Yeovil into Last 16 of English Schools

Yeovil College have progressed into the last 16 of the English Schools FA Under 18 Colleges Trophy, with a 3-2 win over South Devon College.

The opening exchanges gifted each team a goal; with Joe Hastie miss hitting a cross into the back of the net to score for Yeovil. However once both teams had settled the game saw some excellent passages of play from both teams.

Yeovil lost Sam Haines in defence half way through the first half due to injury with Stuart Witt coming on to take his place in the back line.

A free kick taken half way in the South Devon half saw Tom Law beat the defender to edge the ball passed the South Devon goal keeper and into the back of the net for a 2 - 1 lead to Yeovil.

The 2^{nd} half resumed with Yeovil in a positive mood. Yeovil were straight on the attack from the whistle, putting the South Devon goal keeper under pressure. This was shortly rewarded when Tom Law placed a beautiful retaken free kick into the top corner from 20 yards to give Yeovil a 3-1 lead.

South Devon came back into the game with 10 minutes to go with a nicely worked goal to put the score at 3-2, and set up a tense final 10 minutes. Yeovil did not sit back and still attacked South Devon with one effort rebounding off the bar. The minute's edged away but Yeovil managed to stay firm to record a confidence boosting win over a well organised South Devon side, and ultimately set themselves up with an away game in the last sixteen.

Peter Conning the Yeovil Colleges Football Academy Manager said "This was a great achievement for such an inexperienced set of players. Their work rate and commitment has been outstanding throughout the competition and they have deserved this success."

Ladies Hockey Retain Title

Yeovil College Ladies Hockey team has just retained the Somerset Colleges indoor title. The tournament held at SCAT in Taunton saw four local colleges compete.

The first game for Yeovil was a tough encounter against a well drilled Bridgwater side. Yeovil immediately saw their ability pay off with the Bridgwater keeper forced to make a good save from Claire Pearce. However, it took driving play from Luci Hooper to open the scoring picking up the ball in her own D she drove the length of the hall before planting an unstoppable cross shot into the bottom corner. Unfortunately the lead did not last long and Bridgwater hit back to level the scores. With five minutes to go once again Yeovil found themselves on top and working the keeper hard, it took pace to break the deadlock with Claire Pearce working a bit of space to slot the second goal. Late on Yeovil conceded a debatable penalty flick which despite getting close to Keeper Sam Read could not be prevented and the score finished at 2-2.

This meant the Yeovil girls would have to be extremely ruthless in their remaining two games and playing back to back would test fitness levels to the maximum.

The first of these games was played against hosts SCAT. The intensity levels from the start were outstanding and this immediately paid dividends with Kath Holmes and Stacey Howe converting well taken goals, a further goal from Holmes saw the score at 3 – 0 after just 4 minutes. The score line allowed some of the squad players to make their debuts indoors, with Rose Boyce and Vicky Sharpe contributing well. At this point striker Claire Pearce burst into action scoring 6 goals in quick succession with her pace and positioning skills demolishing the opposition and allowed for a straight swap with normal strike partner Kate Hawkins whom promptly added a tenth goal after good work from Vicky Sharpe, the 10-0 victory being by no means flattering.

The final game was played immediately against Richard Huish College. Traditionally games between the local rivals being extremely close, the team knew that they would have to be strong from the start. The same intensity of play was seen immediately with the Yeovil attacks making the Richard Huish keeper make several saves. After 2 minutes the deadlock was broken; a superb through ball from Hooper saw Pearce in the open and she beat the keeper through her legs. This time the team did not sit back, they continued to push and were rewarded through 2 quick goals from the powerful Holmes closing in from the right hand side. With the backs being marshalled by the confident keeper Sam Read and outstanding Luci Hooper the attacking flare of the Yeovil girls was unleashed to devastating effect. The goal of the tournament saw Pearce fed by an outstanding cross hall pass from Howe to score, which was followed moments later with Pearce once again converting a deft reverse stick flick to the top corner. The team were not finished there, with a further goal from Claire Pearce giving Yeovil a 6-0 victory and the title for the 3rd year in a row.

Coaching team Stuart Richards and Harry Brooks were ecstatic with the result, Harry stating "the team demonstrated their experience and ability in the indoor game, the result is a credit to the players".
