



We run a full appointment system. The medical centre is open from 0830-1230 hrs and 1400-1600 hrs for routine clinics. Routine enquiries or requests for appointments will not be actioned outside the normal medical centre hours.

### **Appointments**

The practice offers 10 minute appointments. Please indicate when booking an appointment if you believe that a longer appointment may be necessary. Appointments may be made by telephoning 01985 222648 (civil) or 2648 (military) or in person at reception during normal medical centre hours. Please remember that each appointment is for one person. Ask for an additional appointment(s) if you require other members of your family to be seen.

Booking an appointment well in advance will allow the receptionist the greatest flexibility in offering an appointment with the doctor of your choice and at a time that is convenient.

It you cannot keep and appointment please let us know as we can offer this to another person. If you require to be seen urgently please state this to our receptionist and she will assist you appropriately.

Help us to help you by arriving in good time for your appointment. We do our best to keep clinic timings but sometimes the unavoidable does occur. If a clinic is running late we will let you know and offer an alternative if you cannot wait to be seen.

### **Telephone Consultation**

The doctors are usually available between 1000-1030 hrs and 1600-1630 hrs should you wish to contact them by telephone. At other times they are likely to be busy and the receptionist will be pleased to take a message.

Please remember that several patients can be seen at the medical centre in the time that it takes to do a home visit.

### **Repeat Prescriptions**

Repeat prescriptions will he issued at the doctor's discretion and are normally for patients on long-term treatment. Requests for prescriptions can be made in writing or by calling at the medical centre from 0830-1230 hrs and 1400-1600 hrs Monday to Thursday. We are unable to take orders or issue repeat prescriptions at weekends, public holidays or out of normal medical centre hours. Please allow two complete working days before collection and make allowances for weekends and public holidays. Where possible give exact drug names when ordering.

### Dispensary

Monday-Friday 0830-1230 hrs Monday, Tuesday and Thursday 1400-1600 hrs Friday 1400-1500 hrs

Medicines are only issued on production of a valid prescription. It takes time to make up each prescription; we are happy for you to leave the prescription and call back later for your medication. Repeat prescriptions are available for a maximum of six months before re-validation by a medical officer is required. Repeat prescriptions may be requested in person or by telephone. Please remember that we may require two working days notice to obtain certain drugs.

### **Health Visitor**

The Health Visitor works from the Garrison Medical Centre. Tel: 220459. There is an answering machine to take messages when the office is empty.

**Child Health Clinics** (0-5 years) are held twice a week. Contact the Health Visitor for details.

### **Family Planning Clinics**

In addition to the services provided by the military and civilian general practitioners, there is a Family Planning Clinic held at Warminster Hospital, The Avenue, Warminster on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month between 1800-2000 hrs. Anyone wishing to make an appointment should ring Warminster 212949 during clinic hours.





# Compassionate Leave

### COMPASSIONATE LEAVE TRAVEL FROM OVERSEAS

(For Service Personnel, their Dependants based abroad, Territorial Army and Mobilised Reservists)

If circumstances should arise whilst your relative is overseas (including N Ireland) either on a posting, at sea, or on deployment, that make it necessary for you to apply for his/her return on compassionate grounds (such as a death in the family, serious illness or serious family crisis) you should telephone:

The Joint Casualty and Compassionate Centre (JCCC), Innsworth, Gloucester GL3 1HW Tel: +44 (0) 1452 519951

This number is continually manned 24 hours a day including weekends and Bank Holidays.

When you call you will be asked for the following information: Service Number, Rank, Name, Parent Unit and current location of the Service person, together with full details of the relative concerned, their location and name of Doctor, Hospital and/or any other organisation involved in the case. Please be aware that any information will be verified with the appropriate organisations before Compassionate Leave Travel may be recommended and authorised.

Although you may wish to contact your relative or his/her parent unit for advice or support, contact the JCCC directly, so that your case can be dealt without delay. Your relative's unit cannot authorise Compassionate Travel, and therefore any information you pass to them will have to be forwarded to the JCCC which will waste valuable time in dealing with your request.

### **Land Warfare Centre Welfare Flats**

The welfare flats in Warminster are at: 567 and 571 Pepper Place, Warminster

They are two bedroom flats one situated on the ground floor and the other on the first floor. They sleep four adults and one child (in a cot). They are fully equipped with a TV, Microwave, Washing Machine, Bedding etc. The cost is £15 per night with a minimum charge for two nights.

