### HISTORY

The IMG Pendleton School was founded in 1999 as a co-educational, college preparatory school with the unique distinction of providing an exceptional academic environment for students who are engaged in elite athletic training and competition. Located on the central west coast of Florida and on the grounds of IMG Academies, IMG Pendleton School attracts students locally and abroad. More than half of the school's population is international, with over 50 countries represented. Approximately 40% of the students live with their parents on the IMG campus or in the immediate Bradenton area, while the remaining population board in the dormitories and other facilities. IMG Academies is an internationally recognized athletic training facility and is home to the Bollettieri Tennis Academy, Leadbetter Golf Academy, Basketball Academy, Soccer Academy, Baseball Academy, Madden Football Academy, Lacrosse Academy, Softball Academy and IMG Performance Institute. Both IMG Pendleton and IMG Academies provide an unparalleled education and top-notch training in a dynamic and diverse environment that develops talent while helping students realize their full potential.

## GPA, CLASS RANK & ACADEMIC HONORS

As a small school, IMG Pendleton does not calculate class rank. IMG Pendleton School reports cumulative grade point averages to colleges. This GPA is calculated by multiplying the semester grades by the weight of the course. Courses designated as Standard, Honors or Advanced Placement are weighted at the end of the each semester as follows: **Standard 1.00, Honors 1.50, Advanced Placement 2.00**

Effective in the 2010-2011 academic year, students receive numeric grades on a 100 point scale in all credit courses. The grading scale is as follows: **A+ (98-100); A (93-97); A- (90-92); B+ (87-89); B (86-83); B- (80-82); C+ (77-79); C (73-76); C- (70-72); D+ (67-69); D (63-67e); D- (60-62); F (0)**. In cooperation with The State College of Florida, the IMG Pendleton School offers dual-enrollment courses. When completed, students receive both high school and college credit. Online courses are available to students with scheduling conflicts or tournament travel issues which cannot be accommodated by the traditional IMG Pendleton School program. In addition, IMG Pendleton offers all courses at the Honors level for those students who have demonstrated above average motivation, determination and academic success. Students receiving the Honors designation must complete additional assignments outside of the classroom and must commit to a full year of the honors experience.
