Department of Health (DOH)

- **DOH-HEMS** sent alert Memo to all CHDs and activated Code White Alert
- **CHDs in Regions I, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, VIII and CAR** placed on standby alert their medical response and **WASH** teams; activated their respective HEMS Operations Centers; and mobilized teams to be on standby; activated CHDs'OPCENs in the affected provinces; **and conducted rapid health assessment in affected areas**
- **The above CHDs pre-positioned drugs and medicines to their respective areas: PhP30,000 each to the four (4) provinces of CHD I; PhP 50,000 each to the seven (7) provinces under CHD III; PhP 120,744.14 each to the affected provinces in CHD IV-B; PhP 50,000 worth to Albay and Catanduanes under CHD V; PhP 30,000 together with 90 pcs. of first aid and emergency kits to affected provinces in CHD VI; and PhP 100,000 to each of the six (6) affected provinces in CHD CAR**
- **Code White was raised on all CHDs except in Regions IV-A, VI, X and Metro Manila**

Department of Agriculture (DA)

- **DA I** activated its Regional Command Center and continuously monitor any possible effects on agricultural sector

Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH)

- **DPWH Central Office**, thru the Bureau of Maintenance, instructed all Regional Offices in the affected areas to activate their Disaster Response Team to monitor the status of national road network within their jurisdiction
- **DPWH I** activated its District Disaster Action Teams and operations center, monitor status of road conditions, placed its maintenance crew on standby, and pre-positioned heavy equipment in major roads
- **DPWH V** deployed two (2) trucks with personnel; conducted clearing operations on affected roads; provided one (1) state truck to assist in the transportation of relief items to PDRRMC Camarines Sur and monitored the status of roads
- **DPWH CAR** pre-positioned its heavy equipment and manpower in major roads

Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)

- All BFP operating units in all affected provinces are on heightened alert status, and always ready to respond to emergencies and other eventualities

PAGASA

- On 26 July 2011, 11:00 PM: PAGASA issued a weather scenario of Tropical Storm "Juaning" and recommended the suspension of classes at all levels including the Tertiary Level in Metro Manila on 27 July 2011

- Hydrometeorology Division of PAGASA issued Flood Bulletin for MAGAT RIVER on 28 July 2011, 8:00 AM stating that there will be slight increase in the water levels along the Magat River and Cagayan River. Likewise, advised the people living along the Magat Dam and the Local DRRMCs concerned to be alert for possible increase in the water level downstreams
- **Hydrometeorology Division of PAGASA issued Hydrological Dam Situationer on 28 July 2011, 3:00 PM stating that the rains within Ipo Watershed has caused an increase in the water elevation of Ipo Dam to 100.48 m as of 2:00 PM and was observed to be rising. Should there be a further/continuous rise in the water elevation, the Ipo Dam management will initiate spilling operation whenever necessary. The water releases from Ipo Dam is expected to affect the low-lying areas along the Angat River from the municipalities of Norzagaray to Hagonoy. Likewise, all the residents living in the aforementioned areas are advised to be alert for possible increase in the water level downstream. PAGASA, in coordination with Ipo Dam Management is continuously monitoring the hydrological condition within Ipo Dam and will provide update to the concerned agencies and LGUs**

Department of Education (DepEd)

- Suspended classes in various levels on 26 July 2011 in view of Public Storm Warning Signals hoisted in NCR, Region I, II, III, IV-A, V, and CAR
- Suspended classes in various levels on 27 July 2011 in NCR, Region I, II, III, IV-A, IV-B, V, and CAR (automatic suspension/PAGASA Bulletin issued/declaration of local authorities/as per respective DepEd Regional Directors/)
- Issued suspension of classes on 28 July 2011 in the following areas:
 - NCR:
 - All classes in Pre-School, Elementary, and High School (public and private) will resume today except for the Pre-School to Grade 2 in Tonsuya Elementary School in Malabon since school ground is still underwater (per DepEd OIC-ARD Jose Rizalino Rosales)
 - Region I:
 - Due to Public Storm Warning Signal No. 1 in Pre-School are automatically suspended in Ilocos Sur, Ilocos Norte, Pangasinan, and La Union (per PAGASA 5:00 AM, 28 July 2011 Weather Bulletin)
 - Region II:
 - All classes in Pre-School (public and private) have been declared suspended by DepEd Regional Director Benito Tumamao. Suspension was based on the PAGASA 11:00 PM, 27 July 2011 Weather Bulletin
 - Region III:
 - All classes in Pre-School (public and private) have been declared suspended by DepEd Regional Director Teofila Villanueva. Suspension was based on the PAGASA 11:00 PM, 27 July 2011 Weather Bulletin
 - Region IV-A:
 - Only Rosario, Cavite Mayor has declared suspension of classes in Pre-School, Elementary, and High School due to flooding