The flats provides safe and comfortable short-term affordable accommodation for use by serving soldiers.

Priority is given to: Estranged personnel with visiting rights for their children. Close relatives visiting VSI or SI soldiers. Other welfare reasons at the discretion of the Welfare Officer.

The flat may also be used for rest and recuperation when not being occupied for the above reasons. Bookings for rest and recuperation will only be taken outside school holidays and will not take priority. Close relatives are defined as parents, grandparents, brothers and sisters of the soldier and his/her spouse.


## The Imber Club

The Army HIVE Information Service aims to respond swiftly and efficiently to enquiries from anyone within the Service community. Enquiries are welcomed from serving personnel, their dependants, partners, extended families, veterans, war widows (ers) and MOD civilians.

The HIVE information Support Officers (HISOs) who manage the HIVE information centres have a wide supporting the service community range of information available, focusing on local area

education, housing and accommodation, employment and training opportunities, childcare, travel, leisure and health facilities. They hold comprehensive new arrival location overviews for serving accompanied and single serving personnel which aim to assist anyone settling into their new location. When it is time to move on HISOs are ready to provide the answers to questions on the next posting location.

The Army HIVE information service has excellent links with Service and civilian agencies which ensures that up to date, useful and important information is passed on quickly. Close contacts with local civilian authorities and unit staff further ensure that local information is kept current. HISOs work closely with the Unit welfare staff at times of operational deployment and provide a deployment communication pack designed to keep families in touch during these times.

In addition to the information provision role HISOs are able to confidentially refer you to the right person should you have a need for personal help or support and will feedback to the chain of command concerns on issues affecting the Service community.

### TALK TO US FOR A CHANGE

The Army Families Federation (AFF) is an independent organisation that provides a unique two-way communications link between the British Army and its families.

AFF works hard to improve the quality of life for all Army families, and ensure that they are in no way disadvantaged because they 'follow the flag'. AFF represents all members of a soldier's family (including partners and wider family) and is recognised as their representative voice. AFF is consulted by the military, politicians, the media and national organisations on issues concerning Army families.

#### Where to find AFF

AFF can be found wherever there are Army families in the world. The hub of the network is AFF Central Office at Upavon (Wiltshire), and there are AFF Branches in Great Britain, Northern Ireland, Germany and Cyprus, with volunteers in overseas locations.

AFF operates through a network of Co-ordinators who listen to and represent the views and concerns of Army families to the policy makers.

AFF Co-ordinators can also help families with their individual issues. They can provide advocacy for families and signpost to the best professional organisation to provide assistance.

### **Specialists**

AFF employs five Specialists who each concentrate on a particular area of concern for Army families, and deal with all aspects of that subject for AFF. The areas covered by the AFF Specialists are

Mission Statement

#### Who are we?

The Army Families Federation Training Centre is the training arm of the Army Families Federation (AFF). AFF's role is to act as the independent voice of Army families, raising their concerns and highlighting issues with the Army, the MOD and government. We promote communication, information and liaison between the Army, its families and the policy makers, representing the views of soldiers' families and lobbying for change where necessary.

### **Background**

The Army Families Federation Training Centre (formerly known as FOCUS), was established in 1986 to provide Army dependents with both the skills and self-confidence to enable them to find a job, work in the voluntary sector or contribute more fully to their local community.

#### Where are we?

Our original Training Centre is in Bulford. We are now expanding, so that more Army families are able to access our service. In 2003, we opened new sites in Warminster and Blandford in February and June, with Bovington and Shrivenham following in November 2003 and January 2004.

### **Our aims**

The Army Families Federation Training Centre aims to:

- teach or improve office skills through tutor-led training
- · equip students with job-seeking skills
- enhance confidence levels
- help/improve the employment prospects and aspirations of Army families.

#### **Our students**

Our students generally fall into the following categories:

- those who have chosen to take a career break to raise a family or to follow their soldier in his/her career
- those who wish to update existing skills
- those who wish to change career
- those who wish to learn new skills

#### Staff

One of the strengths of the Army Families Federation Training Centre is our staff, who are all Army dependants themselves and are able to empathise with and relate to our students. It also helps that many of our tutors are 'home-grown', having attended our courses as students themselves!

#### Small classes

Class sizes are a maximum of 6 students. The resulting high level of individual tuition is a great help to students who may have been without paid employment for many years and so tend to lack confidence.

#### Courses

The fully tutored courses are structured to give every student enough time to thoroughly understand the subject. We discuss with every student their requirements to ensure that they get the right course for them, rather than just filling seats.

