We work with public transport operators and the Victorian Government to improve the network.

Planning your journey

Metlink's journey planner helps you find out what train, tram or bus to catch for your journey.

You can use the journey planner at metlinkmelbourne.com.au to plan your trip from A to B using public transport. All the attractions listed in this guide are available in the journey planner – simply enter your origin and the name of the attraction in the destination box. Visit the MetShop at the Melbourne Town Hall or the Melbourne Visitor Centre at Federation Square to use the journey planner.

Your ticket to public transport

Melbourne is currently moving from Metcards to a new smartcard ticketing system called myki so you may see two types of ticketing equipment on the network. During this time, you will be able to use a Metcard or myki to travel.

myki is already operating on regional buses in Geelong, Ballarat, Bendigo, Seymour, Warragul and the Latrobe Valley.

A myki can store either a myki pass (travel days) or myki money (dollar value) and these are used to pay for your journey. When the balance on your myki gets low or when your pass runs out, you just top up your card to keep travelling.

myki money is perfect for someone who travels infrequently or who varies their travel patterns from day to day or week to week. With myki money it doesn't matter how often you travel because as long as you touch on and touch off, myki will always calculate the best fare for you.

myki money fares are based on Value Metcard fares (5 x Weekend Daily Metcard for example) meaning you can travel anywhere around Melbourne and you'll know you're always paying the best fare.

You can buy public transport tickets from:

- the MetShop at the Melbourne Town Hall, on the corner of Swanston and Little Collins streets
- the Melbourne Visitor Centre at Federation Square, on the corner of Swanston and Flinders streets
- customer service centres at Premium Stations
- retail outlets
- ticket machines at train stations, on trams and on most buses.

Always remember to validate your Metcard or touch on and touch off your myki. Travelling without a valid ticket could lead to a fine.