- Region V:
 - Classes in Pre-School, Elementary and High School are still suspended in the Albay Division, and the City Divisions of Tabaco, Ligao, and Legazpi
- CAR:
 - Due to Public Storm Warning Signal No. 1, all classes in Pre-School (public and private) are automatically suspended in Abra, (per PAGASA 5:00 AM, 28 July 2011 Weather Bulletin)
- Automatic suspension of classes based on storm warning signals raised or declarations made by LGU, Local DepEd Officials or School Heads will be applied in other areas not mentioned

Philippine Coast Guard (PCG)

- **PCG Unit Commanders** in various ports closely monitored and rendered assistance in coordination with local port authorities and shipping companies and ensured the security and safety of stranded passengers and vessels. Likewise, implemented Memorandum Circular No 01-09 re Guidelines on the Movements of Vessels during Inclement Weather are as follows:
 - PSWS No.1: Vessels of 1,000 gross tons or below shall not sail, except to take shelter, when the PSWS No.1 is hoisted within its point of origin or route or point of destination.
 - PSWS No. 2: Vessels of any tonnage shall not sail except to take shelter when PSWS No. 2 or higher is hoisted within its point of origin, route or point of destination
 - On the other hand, movement of vessels above 1,000 gross tons is left to the discretion and responsibility of the ship owner and master when PSWS No 1 is hoisted within its point of origin or route or point of destination
- **PCG I** alerted its WASAR teams in all CG Stations and equipped them with rubber boats with OBM for possible resource mobilization; mobilized the following assets to wit:
 - Ilocos Norte & Ilocos Sur- three (3) rubber boats with WASAR teams
 - La Union - one (1) M35 truck and one (1) rubber boat
 - Pangasinan - three (3) WASAR teams, three (3) rubber boats, one (1) medical team, and one (1) M35 truck; and
- Deployed two (2) WASAR teams with rubber boats, one (1) medical team, and one (1) M35 truck to Sual Coast Guard Detachment
- **CG IV–A** directed TB Habagat to depart from her present station in Santa Clara Pier, Batangas City en route to the vicinity waters between Masbate and Sibuyan Island to conduct SAR operations. AE-891 will immediately depart to join TB Habagat as soon as it is refuelled
- **PCG V** monitored status of stranded passengers; conducted SAR operations for the missing fishermen in Catanduanes; placed its assets on standby ready for deployment; maintains coordination with PDRRMCs/ MDRRMCs; directed the CG Detachments of Calumpang and Mandaon to conduct SAR operations for the remaining 19 crew if weather and sea conditions permit; conducted SAR operations on the reported missing fishermen in Baras, Catanduanes
- PCG conducted SAR operations for FB HOPE CRISTIE utilizing three (3) Coast guard vessels, one (1) fixed wing aircraft and one (1) PCG helicopter. As of 9:00 AM, 28 July 2011, thirteen (13) survivors were rescued and were

safely brought to the Municipal Hospital of Balud, Masbate for medical treatment

- **CGD Western Visayas** conducted investigation and disclosed that FB HOPE CRISTIE was denied clearance by CGD Libas in Roxas City due to expired safety documents. However, said FB secretly departed from Libas fishport without the knowledge of Detachment Commander

Philippine National Police (PNP)

- Activated its PNP Sub-Committee on Disaster Management (PNP SCDM) and National Disaster Operation Center (NDOC) to monitor and coordinate with affected Regional Offices; directed its ground units to take precautionary measures to address the possible landslides and flashfloods; alerted its search and rescue (SAR) personnel for possible deployment;
- **PNP I** placed all its police stations on alert status and emergency rescue equipment on standby and deployed police manpower teams to Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, and La Union. Likewise, 12 rubber boats with police SAR teams and two (2) motor boats were deployed to Pangasinan
- Provincial Police Offices of Pangasinan, La Union, Ilocos Sur, and Ilocos Norte activated their emergency response teams with rubber boats