### **Qualifications**

All core courses have national accreditation, such as Pitman, OCR(RSA) and the British Computer Society. This gives recognisable and transportable qualifications to enhance employment prospects. Our pass rate for these examinations is extremely high, comparing very favourably with other

learning providers. The Army Families Federation Training Centre courses have a 98.5% pass rate compared to the national average of 69.4%.

### Which courses are available?

We constantly review courses so that we continue to offer relevant training for the demands of the local job market. Courses offered include Basic Skills, IT courses for the very beginner up to advanced level, financial courses, both traditional Bookkeeping and Sage (Computerised Accounts). We also offer courses to help with CV writing, Interview Skills and Job Applications as well as Confidence Boosting Seminars. Sessions are offered during term-time within school hours.



### Housing

### Introduction

All general housing matters should be raised with your unit welfare officer (UWO). Specific matters relating to housing provided by Defence



Estates Operations Housing (DE Ops Housing) can be brought directly to their attention. Information about DE Ops Housing is detailed below.

### **Defence Estates Operations Housing (DE Ops Housing)**

DE Ops Housing is a tri-Service organisation responsible for providing Service Family Accommodation (SFA) throughout England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland for all entitled and eligible personnel. DE Ops Housing is part of the Ministry of Defence. An important change took place on 01 April 2007 to help DE Ops Housing improve the service provided. On that date a network of seven Housing Information Centres (HICs) were launched across Britain, in (from North to South) Rosyth, York, Telford, Thetford, High Wycombe, Aldershot and Warminster. With effect from 01 April 2008 the service provided by the Rosyth HIC has been extended to encompass Northern Ireland.

HICs replaced the soft housing service previously provided through a network of estate offices, with all issues of repairs and maintenance being managed through separate arrangements. Staff in the HICs allocate houses, arrange pre move outs, moves in and out of accommodation. In addition they manage any general enquiry about Service housing in England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland. Please remember however that to discuss repairs and maintenance issues you need to contact your Help Desk: (Modern Housing Solutions (MHS) for England and Wales, Turner Estate Solutions (TES) for Scotland and the DE Ops Housing Repair Help Desk for Northern Ireland or repairs service provider if you live in PFI accommodation).

The biggest difference is that instead of having to visit a local housing office, you now simply call the HIC network though a single national freephone number:

You can also contact the HIC network on 94510 8000 if you are in the military network, or 01904 418000 (normal charges apply). The last number must be used if you are based overseas and have no access to the military network.

HICs are open from 0800 to 1630 hrs, Monday to Friday, and are manned by experienced DE Housing staff. If your enquiry is of a general nature it will be routed to the first available person at any of the seven HICs. This is because general enquiries – such as the implications of leaving your Service or learning about your entitlement to housing – can be answered by any of our staff wherever they are. But if your call is specific to a particular location – you will need to select the relevant HIC from those shown in the previous table. When calling please listen carefully to the instructions you will hear.

To ensure that the HICs are fully effective, direct dialling numbers for our allocating staff are not issued, and the route for enquiries to HIC staff, whether from occupants, from the chain of command or from welfare and families organisations will always be the central number. If there is a real business need to speak to specific individuals for case continuity reasons, the HIC can arrange for them to return your call, but this will be the exception rather than the rule – it is our intention that all HIC staff are able to answer the vast majority of enquiries. This provides an effective service, providing you ring between 0800 and 1630 hrs.

Housing Officers are now able to spend more time out on the estate and attend surgeries and Occupant Consultative Group meetings (OCMs).

### **Entitlement and Applications**

If you have completed your initial training, are married and have at least six months to serve at your current unit, you are entitled to SFA. Full details of your entitlement and eligibility can be found in JSP 464 – Tri-Service Accommodation Regulations (TSARs). Your UWO and HIC should be able to clarify specific points, should you need assistance.

Applications for SFA must be made using the MOD Form 1132, which is available from your Unit or HIC. A copy can also be downloaded from the SFA pages on the DE website (www.defence-estates.mod.uk/sfa/intro.php). Your Unit Administration Office must certify the completed form.

If you have any special needs it is important that you make the HIC aware of them when you make your application.

### **Posting**

You should make your application to the HIC as soon as your receive your posting, as this will assist the HIC in providing you with an offer well in advance of your move. If you are already in SFA, you must also notify the HIC within 14 days that you intend to vacate your present SFA.

An optional Pre-Payment Cleaning Scheme is available to assist you with any cleaning required before you move out of SFA. You will be advised of this when you receive your Pre-Move Out Advisory Visit.

### Living in SFA

You should read your Licence to Occupy and The Occupant's Handbook to familiarise yourself with the terms and conditions that apply to your stay in SFA. If you have any concerns you should seek advice from the HIC.

#### Maintenance of SFA

The maintenance of SFA, including repairs, in England and Wales is the responsibility of the Housing Prime Contractor, MODern Housing Solutions, Tel: 0800 707 6000.

The maintenance of SFA, including repairs in Scotland is the responsibility of the Regional Prime Contractor, TES Turner Estate Solutions, Tel: 0800 328 6337.

Both contractors are responsible for the annual gas test.

The maintenance of SFA, including repairs in Northern Ireland is the responsibility of Defence Estates Operations. SFA repairs are managed through the Repairs Helpdesk, Tel: 0800 030 4651.

Under the terms of your Licence to Occupy you should make provision for access for tests and works to be carried out.

### **Living In Your Community**

Disputes among neighbours can sometimes happen and what may seem quite trivial to one party can be extremely annoying to another. In the first instance you should try to resolve matters yourself – most neighbours will be responsive to your concerns if presented in a reasonable manner. If this approach fails, then seek advice from your UWO, DO or HIC. Anti social behaviour should be reported to the local police.

He is also responsible for dealing with complaints of domestic violence, which are dealt with very seriously by the police. Colin can be found in the Community Police house at 425 Pepper Place.

IF IN DOUBT – KEEP THEM OUT

Most house callers are quite genuine, however in FQ areas, everyone must be extra vigilant. Some petty criminals use these door-to-door sales opportunities to take a good look in your FQ for a future visit, when you might be out of the house. You should obviously not let your children answer the door, particularly at night and remember to use the door viewer and chain before you open the door.

The Defence Estates Housing Directorate (DEHD) is responsible for repairs to your FQ, but make sure that anyone who comes to your home to carry out repairs is working for the DEHD. Any genuine person will be happy to co-operate with your request to check passes or work orders. If you are in doubt contact the MDP. If you see anything suspicious do not hesitate in calling the MDP. Remember that officers will respond quickly to your request for help, no matter how trivial it may seem.

# The Joint Service Housing Advice Office (JSHAO) – Helping you to civilian housing solutions.

### What is the JSHAO?

The JSHAO provides Service persons and their dependants with housing information and advice. We also, where possible, help you to obtain placement in social housing on leaving the Service. We can also help army welfare/compassionate cases and separated families from overseas to find appropriate housing on return to the UK.

### Helping you to civilian accommodation

The JSHAO runs 'Housing Solutions' and "Housing Options" briefings for Service Personnel. The Solutions briefings are designed as mid career presentations to highlight the need to make early provision for your civilian housing. The 'Housing Options' courses are run in Resettlement Centres in the UK and Education Centres in Germany, Cyprus and Gibraltar. These one day courses are designed to give you the information to help you make informed choices on your civilian housing. While Housing Options are normally attended in the last 2 years of Service, any Service person and/or their partner is welcome at any stage of their Service.

### What information do we hold?

We have information and contacts for most of the UK's social housing sector which includes council housing and housing association homes. We can provide you with pamphlets and information sheets on the multitude of different subjects regarding housing provision. Very often these days we will direct you to the appropriate web site. All this information is available to you, just call or e-mail our office.

#### The MOD Referral Scheme

The JSHAO runs the Ministry of Defence Referral scheme. This scheme may be able to help you if you are looking for housing association housing on leaving the Service. Information and an application form can be found on our website or call the office and talk to the MOD Referral Scheme Co-ordinator.

### **Low Cost Home Ownership**

With house prices as high as they have been recently, lots of Service personnel express interest in schemes which share the cost of housing with some form of government backed part ownership plan. HomeBuy helps successful applicants to buy their home using a government interest free loan to fund part of the property. These schemes are generically known as HomeBuy schemes. Service personnel are recognised as Key Workers and as such have priority access to some schemes. For details of the schemes and options go to the JSHAO website. If you have any queries then come back to the JSHAO staff with them. If you are occupying council housing the Right to Buy scheme may apply to your property. We can advise you on all these options.

### Buying your own house

Buying a house is one of the most exciting things you ever do. However, it is also one of the most daunting. The JSHAO has factsheets that explain the process. We can advise on websites you will find useful to get details of properties, solicitors and surveyors. We can even point you in the right direction to help you find the right mortgage.

For those of you thinking of building your own home we have some very practical advice and information.

### **Help from the Services**

In 1996 the MOD introduced the Long Service Advance of Pay Scheme for Army and RAF personnel (the scheme has been available to Naval personnel for many years). The JSHAO holds details of the scheme. Never commit yourself to purchase until you receive confirmation from the Tri-service LSAP centre of your eligibility for the loan.

### JSHAO monthly magazine 'Housing Matters'

Ten months a year the JSHAO produces a magazine. It contains lots of information designed to help you when you are considering your civilian housing. Copies should be easily available within your unit but if you have difficulty in obtaining a copy please ring the JSHAO.



All faults should be reported to the Help Desk. To report a new fault, you will need to call the Help Desk, selecting Option 1, and provide the Help Desk Agent with the following information:

- Name
- Address
- Telephone number
- Details of defect or problem reported. The Agent is likely to ask you a series of questions to help us identify the problem in more detail

We will tell you whether we need to inspect the problem before arranging work and whether there is any immediate action you should take.

The Help Desk Agent will then give you an appointment, which is based on the response times below:

- Emergency attend within 3 hours and make safe within 24 Hours, with subsequent permanent rectification in line with Urgent and Routine categories
- Urgent rectification within working 5 days
- Routine rectification within 20 working days

You will be provided with an AM or PM appointment on an agreed date for all your Response maintenance requests reported to the Help Desk. You will then receive an appointment letter confirming the details for Urgent and Routine jobs.



## Leisure Time

## Round and About

The ancient military history of Warminster is almost entirely centred on Battlesbury Hill, a great Iron Age fortress which overlooks the present barracks. The Romans used it as a garrison and as a staging camp for legions marching from Salisbury to Bath, and later it was held by the Roman-British people against the Saxons, and then by the Saxons against the Danes. It is perhaps appropriate that the Garrison should still live in the shadow of such a venerable military monument.

In more modern times, the area now occupied by the families quarters at Elm Hill was used regularly as a summer training camp, but no permanent military buildings existed until 1938 when the first barracks were built to accommodate two tank regiments.

These were occupied during the Second World War by a variety of units both British and American. They were taken over in 1945 by the School of Infantry, a new unit which had its origins in a GHQ Battle School at Barnard Castle in County Durham set up in 1941 although some of its assigned components had long histories. At that stage the only elements at Warminster were the Headquarters and the Tactical Wing but it also incorporated various other infantry training establishments which became wings of the main School which remained in their existing locations.

A demonstration battalion was appointed and for many years resided in the hutted Knook Camp, some four miles east of Warminster. It moved to the new Battlesbury Barracks in 1964, with the 1st Battalion The Welch Regiment being the first occupants. A resident tank demonstration squadron, detached from its parent regiment, had also been appointed but had to wait until 1975 to be housed in the custom built Harman Lines on Sack Hill.

The period 1965-9 saw major rebuilding within the School of Infantry in order to accommodate the Small Arms and Signal Wings from Hythe and the Infantry Trials and Development Unit from Netheravon. This left the School centred on Warminster except for the Support Weapons Wing, which remained in Netheravon, and the junior NCOs Division at Brecon. The Junior Division of the Staff College was also accommodated within the School around this time.

The Army Base Repair Organisation (ABRO) Warminster, is the present day successor of what was originally known as a Royal Army Ordnance Corps Depot that was established on its present site off the Imber Road in 1939 to provide support to the two resident tank regiments. In 1945, it was transferred to the newly formed Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers and renamed 27 Command Workshop and later 27 District Workshop REME. Its present title dates from the formation of defence Agencies in April 1993 and it is presently being market tested with a view to its operation being privatised.

In 1991, arising out of the "Options for Change" Defence reorganisation, it was decided to establish the Combined Arms Training Centre (CATC) at Warminster as a centre of excellence for combined arms training and doctrine. It took over the School of Infantry's All Arms Tactics Wing and in the following years, expanded further with the arrival of the Brigade and Battle Group Trainer (South) and the formation of the Armoured Tactics and Reconnaissance Division out of the Royal Armoured Corps' Tactics School at Bovington and the Infantry Reconnaissance Division at Netheravon. It also took over the Fighting in Built Up Areas Training Team and complex at Copehill Down and formed part of the Battle Group Training Unit at Westdown Camp, Tilshead. To facilitate this expansion a new complex was built on Gale's Field, and the Junior Division of the Staff College was moved to Camberley.

CATC also took over the Demonstration Battalion and Armoured Squadron to form the basis of a permanent CATC Battle Group to which has been added an armoured reconnaissance troop, an engineer close support troop and a REME light aid detachment as part of it. The Battle Group Trainer at Catterick has also become part of CATC.

At about this time, the whole Infantry Training Base was re-organised including the re-titled Headquarters Infantry and Infantry Training Centre (ITC) Warminster became the residual parts of the old School of Infantry.

In recognition of the change of responsibilities, on 1 April 1993 Headquarters CATC assumed the command of Warminster Garrison from the now defunct Headquarters School of Infantry and the Barracks Warminster became known as the Warminster Training Centre (WTC).

On 4 May 1995, as one of the last ripples of the Options for Change reorganisation, the Infantry Support Weapons Wing at Netheravon closed and its components moved to WTC as part of the ITC.

The next development was the building of the large Combined Arms Tactical Trainer on a green field site between WTC and Battlesbury Barracks. The state-of-the-art interactive virtual reality system is one of the most advanced simulation trainers of its kind in the world.

On 1 April 2000, the newly appointed Director General Training Support set up his headquarters within WTC so bringing back to Warminster a major general, a rank previously held by Directors of Infantry. Subsequently, its subordinate, HQ Army Training Estate, has also moved in adjacent to it.

To bring its title more in line with its evolving role, CATC changed its title to Land Warfare Training Centre in June 2000 which was further refined in 2002 to the Land Warfare Centre (LWC) with HQ Training Support Command (Land) becoming HQ LWC. This resulted in similar changes to the titles of some of its subordinates also but most relevantly, WTC became known as the Land Warfare Centre.

Despite all the changes in name and composition, now very much an All Arms in nature Warminster remains the main and spiritual home of the Infantry, an association which all infantrymen are proud to carry on.

## The Army and Salisbury Plain

The very mention of Salisbury Plain conjures up memories for serving and ex-Servicemen alike, of days and nights spent on exercise on the Plain. It would be hard to find a soldier who, at some time during his service, had not taken part in some activity on this famous training area. It was at the turn of the century that the War Office began to acquire land on the Plain for training. Over the years more and more land has been purchased so that now nearly the whole of the Plain is owned by the Ministry of Defence. The training area stretches from Ludgershall and Tidworth in the east to Warminster and Westbury in the west. It is an area approximately 25 miles long and from 6 to 8 miles deep containing some 93,000 acres.

The Salisbury Plain Training Area is the largest in the United Kingdom. Facilities exist for all arms training and include live firing ranges for Armoured, Artillery and Infantry units. The area east of the River Avon is restricted to dry training only.

Although units come from far and wide to exercise on the Plain, the major users are those stationed near by at Tidworth and Bulford, the School of Artillery at Larkhill, and the LWC at Warminster on the western tip.

The withdrawal of the Army from overseas bases and the resultant concentration of units in the United Kingdom has greatly increased the use of all training areas in the British Isles, and the Plain is no exception. It is an area of great interest to historians, archaeologists and naturalists, and every care is taken to preserve its unique natural and man-made features as far as possible. It is, for example, essential to avoid over use of particular areas so as to allow the land to recover. It is the duty of all users to ensure that as little damage as possible is done to this unique stretch of country.

## The Weapons Collection

When the School of Musketry was established at Hythe in Kent in 1853 one of its tasks was to carry out trials on weapon and their ancillaries. When those early trials were concluded a number of the weapons and ancillaries were retained which led to the foundation of the Weapons Collection. This retention policy from trials has continued to the present and when combined with weapons acquired from the 'enemy' during the turbulent periods in history in which the British Army has been involved, plus the many purchases made by respective 'Curators' over the years, then it was inevitable that a very special collection would materialise.

To date the Collection has acquired approximately 2,500 exhibits which are displayed in 8 large rooms. The location is clearly signposted whenever one enters the LWC.

Although the majority of weapons date from 1853 there are a considerable number dating back to the 16th Century which will wet the appetite of the enthusiast. The Collection covers small arms, mortars and anti-tank weapons from all over the world and includes a comprehensive collection of contemporary weapons which are taught to students attending the courses in the LWC.

The Weapons Collection is unique as not only is it a working collection it is also held in trust to the Small Arms School Corps (SASC) and is a registered charity (No 277168). It is open to the public as well as to members of the Armed Forces. There is no entrance fee, however, donations are encouraged. Visits are by appointment only.

### The Library

There is a Library and Information Centre in Building 103, which is open Monday to Friday for use by permanent staff and their spouses as well as students. There is a stock of over 6500 titles, journals and magazines which are mainly military in content although an increasing number of computer, travel and fiction titles are being added to the collection.

The Library is equipped with Internet terminals allowing access to the World Wide Web. The Library acts as an Access point for the Army Learning Centre offering a full range of Learndirect Courses. Microsoft Office applications; Word, Excel, Access and PowerPoint are also available. JPA terminals are due to be installed during Autumn 2007. For further information please contact the Librarian on extension 2249 or the Library Assistant on extension 2628.

## Imber Conservation Group - How about joining?

The Imber Conservation Group, one of three conservation groups across Salisbury Plain Training Area (SPTA), forms a key part of the overall management of the Plain

by the MOD and Defence Estates in particular. The Imber Conservation Group is involved in conservation and archaeology across the whole of SPTA (West) between Warminster and Westbury in the West and the A360 Devizes to Salisbury road in the East where it cuts through the training area near Tilshead.

New members are always welcome, particularly serving military and their dependants. We are looking for people with energy and interest in the countryside, and great knowledge of ornithology, mammals and raptors, or the Bronze Age and Romen Britain is not necessary. We have sub-groups covering many different areas of conservation and archaeology where you learn more about the wonderful area on our doorstep and assist with projects as they occur.


## Safety of Salisbury Plain

## **Access to Salisbury Plain Training Area (West)**

- Are you aware that you and your family may not enter the Range Danger Area of Salisbury Plain Training Area (West) and the bound ary of which is clearly signposted?
- Is your husband aware that he may only do so when he is on organised training and is entered on the Range Calendar?
- Are you aware that on a number of occasions the roads only are opened to the public, generally on Bank Holiday weekends and during the Easter and Christmas breaks? These dates are advertised in Unit Orders or in the local press.
- If you enter Salisbury Plain Training Area (West) illegally, you are likely to endanger your life and the lives of your family.

### Warminster - Range Safety

- All should be aware of the danger to their lives and to those of their families should they contravene SPTA Standing Orders, in particular by entering the Range Danger Areas.
- Only authorised Pass Holders and those engaged on official training may enter the shaded area.
- 3. Permanent Staff at Warminster Garrison taking part in casual (unofficial) training, jogging, dog walking, horse riding, mountain biking etc are NOT permitted to enter the shaded area.



## **Areas in Bounds**

- 1. Areas X and Y may be used at any time provided that soldiers are not exercising therein
- 2. Roads and footpaths in X and Y may be used at any time.
- 3. Approved routes for running and CFTs with distances are shown on a map held in the LWC gymnasium.
- 4. On Public Holidays the principal roads in SPTA, but not verges and training areas, are open to the public. Dates for access are advertised in the local press and on Unit Orders.

## The Warminster Area

Warminster is situated at the west end of Salisbury Plain, and is in West Wiltshire close to the Somerset border. It was an important market town on a main crossroads. The A36 is the trunk road from Bath to Salisbury running southeast and the A350 runs north to south from Chippenham and Trowbridge (the county capital) to Shaftesbury and the south coast 40 miles away. Weymouth, Poole and Bournemouth are the nearest coastal resorts.

The road to Salisbury follows the picturesque Wylye Valley and thence on to the New Forest and Southampton. Lord Bath's Longleat Estate occupies a large area southwest of the town, and much of it is open to the public, but there is a road toll for cars to enter the area around Longleat House. The long leat or stream, which has been widened to form a series of ornamental lakes, gives the name to the house. On the site of the house was a small Augustinian priory founded by Sir John Vernon in the late 13th century When the monasteries were dissolved it was sold to Sir John Thynne who spent much of his time improving his property, and added to the estate after his marriage to a Miss Gresham who was the daughter of a rich London merchant. In 1670 the estate was reputed to cover 10,000 acres.

Salisbury with its famous cathedral and old market is 20 miles southeast. On the way is the village of **Wilton** with Wilton House open to the public. There are glorious gardens and the house is one of the 'stately homes'. There is also the Wilton carpet factory open for visits or purchase of carpets and souvenirs.

**Bath** is 20 miles north-west and has many attractions including the **Roman Baths**, the river gardens, the **Abbey**, and the **Assembly Rooms**. There is a small theatre and a variety of shops which vary from multiple stores to branches of London establishments, and there are plenty of good places for a meal out. Parking of cars in both these towns is severely restricted, and traffic wardens are in attendance; however, there are several car parks of large capacity and also an excellent park and ride scheme.

**Bristol** is only 30 miles north-west and is a city of some 450,000 people. All forms of entertainment are available including the Zoo, Hippodrome, Theatres, and the Colston Hall where shows range from wrestling to orchestral concerts. The best route to Bristol runs south of Bath starting in the village of Wolverton along the B3110 road. A drive along the Avon Gorge via the Avonmouth road unrolls some unusual and beautiful scenery, and a visit to the **Leigh Woods** on the other side of the river is a treat for children of all ages (the property is owned by the National Trust). There is also extensive **Durdham Downs** near the Clifton Zoo, with a magnificent view from the Sea Walls above the **Avon Gorge**. If you visit the Zoo you must leave time for a look round the Downs.

The ruins of Tintern Abbey make an interesting excursion and will be found 10 miles north of **Chepstow** on the way to **Monmouth** along a pretty road through the hills.

The Cheddar Caves, near the west end of **Cheddar Gorge**, are owned by the Longleat Estate, and are open to the public on payment of a charge. There are two, large caves. A smaller one, known as Wookey Hole, is situated 4 miles north-west of Wells where there is a famous cathedral. The 3 caves are in the Mendip Hills which have the dubious honour of carrying the BBC 1,000 ft mast for TV transmissions.

For people interested in motor racing there is a choice of **Thruxton** near Andover, where some excellent BARC meetings are held, and the track at **Castle Combe** some 18 miles north of Warminster. Stock car racing at **Matchams Park** near Ringwood and at **Shipham** in the Mendips, which is about an hour's drive, is held about once a month. Programmes may be obtained from the track offices. A private flying club operates on the Thruxton aerodrome.

Sailing on **Shearwater Lake**, 3 miles south of Warminster, is available, and there are several clubs around Poole harbour giving tidal water sailing. The coast between Christchurch and Weymouth has extensive sandy beaches, but the traffic and parking space is often a problem during the season. A rock climbing club organises climbs in the Avon Gorge. During the summer many villages put on shows, fairs, traction engine rallies etc, whilst the **Frome Show**, usually in September, is a well-known event in agricultural circles. Advertisements generally appear in the Wiltshire Times and the Warminster Journal, all published weekly.

County class tennis may be seen at Bristol and Bournemouth.

The countryside abounds with **public footpaths** and details can be obtained from the appropriate council, footpath preservation society, or ramblers association. Stonehenge is 17 miles along the Amesbury road, and there are several fortified hills in this district which date back to the pre-historic era. One is **Battlesbury Hill** near the Land Warfare Centre, another is **Cley Hill** on the Frome road, and the third is **White Horse Hill** near Westbury, which has one of several horses cut into the chalk in Wiltshire and is reputed to commemorate King Alfred's victory over the Danish invaders.

## **Devizes**

Devizes assumed importance immediately after the Norman Conquest when the invaders built defensive 'mottes' and 'baileys' throughout the country. One of these was built in Devizes in 1080 by Bishop Osmond, a nephew of William the Conqueror, who was made Bishop of Salisbury.

The origin of the name of Devizes is obscure and an early chronicler referred in a Latin text to the castle Ad Divisas (at the boundaries). It is thought the name is a corruption of this. The castle was sited at a point where boundaries of the manors of Rowde, Cannings and Potterne converged. Known later as the Devize.

A Royal Borough Charter was first granted to Devizes in 1141, by the Empress Matilda, as a gesture of thanks to the burgesses for their help during her civil war with King Stephen. The Borough ceased in 1974, when Devizes became a town, still retaining a Mayor and Town Crier in historic tradition.

It is worth noting the two major features which make Devizes of national, historic and architectural interest. The first of these is the retention, over 800 years, of the original medieval street pattern which was laid down when the first castle was built, and which survives virtually intact. There are few good examples of such street patterns remaining unspoilt by more recent roadworks and buildings, but Devizes is one of them. It would be fair to claim that within the town centre not one new street line has been devised over 8 centuries. The second feature is the large concentration of historic buildings, all of individual character, within a very small area. Within a quarter of a square mile there are nearly 500 structures considered by the Department of the Environment as worthy of listing for some protection. There are few other towns or cities in this country with such a dense, but varied, architectural and historic assemblage.





### Saddle Club

The Warminster Saddle Club is a Service based Riding School approved by the British Horse Society. In fact, the non-runners often see the most.


